tice shall be given by: 1) publication

once a week for two consecutive

weeks in a legal newspaper in Hen-

nepin County, the last publication

of which is to be at least ten (10)

days before the deadline for objec-

tions; **and** 2) mailing via U.S. Postal

Service a copy of this Notice and

Order postmarked at least fourteen

(14) days prior to the deadline for

objections to all interested persons

as defined in Minnesota Statutes §

524.1-401 and persons who have

filed a demand for notice pursuant

to Minnesota Statutes §524.3-204.

Any charitable beneficiary may

request notice of the probate pro-

ceeding be given to the attorney

general pursuant to Minnesota

Statutes § 501B.41, subdivision 5.
