(A) In all districts, livestock may be raised or bred without a permit provided there are less than eleven (11) animal units on the propertythat the number of animals, density, and other characteristics of the use comply with the Performance Standards in this section. (B) In the SCR District, grazing of livestock is allowed however no build-

ings or structures are allowed.

(C) Any person owning or conducting a livestock operation containing 11-49 animal units in the, A-4 district shall obtain a certificate of compli-(C) Any person owning or <u>seeking to</u> conducting a livestock operation with eleven (11) or more animals units in the SCR districts or over 49 an-

imal units in the AG district shall obtain a conditional use permita higher density (number of animals per grazable acre) than permitted by the Per-formance Standards in this section shall obtain a Conditional Use Permit.

(D) Animal density. A minimum of two (2) grazable acres shall be provided for each animal unit or its equivalent. Grazable acres shall be defined as open, non-treed acreage currently providing enough pasture or other agricultural crops capable of supporting summer grazing at the density

The keeping of livestock in greater density than allowed as stated above shall require a conditional use permit. To obtain such permit, the applicant

must demonstrate that facilities are present and appropriate practices are being employed to preclude surface or ground water contamination, excessive manure accumulation, odor, noise and other nuisances.

a) The structure shall not be used for the storage of animal manure for a period in excess of 12 months or the time period for which it was designed.
b) The design of the structure shall be prepared and designed by a reg-

istered Professional Engineer or staff from the Washington Conservation District qualified in the design of earthen structures or prepared by other professionals specializing in the design of such structures and with the roper training for such design and signed by a registered Professional

shall not be placed on slopes which exceed 13%.

(F) Pastures. Livestock may graze within s§horeland and bluff impact zones provided permanent vegetation is maintained or a conservation plan has been submitted to the Township and the County Zoning Administrator which is consistent with the technical guides of the Washington Conservation Picture.

(G) Bees. Honeybees are considered a domestic farm animal. may keep honeybees on parcels in the Agriculture Zoning District. Hives shall meet the livestock setback requirements of this ordinance. The colony shall be maintained in good order and shall not be nuisance to any member of the public.
(E)(H) The minimum acreage and animal density requirements in Section 2.14 are waived for keeping of domestic fowl (chickens, turkeys, geese or ducks) on lots smaller than 5 acres provided that the standards in Section 2.15 are met.

(B) All chickens shall be of the subspecies Gallus gallus domesticus, and shall be tolerant of local climate conditions. All fowl species kept on parcels smaller than five (5) acres shall be domesticated varieties.

(C) Guineafowl are prohibited (members of the Family Numididae, genus Agelastes, Numida, Guttera, or Acryllium).

(D) All domestic fowl shall be contained within the owner's parcel at

(F) Coops and attached exercise pens shall be provided for all domestic vi. Coops and pens shall be fully-enclosed including overhead areas,

and shall be constructed of durable materials. The coop shall have sufficient windows for natural light. The floor area of the coop must equal at least two (2) square feet per fowl and the combination of the floor area and pen area must equal at least ten (10) square feet of area per domestic fowl. (G) If the coop is larger than 200 square feet, the owner shall obtain a ilding permit. If electricity is to be provided for hearing or lighting, the

(H) Coops, pens and other structures for domestic fowl shall meet the structure setback requirements of the zoning district where the parcel is located, plus all structures shall maintain a minimum setback of twenty (20) feet from dwellings on adjacent properties, and shall be located in

(I) No person may allow domestic fowl to range freely without fencing or without a mobile pen.

(J) All food stored for domestic fowl shall be kept in rodent-proof con-

tainers stored inside coops or other buildings.

(K) Structures and areas in which domestic fowl are kept or maintained, including coops and pens, shall be kept reasonable clean from fills, garden and the statement of the period of the statement of the statemen bage, and any substances which attract rodents. All feces shall be collected regularly and properly disposed of on a regular basis as fertilizer, composted, or transported off the premises. (L) Domestic fowl shall not be kept in such a manner as to constitute a public nuisance as defined by the Township. (M) The Township may enter and inspect any property, including the coop and back yard, at any reasonable time for the purpose of investigating a reported violation or to ascertain compliance or noncompliance with the City Code and Certificate of Compliance. SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage and publication.
