The City of Monticello (hereinafter "City") makes the following legislative findings: The purpose of this ordinance makes the following legislative findings: The purpose of this ordinance is to implement the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, chapter 342, which authorizes the City to protect the public health, safety, welfare of City residents by regulating cannabis businesses within the legal boundaries of City.

(A) No individual or entity may operate a Registered Retailer within the City without first being issued a retail registration by Wright County.

(B) No registration shall be issued to a Registered Business unless there is an available registra-
