2.7 Reclaimed water means water collected from rooftops, paved surfaces, or other collection devices and all water utilized more than once before re-entering the natural ater cycle.

2.8 Water recirculation system areans any system which enables neans use water at least once a user to reuse water at least once prior to returning the water to the natural water cycle.

SECTION 3. APPLICATION.

3.1 This ordinance applies to all customers of public water suppliers who own or control water use on any premises.

3.2 No person cause, use, or peri shall s.z No person snall make, cause, use, or permit the use of water received from a public water supply for residential, commercial, industrial, governmental, or any other purpose in any manner contrary to any provision in this ordinary to any provision in this ordi-nance.

3.3 Mandatory emergency con-servation measures shall be imple-mented based upon the declaration of a critical water emergency by the governor. SECTION 4. DECLARATION CRITICAL WATER DEFICIENCY Upon the declaration of a Upon the declaration of a criti-cal water deficiency by the gover-nor, the public water supplier shall immediately post notice of the emergency declaration at the usual meeting place of the city council, or the official city bulletin board. The city shall prov the public as quic through establish shall provide notification to ic as quickly as possible or established water supply or procedures. SECTION MERGENCY WATER CONSERVA ON MEASURES. Upon declaration of a wate Upon declaration of a water emergency and notification to the public, the following mandatory re-strictions upon nonessential water use shall be enforced:

(1) Outdoor irrigation of yards, gardens, golf courses, parklands, and other non-agricultural land, except for those areas irrigated with reclaimed water, is prohibited. (2) Washing or spraying of side-liks, driveways, parking areas nis courts, patios, or other ved areas with water from any walks, driveways, tennis courts, pa pressurized source, including garden hoses, except to alleviate immediate health or safety hazards, is prohibited. (3) The outdoor use of any water-based play apparatus connect-ed to a pressurized source is pro-hibited. (3) Restaurants and other food service establishments are prohibited from serving water to their customers, unless water is specifically requested by the customer.

(5) Operation of outdoor misting systems used to cool public areas systems used to cool public areas is prohibited.

(6) The filling of swimming pools, fountains, spas, or other exterior water features is prohibited.

(7) The washing of automobiles, water features is prohibited.

(7) The washing of automobiles, trucks, trailers, and other types of mobile equipment is prohibited, except at facilities equipped with wash water recirculation systems, and for vehicles requiring frequent washing to protect public health, safety, and welfare.

SECTION 6. VARIANCES.

The City Clerk or their designee, is authorized to grant variances to this ordinance where strict applica-The City Clerk or their designee, is authorized to grant variances to this ordinance where strict application of its provisions would result in serious hardship to a customer. A variance may be granted only for reasons involving health or safety. An applicant may appeal the denial of a variance within five (5) days of the decision by submitting a written appeal to the City Clerk. The City Council shall hear the appeal at the next City Council meeting. The decision of the City Council is final. SECTION 7. VIOLATION. 7.1 Violations shall be determined and cited by the City Clerk or his/her designee. A violator may appeal the citation within five (5) days of its issuance by submitting a written appeal to the City. The City Council shall hear the appeal at the next City Council meeting. City Council shall hear the appear at the next City Council meeting. The decision of the City Council is final. Violators may be granted an administrative waiver if evidence that equipment failure final. SECTION 8. ENFORCEMENT. The City Clerk or his/her designee is authorized to designate city employees or law enforcement personnel to enforce the provisions of this profuse.
