


CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC 2021








COVID-19 CASES

Positive cases reported by date, according to the Indiana Department of Health





COVID-19 DEATHS

Deaths attributed to COVID-19 and reported by date, according to the Indiana Department of Health




COVID-19 TESTS

Tests administered and reported by date, according to the Indiana Department of Health




COVID-19 VACCINATION STATUS BY GENDER AND RACE
