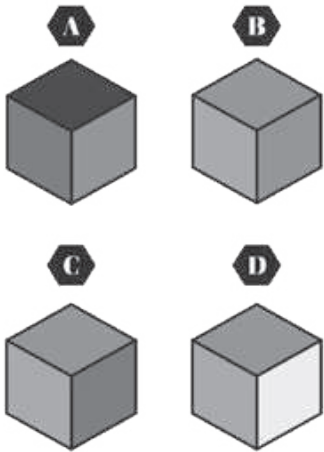
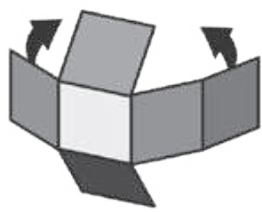


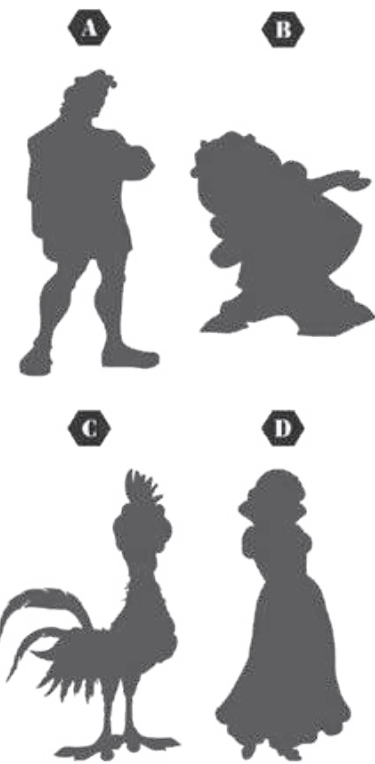
CUBE IT!

The six-sided shape on top can be folded to form a cube. Only two of the cubes below can be made by it. Which are they?



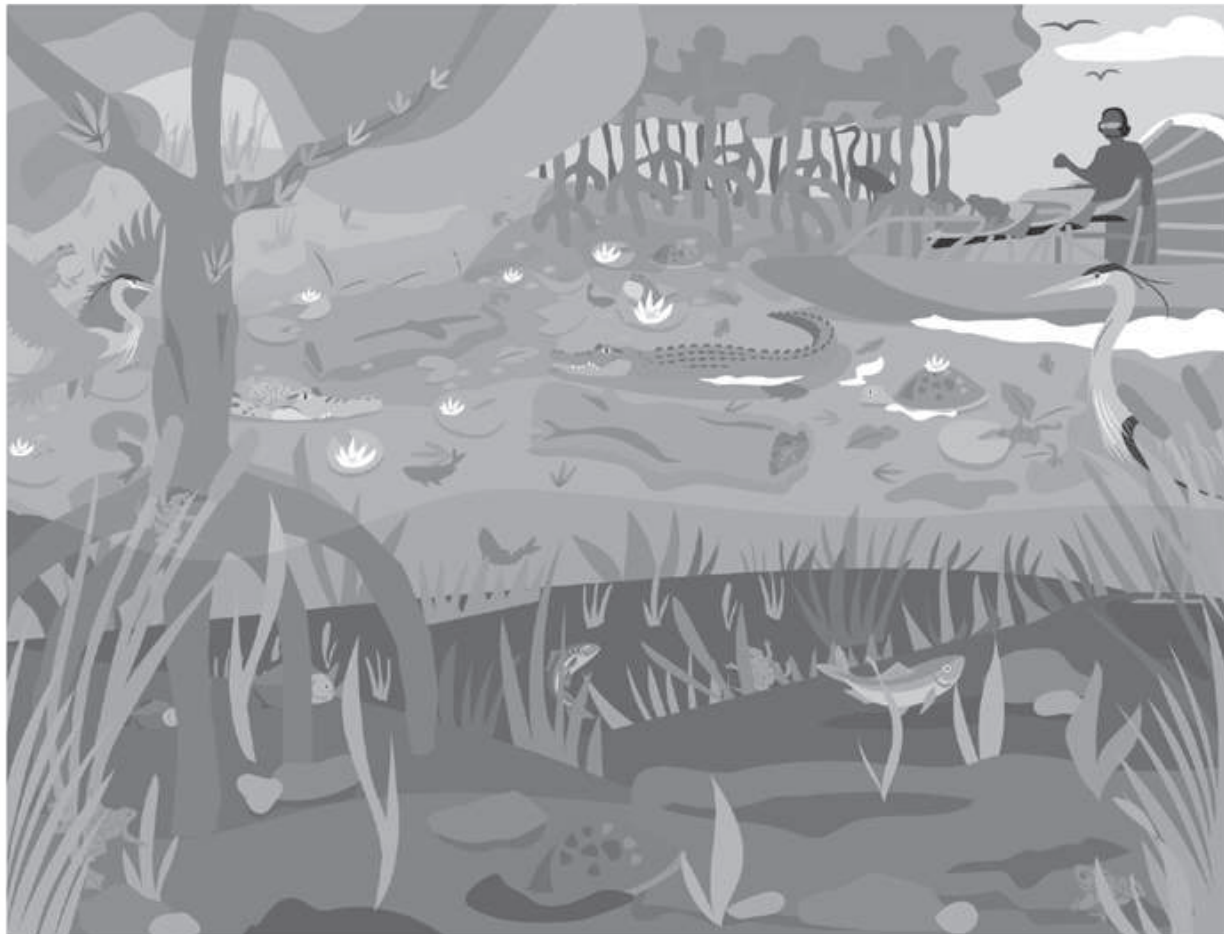

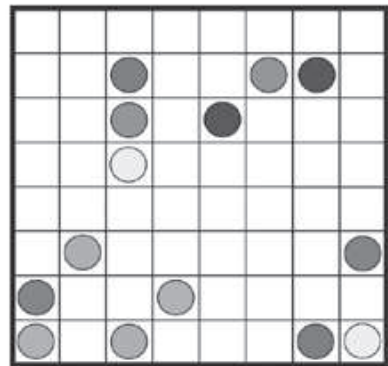
Can you find the 10 frogs hidden inside the swampy illustration below?
