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- We did see an increase on wristband sales due to the fence; however, we spent more money on entertainment than previous years to book a line-up that people would buy admission to see.
- There were some new costs associated with the fence some costs were first year only.
- Vendor fees were down some because some vendors were hesitant to return due to being
 unsure about what the fence would do to their business, and because of lower sales in 2016.
- However, the biggest reason we didn't make a surplus is due to a drastic reduction on our carnival commission, which had been a strong and steady income source for 7 years.

SAVING MONEY ON CITY SERVICES

• Public Works – The biggest expense that the city has in relation to Public Works services for the festival is labor, which totals \$57,052, with an average hourly rate of \$77 for the city employees who are working at the festival doing things like overnight clean up. The only way we can save money is to outsource certain aspects of these services to a labor staffing firm. After initial conversations with Public Works staff, I anticipate we could save at least \$20,000 making this change with the festival hiring the labor staffing for overnight clean-up and the city reimbursing us for that expense. The city staff would still be needed for traffic control set up and take down.



Police Services – The addition of a fence has enhanced the overall safety and security of the
festival. There were fewer incidents that required police intervention. In 2018, we plan to hire
off duty officers or deputies to provide security at each admission gate, adding an additional
layer of security. Given these changes and preliminary discussions with Deputy Chief S. Jason
Walker, we anticipate we can reduce the overall cost for police services this year by reducing
the number of officers on site.

HOW DO WE SECURE THE FESTIVAL FOR THE FUTURE?

- We believe we have the correct formula now in place to successfully steer the festival forward.
- We received rave reviews from the public regarding the formula of charging a minimal fee and providing a higher tier of entertainment, and this is the path we will continue on.
- We are working on refining the fence-line and layout to optimize revenues.
