A STRONG FIT

Helena's McBride Galt coming up big in junior season for Saints

It was the biggest hit of McBride Galt's life.

He'd never had a similar hit and, even in the moment, he couldn't grasp what he'd done. He knew his responsibility on the play, to help the defense get off the field and disallow No. 7 Montana Tech from scoring before halftime. He played a little further back at his safety position than usual. He's accustomed to lining up on the wide side of the field, toward the team's speediest receiving option. The middle of the field is often his turf.

When Tech's quarterback slung the ball to his favorite receiver, over Galt's territory, the junior safety found "the right spot at the right time."

Boom.

In retrospect, Galt feels a little lucky to have made the play at all.

Saints hoping to carry winning ways to SOU

Winning is the cure — at least for now. Carroll entered its Week 3 matchup against the MSU-Northern Lights in need of improved play. The Saints found it, rolling to a 34-3 victory.

Carroll dominated nearly every one of the statistical categories. The Saints put up 432 total yards of offense and held Northern to 201, including a dominant

321-yard rushing day for Carroll backs. Carroll only punted once all game. On the other side, Carroll only received two kickoffs in that same span, and Shane Sipes took one to the house for an 85-yard touchdown.

“It’s always easier to coach after a win,” Saints coach Mike Van Diest said, cautioning that players are still scrutinized but more receptive. “It’s

At the time, he didn't think much of it. His teammates mobbed him as he walked off the field, slapping his helmet and his backside, the scene contrasted by a sullen Tech sideline, which feared they may have lost their top receiving threat. But Galt's brain only fixated on a stinger in his shoulder as a result of the play.

Both players were fine, which is a rare outcome during such a violent collision.

Even now, talk of the hit still circulates the stands at Nelson Stadium, fans waiting for Galt's next big play.

They got a taste last Saturday, Galt hauling in an interception late in Carroll's win over MSU-Northern, working back into the middle of the field and

picking his way for a 20-yard return.

Still, Saints coach Mike Van Diest would urge those looking for Galt to batter another receiver, to instead look a little closer.

There's more to McBride Galt.

Galt is a Helena boy.

He grew up around Carroll College football.

After playing in Small Fry football games for Wendy's, Galt and his friends would head to Nelson Stadium on Saturdays, dedicating the day to the sport. He and his friends could be found roaming the grassy lot on the side of the stands, playing catch. He doesn't remember much else about those games, other than exiting earlier than other fans.

"Leaving at halftime during most of the games because the score was so bad in favor of Carroll," Galt recalled.

It left a favorable impression in his

mind, but he still had other ideas of where college could take him. He and Troy Arntson, then a high school teammate with the Helena High Bengals, often talked together about where they could go for school and to play football.

"At first, we didn't really give Carroll a lot of thought because we wanted to get out of town," Galt said.

Former Bengals and then current Saints recruited the two. Names like Dylan Simac, Sean Blomquist, Nate Hendricks, Grant Bogumill, Matt Upham and Taylor South all played their own role in helping Galt decide.

Van Diest sealed the deal.

An at-home visit from the coach helped Galt realize Carroll College "felt like the place to be."

Galt had a strong bond with his high school teammates. So when Van Diest explained Carroll's emphasis on a family

easier to look at the things you did well. When you make mistakes, you can point it out, and positives come from film sessions.”

After two weeks of giving up more than 40 points per game, the Saints were powerful on defense and controlled the game on offense. It gives the group some momentum going into a matchup with undefeated and No. 13 ranked Southern Oregon.

“Does Southern have an extremely talented team? You bet,” Van Diest said. “They haven’t slid down in the last five years. They recruit tremendous skill. You play against these good receivers at Rocky and at Tech and Northern. Now you have to play against those guys at Southern.

“The quarterback at Tech and at Southern Oregon may be as good as anywhere in the country. You want to respect them, but don’t fear them. This is what we’ve gotta do.”

Tanner Trosin is back for the Raiders a year after his junior season was cut short because of a foot injury. The quarterback has guided Southern Oregon to a national championship appearance before, and with a 3-0 start, with wins over Eastern Oregon (31-21), College of Idaho (41-25) and Montana Western (52-28), he appears ready to make another run with the Raiders.

His 397 total offensive yards per game ranks No. 3 in the NAIA. Trosin is completing 64 percent of his passes and has piled up 1,081 passing yards and eight touchdowns without an interception this season. He’s also added on 110 rushing yards and two more scores.

Slowing Trosin will be

a major key for the Saints. Though the passing game has been prolific, the Raiders have shown a near 50-50 split between running and passing, partially due to Trosin’s runs. On the season, the Raiders have rushed 118 times for 403 yards, a 3.4 yard per-carry average. Rey Vega leads the team in carries with 34 for 128 yards and a score. Michael Roots has three scores on his 24 rushes and 82 yards.

Trosin’s top target is receiver Bronsen Ader, who has 13 catches for 361 yards and three touchdowns.

The Raiders also rank highly in sacks and opposing

third-down conversion rate. The Raiders are third in the nation with 4.2 sacks per game, and they hold offenses to a conversion rate of 21 percent on third-down tries.

Tre Holmes and Armando Gauger have been a big part of SOU’s pass rush, accounting for 3.5 and 3 sacks, respectively.

The Saints will look to get a few more bodies on the field this week. Receiver Troy Arntson is listed as a starting receiver on the team’s two-deep. Arntson has been slowed by a hamstring injury.

The Saints’ receiving leader from a season ago, Connor

Fohn, is not listed on the two-deep, and appears to still be held out with a hamstring injury of his own.

Carroll believes Isazah King, who started for the Saints against Montana Tech and played big roles on special teams, will be back at corner behind Drew Melton, who is averaging two passes defended per game the eighth best mark in the nation.

Beyond the injuries, though, Van Diest believed it was a emphasis in practice that led to the Saints win last weekend, and could be a breakthrough moving forward. While the Saints didn’t have to do anything exotic on defense, leading Van Diest to say during the postgame press conference he didn’t need to be Buddy Ryan as a defensive coordinator, it didn’t mean the Saints went completely vanilla. It’s certainly easier to play defense with a lead, rather than taking risks to hope for turnovers while trailing.

“Some of it was simplified,” Van Diest said. “Some of it was getting better. I’m trying to do something to get our defense excited. We had the lead. We didn’t play conservative. We had five or six hurries. It wasn’t simplified. We went back to practice, we simplified there. Who lever-ages? Who spills? Who has A-gap, B-gap? We still have a lot of improvement to do.”

Even then, it will still be a chess match of matching up with Southern Oregon’s play-makers on both sides of the ball on Saturday in Ashland.

Last season, the Raiders took the teams’ one matchup, 34-14. It was an exception to the previous four matchups, dating back to 2014. While SOU held a 3-1 advantage over the 2014-15 seasons, the four games were settled by a combined 13 points.

Saturday will tell if the Saints and Raiders combine for another thriller.

culture, and the mixture of former Bengals, Galt knew.

Van Diest knew, too. Galt would be a strong fit for the Saints. The coach had followed Galt's junior and senior high school seasons on the gridiron and hardwood.

"Knew his family, and knew he was the type of guy," Van Diest said. "If I was at Wyoming, I would have recruited him there."

It wasn't all athleticism, potential and aptitude that appealed about Galt. Galt's family, his twin sisters (who also attend Carroll), and his enthusiasm for the game meant the Saints not only recruited a standout football player, but also a standout person.

"He plays with great enthusiasm," Van Diest said. "When he makes it or somebody else makes a play, he's passionate. It's genuine. He's extremely excited with his teammates."

"He brought that with him to Carroll College. That's what so exciting. He's never pouted when I chewed him out. At the same time, he takes that in and he's extremely coachable."

• • •

His passion shines before opening kick.

Each game day in Helena, Galt and his roommates will wake up and walk from their house to the CC cafeteria. After a team-wide breakfast at 9:30 a.m., Galt aims to arrive at the PE Center at 10:15 and be on the field by 10:30 a.m., jogging and polishing his footwork. For games that typically kick off at 1 p.m., Galt is warming up two and a half hours beforehand.

He's worked to be a starting safety for the Saints, and he reflects on that. Even in the midst of a season, Galt knows his time playing football is limited.

"I enjoy doing this because I'll never get to do it again in my life," he said. "Trying to take advantage of these guaranteed games I have," even though Galt knows no game is fully guaranteed.

Galt "earned his keep" Van Diest said, working his way up to become a starter after redshirting his freshman year. As a redshirt freshman, Galt remembers his first experience on the field.

"I had some mistakes and got knocked around," he said.

He can remember the first couple of plays. It wasn't his first play, but his second he remembers being offside on kickoff, forcing his team to re-kick. Then, after the second kick, he remembers getting "blown up by a blocker," and Southern Oregon taking that kick to the house for a touchdown.

"It was a rough start," Galt said.

Galt played mostly special teams that 2015 season. He said that game "kind of woke" him up and helped him understand what it took to play at the college level. He was the fourth safety, behind two seniors and his current secondary teammate, Tucker Johnson. Johnson played a little that season, going in before Galt, who estimated he played around 15 snaps at safety.

"I needed to know the defense more," he said. "Get a better football IQ, as far as reading the plays and tendencies."

It took more film study and on-field experience for Galt to blossom.

He carried that desire to learn over to this season. During two-a-days, Galt presented Van Diest a handout, detailing various intricacies of defense.

"It was a four-, five-page dissertation," Van Diest said.

The other major translation from last season to this season has been the combination between Galt and Johnson. Last season, Galt started and played alongside Johnson, the two forming a strong last line to Carroll's defense. Galt and Johnson were often high on the tackling charts and helped Carroll to find some identity on defense during a down season.

"Last year we started strong and then dipped down," Galt said. "After that slump during the first part of the season, I felt like myself and as a team we got better. We got more experience we learned more. It didn't end how we wanted to. We ended the season on a higher note as far as skill and experience."

Van Diest said Galt and Johnson's play together is a strong point for the Saints.

"That's great for him to be alongside Tucker Johnson for two years," Van Diest said. "He's not Tucker's understudy this year. He's his equal."

On the field, it's paramount for those two to be on the same page. Galt and Johnson will communicate on nearly every play. Galt has to make sure he talks to the play-side corner and linebacker, too, but Galt and Johnson, fueled by a friendship, share a more unique bond.

"I think when you look at people that can really communicate well, I don't think people really understand that relationship with athletes," Van Diest said. "No matter what sport there is, there needs to be good communication there and trust and care about each other. McBride doesn't want to let Tucker down."

"I enjoy playing my last season with him," Galt said.

As Galt and the Saints work out the kinks and try to build some momentum as the season ages, at the very least they'll have a ball-hawking safety looking out behind them.

"He's done it all," Van Diest said. "He's been a real bright spot for us."
