## HELP YOUR CHILD GET OFF TO A GOOD START

Our school views the link between parent/caregiver, student, and teacher as vital. Children who have a sense of security at home, who are given an opportunity to develop independence and who are encouraged to solve their own problems, have a head start in life. Working together, home and school contribute significantly to a child's readiness for reading. As children grow, readiness for reading comes from all they do, both in school and out. Books you read to your children help them to foster a growing readiness for the printed word. Through books, your child learns that words are really thoughts written down in a logical sequence. Home and school, together, promote a readiness by helping the child develop a positive self-image. We look for your help in supporting and encouraging your children and believe that praise is crucial to the growth of their confidence and self-esteem. We hope that you will therefore:

- Spend time to find out what your children are studying, when deadlines occur, or demanding times approach.
- Help them to have opportunities for reflecting on their work and developing enthusiasm for knowledge.
- Be present, whenever possible, at the school events involving your child.
- Help your children to become organized and make sure they have the right equipment for school.
- Ensure that they have the right balance between school work and home based activities and interests.
- Help your child to make healthy lifestyle choices.

## SCHOOL DISCIPLINE AND THE PARENT

There is not a more important aspect of school discipline than the role that the parent plays in the process. Without discipline, there can be no instruction. Without the support of the parents, there can be no effective discipline applied in the schools. Discipline involves not only the relationship with oneself, but one's attitude toward other people and their property. Discipline underlies the entire framework of education. Those who are well disciplined have developed self-control, orderliness, good character, and a degree of efficiency in their lives. Those with the responsibility of discipline at the school fully understand that there must exist a cooperative atmosphere between the home and the school for our discipline policies to be effective. Home and school working together ensures that our main task of education can be accomplished.

## **SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL SERVICES**

The East Helena School District proudly offers a Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) to all students who reside in the district. The District complies with all Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and Section 504 regulations which require school districts to provide FAPE to each qualified person with a disability who is in the school district's jurisdiction, regardless of the nature or severity of the person's disability. It is the policy of the East Helena School District not to discriminate. The District has adopted an internal grievance procedure that complies with the laws and regulations set forth both at the State and Federal level. These policies and an appeals process may be examined in any of the district or school building offices. The East Helena School District provides procedural safeguards to parents/guardians with children that have been identified as eligible under IDEA as well.

Any person who believes she or he has been subjected to discrimination on the basis of disability may file a grievance under this procedure. The availability and use of this grievance procedure does not prevent a person from filing a complaint of discrimination on the basis of disability with the U. S. # **NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENT**

## The requirements for identification of all new students are mandated by state law.

Upon enrollment of a student for the first time in an elementary or secondary school, the school shall notify, in writing, the person enrolling the student, must provide either a certified copy of the student's birth certificate or other reliable proof of the student's identity and birth date, which proof shall be accompanied by an affidavit explaining the inability to produce a copy of the birth certificate. (See Montana Code 44-2511)

A child must be five years of age on or before September 10th of the year the child is to enroll in the district's kindergarten, and six years of age on or before September 10th of the year the child is to enroll in the district's first grade program (MCA 20-5-101).

Students enrolling may be asked to provide entrance information and proof of residency and then return the following school day so that the school has the opportunity to prepare for the placement. Military families should consult with the building principal for additional support.

## **IMMUNIZATION RECORDS**

Students entering School District No. 9 must present evidence of immunization against diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, poliomyelitis, rubella, mumps, and measles (rubeola) prior to being enrolled in school or the first day of attendance. Students entering seventh grade are required to have been administered two doses of the measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine and a booster dose of the tetanus vaccine (Td or Tdap). Students cannot be enrolled or attend the seventh grade unless documentation of the above vaccinations is provided to East Valley Middle School. A pupil who transfers from one school to another may photocopy immunization records in the possession of the school of origin. The school district to which a pupil transfers shall accept the photocopy as evidence of immunization.

## **PROOF OF BIRTH RECORDS**

When a child enrolls in the East Helena Schools for the first time, the following steps will be taken:

- 1. The district official shall require the child's parent, guardian, or legal custodian to present to the school proof of identity of the child; *and*
- 2. Request the appropriate school records of the child from the school the child previously attended. The request must be made within 40 days of the child's proof of enrollment.

If a child's parent, guardian, or legal custodian does not present proof of identity within 40 days of enrollment or the school district does not receive the school records of the child within 60 days of enrollment, the school shall notify the missing children information program and an enforcement official of the fact that no proof of identity has been presented for the child.

## **HEALTH SERVICES**

The district employs a full time nurse. It is the job of the nurse to maintain up-todate records on all students, conduct health screenings and maintain adequate health services. The School District has adopted a Medication Policy which is available upon request. In essence, we ask that medications be administered at home. If a student is unable to complete the school day without a medication (prescription or non-prescription), parents should contact the school nurse. <u>No medication will</u> <u>be administered in school without written authorization from the parent and</u> <u>physician</u>. Parents should inform the school nurse if their child has allergies, chronic illnesses, and/or serious physical problems. Health screenings provided by the school include: a) vision; b) dental; c) scoliosis; d) hearing

The district encourages, but does not require a physical examination for students entering school but does require a physical exam for admittance to an athletic program. The district **DOES NOT** provide insurance coverage for injuries due to the prohibitive cost of such coverage

### **SCHOOL FIRST AID**

There are facilities in each school for a student to lie down if not feeling well. If the child has a fever or does not feel well enough to return to class in a short time, a parent will be contacted to have the child picked up at school. The school MUST HAVE a current phone number where you can be contacted. Policies for administering first aid within the school system have been formulated by a medical advisory board. Very minor injuries will be taken care of by school personnel or by the school nurse. Parents will be contacted and requested to take over the responsibility for any care that goes beyond "first aid." **IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT SCHOOLS HAVE EMERGENCY PHONE NUMBERS IN CASE THE PARENT CANNOT BE REACHED. Students that do not feel well or are running a fever should stay home as advised under the COVID-19 recommendations from the CDC.** 

## **PLACEMENT OF STUDENTS**

Every teacher and student has unique talents and needs. We will do our best to place your child in the class that will provide the best opportunity to succeed and at the same time maintain balance between classes of the same grade level. Many factors are considered in making this decision. Academic, emotional, social, and personal needs of each student are some of the significant factors taken into consideration by the teachers and principal. Parents wishing to have their child receive remote learning alternatives should contact the school immediately and complete the necessary application process.

## **PUBLIC CONCERNS AND DUE PROCESS**

The Board recognizes that situations may arise in the operation of the district, which are of concern to parents or other community members. Such concerns are best dealt with through communications with appropriate staff members and administrators of the district.

The following due process procedure should be followed as the proper procedure to resolve concerns or answer questions:

Step 1. Unsettled matters involving students and their teachers should be directed to the teacher involved.

Step 2. If the unsettled matter described in step 1 cannot be resolved satisfactorily, the matter should be directed to the building principal. Questions or concerns related to individual schools should also be directed to the building principal.

Step 3. If the unsettled matter described in step 2 cannot be resolved satisfactorily, the concern should be directed to the Superintendent.

Step 4. If the unsettled matter described in Step 3 cannot be resolved satisfactorily, the concern should be brought to the attention of the Board. Questions or concerns submitted to the individual Board members after steps one through three should be brought to the attention of the entire Board during a regular or special Board meeting by placement on the Board agenda according to established procedures.

The Board of Trustees considers it the obligation of district employees to respond to questions or concerns of parents or community members at a mutually convenient time for both parties.

# SCHOOL WELLNESS

The East Helena School District is committed to providing school environments that promote and protect children's health, well-being, and ability to learn by supporting healthy eating and physical activity. Therefore, it is the policy of the East Helena School District that:

• Qualified child nutrition professionals will provide students with access to a variety of affordable, nutritious, and appealing foods which meet the health and nutrition needs of students; will accommodate the religious, ethnic, and cultural diversity of the student body in meal planning; and will provide clean, safe, and pleasant settings and adequate time for students to eat.

• To the maximum extent practicable, all schools in the District will participate in available federal school meal programs, including the School Breakfast Program and the National School Lunch Program (including after-school snacks).

• Schools will provide nutrition education and physical education to foster lifelong habits of healthy eating and physical activity and will establish linkages between health education and school meal programs and with related community services.

All K-12 students of the District shall have the opportunity to participate regularly in supervised, organized or unstructured, physical activities, to maintain physical fitness, and to understand the short-and long-term benefits of a physically active and healthy lifestyle.

Nutrition Standards The District shall ensure that reimbursable school meals meet the program requirements and nutrition standards found in federal regulations. The District shall encourage students to make nutritious food choices through accessibility and marketing efforts of healthful foods. The District shall monitor all food and beverages sold or served to students.



#### **Other School-Based Activities Designed to Promote Student**

Wellness The District may implement other appropriate programs that help create a school environment that conveys consistent wellness messages and is conducive to healthy eating and physical activity, such as staff wellness programs, non-food reward system and fundraising efforts.

Maintaining Student Wellness The Superintendent shall develop and implement administrative rules consistent with this policy. Input from teachers, parents/guardians, students, school food service program, the school board, school administrators, and the public shall be considered before implementing such rules. A sustained effort is necessary to implement and enforce this policy. The Wellness committee as described in the Wellness Handbook shall measure how well this policy is being implemented, managed, and enforced. The Superintendent shall report to the Board, as requested, on the District's programs and efforts to meet the purpose and intent of this policy.

# **SCHOOL BREAKFAST / LUNCH**

All students will have the opportunity to eat breakfast and/or lunch at our schools. Any student who has an approved application on file for free or reduced-price lunch is automatically eligible for free or reduced-price breakfast. If you were receiving free or reduced meals on the last day of school in our district you will continue to receive free or reduced meals for (3) weeks into the school year. By 9/27/2021 you are required to have a new Free & Reduced Application on file for the 2021/2022 school year.

School breakfasts provide a good start toward meeting the daily nutritional needs of food energy, protein, vitamins, and minerals of students. Minimum requirements for a reimbursable breakfast are:

1. One-half pint milk

- 2. Four ounces (4 oz.) full-strength juice or four ounces (4 oz.) fruit or vegetable
- 3. Two one-ounce (1 oz.) servings of bread or a cereal grain product, or
- 4. Two one-ounce (1 oz.) servings of a meat/approved meat alternate, or
- 5. One ounce (1 oz.) serving of bread or cereal grain product and one ounce (1 oz.) of meat/approved meat alternate

Students in grades K-12 have the opportunity to eat either a hot or cold lunch at school. Lunch may be purchased on a daily, weekly, or monthly basis. Menus are prepared and sent home monthly so you can plan ahead for the days your child will eat hot lunch at school. Students eating a cold lunch may purchase a carton of milk. If your family income qualifies you for free or reduced-priced lunches, an application can be obtained at the school office or cafeteria. Salad Bar is offered at all schools.

Multiple lunch credits may be purchased in the school cafeteria from 8:00-8:20 each morning. Please purchase credits in advance. Lunches: Reduced-price meals \$ .40 Breakfast: Reduced-price meals \$

Two formal parent/teacher conferences are scheduled for every student. Additional conferences are welcomed and can be scheduled by the parent, or teacher, as the need arises. Effective communication will enhance our ability to provide a quality education. Quarterly/Trimester progress reports will be provided during the school year for grades K-5. Additionally, midterm reports for grades 6-12 will be provided. In grades K-5, teachers will send progress reports as needed throughout the quarter to indicate improvements and/or deficiencies. Conferences with Title I staff and Special Education teachers are available at the same time by appointment or drop in.

Cumulative records containing each child's grades, attendance, immunizations, assessments, etc. are kept in the school office. These records are available to parents for review. Simply call for an appointment with your child's principal.



Students enrolled in grades six, seven, and eight are required to earn credits based on an annual total of one (1) credit per year- long class and portions thereof appropriate to the percentage of a year-long class attended (see below). Any student who receives six (6) or more term F's may not be promoted or graduated.

Year-long classes = one credit cumulative per year Six-week classes = one-sixth (1/6) credit Semester Classes = one-half (1/2) credit per semester

Those sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students not earning sufficient credits during the year will be considered for retention. They will be afforded the opportunity, at their own expense, to make up those credits by taking extension and summer school courses. Eighth grade students not earning sufficient credits or making those credits up prior to graduation, will not be allowed to participate in the graduation ceremonies and will not receive a diploma. Administrative rules will be developed for transfer students not eligible for promotion/graduation based on this policy.

# **EMERGENCIES**

In the event that weather conditions or other emergencies require the closing of school, emails, school website updates, Facebook, Remind and the local radio stations will notify parents. Kids will be transported to other district facilities in case of a catastrophic building failure. STAY TUNED TO LOCAL RADIO STATIONS AND OUR WEBSITE FOR INFORMATION. If both parents work, arrangements should be made for a neighbor or friend to account for your children should emergency conditions warrant an early dismissal. To instill safe procedures in emergency situations, students are taught and practice appropriate steps to follow for fire, earthquakes, and any other life-threatening situation. Practices are conducted on a regular basis to keep awareness levels high. Occasionally, the Air Quality Bureau advises the schools of "poor" air quality. When this occurs in East Helena, the principal will decide whether the students are kept in during the noon hour and recesses. Special consideration will be given to students with chronic medical conditions. When the weather becomes extremely cold, we allow students to stay indoors. Physicians have advised us to use zero degree wind chill as the rule in determining when children stay indoors. We must recognize the difference between "uncomfortable" temperatures and those that present a health hazard. Please prepare your child for temperatures of a Montana winter by dressing them properly with a heavy coat, hat, boots, and gloves or mittens.



## STUDENT DRUG AND ALCOHOL ABUSE POLICY

-20-

In compliance with the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988, Drug Free Schools and Communities Act Amendments of 1989, and all other pertinent federal, state, and local regulations regarding drug and alcohol abuse in the schools, the East Helena Schools is committed to providing an alcohol/drug-free environment. East Helena Schools have adopted policies that clearly prohibit the possession, distribution, sale, or use of drugs and alcohol on district properties or during

- school activities. Following due process and/or any appeal options, sanctions may be imposed as follows:
- Individuals who violate this policy are subject to disciplinary action and/or criminal prosecution
- Student sanctions may include counseling, reprimand, suspension, or expulsion.

## HARASSMENT, INTIMIDATION, HAZING & BULLYING

It is the policy of East Helena Schools (EHPS Policy 3225 & 3226) that bullying, harassment, intimidation, or hazing, by students, staff, or third parties is strictly prohibited and shall not be tolerated. Harassment, intimidation, or bullying means any act that substantially interferes with a student's educational benefits, opportunities, or performance, that takes place on or immediately adjacent to school grounds, at any school-sponsored activity, on school-provided transportation, or at any official school bus stop, and that has the effect of:

- Physically harming a student or damaging a student's property;
- Knowingly placing a student in reasonable fear of physical harm to the student or damage to the student's property; or
- Creating a hostile educational environment.

**Sexual Harassment** of students is prohibited (EHPS Policy 3225). Any person, including a district employee or agent, or student, engages in sexual harassment whenever he or she makes sexual advances, requests sexual favors, and engages in other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual or sex-based nature, imposed on the basis of sex, that denies or limits the provision of educational aid, benefits, services, or treatment; or that makes such conduct a condition of a student's academic status; or has the purpose or effect of:

- Substantially interfering with a student's educational environment;
- Creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive educational environment;
- Depriving a student of educational aid, benefits, services, or treatment; or
- Making submission to or rejection of such conduct the basis for academic decisions affecting a student.

**Child Abuse Report -** When school employees know or have reasonable cause to suspect, as a result of information they receive in their personal or professional capacity, that a child is abused or neglected, they shall report the matter promptly to the Department of Family Services (41-3-201, MCA)

## **PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES**

It is the policy of the Board of Trustees for School District No. 9 that no otherwise qualified person shall, solely by reason of his/her disabling condition, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity sponsored by this Board. As used in this policy and any implementing regulations, "disabled person" means a person who has, or had, or is regarded or was regarded as having, a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more of a person's major life activities and includes specific learning disabilities. The East Helena Public School District seeks out and assists students in accessing a Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) for all students living within the school district as outlined in School Board Policy 2040 and 2045.

## **ATTENDANCE POLICY**

-22-

**District Philosophy** - The EH School District encourages All Day Every Day attendance. Statistics definitively show that there is a direct relationship between good attendance and academic success. Students with good attendance generally achieve higher grades, enjoy school more, and are more employable after leaving high school. Students are expected to attend school regularly and be on time in order to receive maximum benefit from the district's instructional program and to develop habits of punctuality, self-discipline, and responsibility. The district also recognizes the need for parental support for good attendance and will seek assistance with letters and personal contacts.

It is important that students be in attendance at school and be punctual. **If a student needs to be absent from school, the parent is requested to call the office before 9:30 am to report the absence for that day.** If parents find it necessary to take students out of school for any reason other than illness, **a written request for the absence should be submitted to the office in advance**. State law aimed at curbing the rising tide of missing children nationwide requires the school to check on any student absence within two to three hours after the absence is noticed. To help implement this law, all five schools attempt to contact the home of an absent student during the day of the absence. The call is an attempt to determine if the student is sick, at the doctor's office, or absent for some other reason. To alleviate the fear of a missing child case, it would greatly assist the schools if you would call the school on the day of your child's absence, and report the reason for the absence. Your assistance in helping the school comply with this law is appreciated. Attendance letters are sent after the 8th, 12th, & 15th day. The County truancy prevention officer and the County Attorney may be contacted to report truancy after the 20th day.

#### **TYPES OF ABSENCES**

**Excused Absences** - Absence caused by illness, an emergency at home, extreme weather conditions, medical (including dental and optometric) treatment, bereavement or any special circumstances approved in advance by the building principal is an excused absence. Students will be given the opportunity to make-up missed work. Students will have two days to make-up missed homework for every day they are absent. Twelve or more excused absences during a school year due to illness may require a doctor's written verification. If proof of illness cannot be verified by a doctor, the absences will be considered unexcused.

Unexcused Absence - There are three types of unexcused absences:

1. Absence from school without the knowledge or permission of the parent (i.e., truancy).

2. Absence caused by reasons other than those listed under the excused absence section of this policy. Parents will be notified that it is unlawful to allow their children to miss school without being excused by the school officials, and such actions by the parents may be reported to family services and the county attorney.

3. Absences for any reason beyond the 20th day of absence during a year will be considered unexcused unless medically necessary as determined by the principal in consultation with the parent and corroborating written documentation from a physician.

A suspension (in-school, out-of-school, or Saturday school) not to exceed five consecutive days may be imposed by the building principal or district superintendent for any unexcused absence after a due process hearing. Students may be required to appear before the Board of Trustees if truant. **Make-up work may not be accepted or graded if a student misses school due to an unexcused absence**.

## **TARDINESS**

Tardiness is defined as the failure to be at a specified place at a specified time. Eight tardies will require the student, accompanied by his/her parent/guardian to appear at a hearing with the building principal. After the hearing, the principal may suspend the student or assign other punishment as is determined appropriate. Make-up work will not be accepted for any suspension day due to tardiness.

## \*ABSENCES RELATING TO PROMOTION/GRADUATION

Any student absent twenty or more times from any class or grade level during a school year may be deemed to have not satisfactorily completed the work in that class and may not be given credit for any work beyond the twentieth absence. Absences beyond the 20th day will be unexcused.

## SCHOOL AND HOME CORRESPONDENCE

A building representative will telephone the student's parents when a student has been absent for 15 days. A letter from the district superintendent will be sent home when requested by the building principal.

## **BOARD HEARING**

Students who are in repeated violation of school district attendance policies shall be given at least three days written notice to accompany their parents/guardians to a hearing before the Board of Trustees. The parents will be notified by certified mail. The Board of Trustees may suspend, expel or assign other appropriate punishment as they determine based on the hearing. If the student and his/her parents/guardians fail to appear at the hearing, the Board may take action in the student's absence. Unless specifically authorized by the Board, no make-up work will be allowed if the student is suspended as a result of the hearing.

## **TRANSPORTATION SERVICES**

#### For BUS SCHEDULES and BUS DISCIPLINE matters contact: Nick Turner Transportation Supervisors – 227-7702

An eligible bus student is a public school pupil who resides at least 3 miles, over the shortest practical route, from the nearest operating public elementary school or public high school, whichever the case may be. (School Laws of Montana; 20-10-101) Students will not be allowed to board or depart from any bus other than at their assigned time and stop unless pre-approved by the Transportation Supervisor. Student visitors may ride the bus provided there is enough space for regular riders. Written permission from the visitor's parent/guardian shall be provided to both the driver and the transportation supervisor.

A parent of a student(s), who resides 3 miles or more (over the shortest practical route) from the nearest school, is eligible for transportation reimbursement if that student(s) must be individually transported to or from school or the nearest bus stop. The student must meet the definition of an "eligible transportee" as in School Laws of Montana 20-10-101(2) Transportation reimbursement will be computed according to state statute 20-10-142, MCA. Parents of students who are eligible for individual transportation reimbursement must complete an individual transportation contract. Contracts for the ensuing school year shall be completed by the fourth Monday in June. (20-10-124(2), MCA) Contract forms can be obtained at Kindergarten screening in June, at the Central Office or by calling 227-7700.

# SCHOOL BUS CODE OF CONDUCT

-26-

The driver has total responsibility of the children on his/her bus. Students will comply promptly and respectfully with the driver's direction. The safe and orderly operation of the district's school buses depends to a large degree on the behavior and attitudes of the students riding the buses. Since the driver must concentrate his/her efforts on maintaining control of the bus in varying weather conditions, the district has adopted the following rules to help ensure safe driving and riding conditions. Riding a school bus is a privilege, not a right. State law does not require school districts to provide student transportation to-and-from school. Once a student boards the bus, and only at that time, does he/she become the responsibility of the school district. Such responsibility shall end when the student is delivered to the regular bus stop at the close of the school day.

In view of the fact that the Board of Trustees and administration consider a school bus to be an extension of the classroom, students shall conduct themselves on the bus in a manner consistent with established standards for classroom behavior. In cases when a student does not conduct themselves properly on the bus, such instances are brought to the attention of the Transportation Supervisor by the bus driver.

#### STUDENTS ARE TO ABIDE BY THE FOLLOWING RULES:

- 1. Follow directions of the bus driver
- 2. Keep hands, feet, and other objects to themselves and inside the bus
- 3. Remain seated, facing forward, keeping the aisle clear
- 4. Keep a low noise level
- 5. Refrain from eating or drinking while riding the bus

# THE FOLLOWING OFFENSES ARE CONSIDERED SEVERE, AND MAY RESULT IN AN AUTOMATIC SUSPENSION OF OR EXPULSION FROM RIDING PRIVILEGES:

- 1. Direct defiance of the driver
- 2. Striking or offensive touching
- 3. Swearing
- 4. Vandalism
- 5. Any use of tobacco, alcohol, and/or illegal drugs
- 6. Obscene gestures
- 7. Sexual harassment
- 8. Any other behavior disrupting the safe operation of the bus

The driver may return directly to the student's school or the district's administration office if a student(s) commits a severe offense during the afternoon bus run. Students who become a disciplinary problem on the bus may be suspended from riding the bus by the transportation supervisor and/or building principal.

# **DISRUPTIVE STUDENT POLICY**

# SERIOUS OFFENSES RESULTING IN OFFICE REFERRAL

- 1. 1. Open defiance of a serious nature as determined by the building principal
- 2. Vandalism of a serious nature as determined by the building principal
- 3. Extortion and/or intimidation
- 4. Weapons/Theft

- Physical Assaults or Threats
  Sexual Harassment
- 8. Substance abuse
- 8. Substance abuse
- 5. Chronic violations of expected student behaviors to include detentions, office referrals, unexcused absence, unexcused tardies, classroom disturbance, or any other discipline concern. Three violations in a two week period would be considered chronic.

## **CONSEQUENCES OF OFFICE REFERRAL**

- **First Offense:** Student shall be suspended for 1 to 2 days out-of-school suspension, as determined appropriate by the building principal. Only when parents can't be reached shall in-school suspension be used. The student shall be re-admitted only after the student, parent, homeroom teacher, and principal have met to establish behavioral expectations. All make-up work must be submitted to the teacher before they will be re-admitted.
- **Second Offense:** Three days of out-of-school suspension shall be assigned by the building principal. All students will be re-admitted only after the student, parent, homeroom teacher, and principal have met to establish behavioral expectations. All make-up work must be submitted to the teacher before the student will be re-admitted. The Superintendent shall be informed in writing of all students reaching this level.
- **Third Offense:** Five days of out-of-school suspension. The student, parent, principal, and superintendent shall be informed that one more serious offense will result in a meeting with the School Board. All make-up work must be submitted to the principal before the student shall be re-admitted.
- **Fourth Offense:** Out-of-school suspension until student and parent meet with the School Board. Possible penalties could be long term academic suspension or expulsion. Long term suspension might run from 10 to 20 school days. Parents can receive a student's work from the office each Friday. Successful completion of work would be required for re-entry. Any further violation would lead to another meeting with the Board for expulsion.

#### **DRESS CODE**

Students shall not wear clothing that is counterproductive to curriculum goals (e.g. the nature and harmful effects of alcohol, drugs, and tobacco) and/or is disruptive to the learning process.

#### VISITORS

Students are not allowed to bring friends or relatives to school as visitors, unless they receive prior approval from the building principal.

#### HOMEWORK

Parents should contact the school by 8:30am to request homework if their child has been absent two or more days. Homework may be picked up between 2:30pm and 3:30pm.

#### LIBRARY

Students in grades K-12 will receive library skill instruction. We have a self-checkout system that relies on the honor of the students. If a book is lost or damaged, it is the student and parent responsibility to pay for it. We no longer let students trade books. Magazines and newspapers are also available for student use.

#### VANDALISM

When a student defaces or damages school property, his/her parent/ guardian shall be liable for the cost of repairs or replacement (20-5-201, MCA)

# **STUDENT RECORDS**

Student record information is governed by laws throughout our country that require publication of practices in the school district. The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act guarantees that students and parents have the right to know what student information is available and who can access student record information.

Parents have the right to inspect and review student records throughout the year. You simply must make a written request at the office of the building in which your child attends for the records you wish to inspect. The school official will make arrangements for access to the records at a time and place where the records may be inspected. Records will stay in plain sight of office personnel at all times during the inspection by a parent. Records will not be released to an individual and all requests for copies require payment of \$0.15 per page to reimburse the district for costs.

Parents have the right to submit a request to amend the records by submitting a letter to the building principal requesting the change and the reason (inaccurate, misleading, irrelevant, improper) for the request. The request will be reviewed and the final decision for amending the records for cause will lie with the building principal. The school will notify the parent or guardian of the result of their request and inform them of their right to appeal the decision.

School officials will have the right to review educational records as necessary for the efficient running of the school. A school official is any person that is employed by School District #9 and functions as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support personnel such as school nurse, paraprofessional, secretary; a person serving on the School Board; a person or employee with whom the district is contracting services such as a therapist; local law enforcement personnel acting within the scope of their duties; or a parent serving on a committee that is assisting the school district.

School Officials make student directory information available because by definition it is generally considered to be harmless and not an invasion of privacy if disclosed. This information includes such items as student name, parent name, address, phone number, field of study, height and weight of athletes, most recent school attended, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, dates of attendance and degrees or awards.

If for any reason these rights are not satisfactory to you as a parent of a minor child, please contact the school. Parents have the right to file a complaint with the Family Policy Compliance Office in the Department of Education if these guidelines are not followed.
