

CITY OF MEDINA PUBLIC NOTICE

ORDINANCE NO. 735

The city council of the City of Medina has adopted Ordinance No. 735, an ordinance amending Chapters 6 and 8 of the City Code pertaining cannabis and hemp businesses. The ordinance establishes requirements related to registration of cannabis and hemp retailers, including limiting the number of cannabis retailers in Medina to 1 per 12,500 residents. The ordinance establishes standards for temporary cannabis events. The ordinance also establishes zoning regulation for cannabis and hemp businesses, including permitting minimum buffers from schools, daycares, residential facilities, and park features. Cannabis and lower-potency hemp edible retailers are added as permitted uses in the Commercial-Highway, Commercial-Highway-Railroad, and Commercial-General districts and lower-potency hemp edible retailers are added as a permitted use in the Uptown Hamel district. The ordinance also allows other cannabis business uses in the Business, Business Park, and Industrial Park districts. subject to a conditional use permit standards and approval.
