DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PROJECT

Milaca Public Schools, ISD #912 is proposing a single question bond referendum on May 8, 2018 that would

authorize \$33.385 million in bonding authority to finance building additions, ballfield improvements, security upgrades and deferred maintenance projects.

house would include 4 basketball courts, a second floor jogging track, fitness center and other ancillary space. The 800 seat auditorium would include a stage and fly loft, dressing rooms and shop/storage space. The proposed additions would necessitate the relocation of the varsity baseball field. The district is proposing the construction of a ballfield complex for the varsity baseball field, and two other baseball fields, on one of

The two largest project components are fieldhouse and auditorium additions. The 49,000 square foot field-

two properties owned by the district west of town. The complex would include amenities such as bleachers. dugouts and concessions. Other proposed projects include a high-bay addition and the reallocation/renovation of existing building

space for technical education programming, deferred maintenance upgrades and security improvements.

The school board believes the proposed projects are in the best long term interest of the district. The proj-

ects would be scheduled for completion in the 2019 - 2020 calendar years. Cost estimates by project type are as follows:

\$ 2,175,000 Though enrollment has decreased slightly over the last few years, the school board believes existing revenues will be sufficient to fund an estimated operating cost increase of \$250,000 for operating / staffing the additional building space. In addition, the school board believes the proposed projects are in the best long

term interest of the district. If the bond referendum is successful and bonds are sold, the debt service on the bonds will be eligible for debt service equalization under Minn. Stat. § 123B.53, subd. 3, if the bond schedule is approved. The amount

of debt service equalization aid, if any, the district receives is determined annually and is dependent upon
