Ordinance No. 18-09 adds semitruck parking as a permitted acces-Ordinance No. 18-09 adds semitruck parking as a permitted accessory use in an I district and specifies parking standards.
Ordinance No. 18-13 establishes minimum screening require-ments for exterior storage and and amends requirements for parking/ storage of vehicles and recreational vehicles. venicies.
Ordinance No. 18-14 expands the definition of temporary storage units. Ordinance No. 18-15 adds fire-wood stacks as an exception to exterior storage restrictions while establishing standards.

Ordinance No. 18-16 addresses parking of commercial vehicles, amends off-street parking require ments and amends the method for calculating width restrictions driveways. Ordinance No. 18-17 amends the drainage and regrading requirements. 18-18 Ordinance No. defines snow, ice and rubbish as public nuisances and moves the removal requirements into Section 9-17. Ordinance No. 18-19 replaces the term "residence" with "principal residential structure" in the compost pile regulations.

Ordinance No. 18-20 imposes recycling requirements.

Ordinance No. 18-21 amends the offensive vegetation and weeds section. Ordinance No. 18-22 imposes setback requirements on all flag-poles, including freestanding flagpoles poles.
Ordinance No. 18-23 expands
the definition of recreational uses.
Ordinance No. 18-26 prohibits
certain types of fences including certain types of fences including barbed wire fences.
