I am Chris DuBose and am running for Chisago County Board. I am excited to serve another term as your commissioner as there is much that I have accomplished over the last 4 years but feel that there is still a lot to do. I am currently serving District 1 but due to redistricting my home in Center City was shifted to District 2, which includes Chisago Lake North and South, Franconia, Shafer, and Amador Townships, Cities of Center City, Shafer, and Taylors Falls.

I was an Air Traffic Controller for 25 years before retiring in 2007. I've served Chisago County in many ways over the last 20+ years as City Council, Mayor, Planning Commission, Police Commissioner, Parks Board, and many others. Im also active in the Chisago Lakes Rotary Club and the CL Good Neighbors Club.

The most important job of the County Commissioner is budgeting. Chisago County has one of the higher tax rates in the State. 
I helped lead efforts to

provide our schools with grant funding for vocational programs. I love that students can graduate with an associates degree but want there to be an alternative for kids who college isn't their choice.

I've been a big leader for many years in helping our lakes and rivers. I worked with the Chisago Lakes Restoration Association and successfully lobbied for navigable bridges to connect the Chisago/ Lindstrom/Center Lakes chain. I've been on the Lake Improvement District, the City and County Parks Board, The Swedish Immigrant Regional Trail Committee, and have participated in several trail projects through our Rotary Club. I was named to the Minnesota State Aquatic Invasive Species Advisory Board. I was also one of the organizing board members of the Lower St. Croix Watershed that banded all of the smaller watersheds in Chisago and neighboring counties to help secure more state and federal funding for water quality improvements.
