

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 7TH IS ELECTION DAY FOR HAVERHILL

This election on Tuesday November, 7th is an important one for the City of Haverhill.

We will be electing our first new mayor in twenty years and for the very first time, electing city council members and school committee members by ward. There are also "At Large" candidates this year for City Council (in two years we will be voting for At Large School Committee as well).

At Large candidates will be representing the entire city and you may vote for the four City Council candidates you most want to fill those seats.

Ward candidates represent YOUR Ward, which is the neighborhood/voting district in which you live. You may vote for one individual to be your Ward City Council Representative and one to be your Ward School committee Member

I respectfully ask for your vote on Tuesday, November 7th. I'm the fifth name, #5, on the City Councilor At Large ballot.






