

**First Public Hearing Notice for
Huntingdon County and on Behalf of Huntingdon Borough and Smithfield Township
for the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2026 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program**

Notice is hereby given that the Huntingdon County Commissioners plan to submit an application to the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCEd) for Federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds. The allocation will be \$465,364 for the FFY 2026 CDBG program with an application deadline of October 30, 2026. Anticipated funding allocations are listed below.

The first of two required public hearings regarding Huntingdon County and on behalf of Huntingdon Borough and Smithfield Township FFY 2026 CDBG program will be held in person at each municipality as follows. These hearings are accessible to individuals with disabilities and/or for persons with limited English proficiency. Items to be discussed include a brief summary of the CDBG program in general, the needs of the County, Huntingdon Borough and Smithfield Township which could potentially be addressed with CDBG funds, and the performance under previously funded CDBG program years and to discuss the required three-year community development plan of the municipalities.

The following types of activities may be eligible for funding under the CDBG Program: Construction of public facilities and improvements, such as water and sewer facilities, streets, and neighborhood centers; housing rehabilitation; public services that are new or provide quantifiable increases in the delivery of services; removal of architectural barriers; economic development; demolition; and program administration.

Eligible activities must meet one of three national objectives: principally benefit low-to-moderate income persons, prevention or elimination of slums or blight, or meet a need having a particular urgency. At least 70% of the available funding must be used for activities which benefit low- and moderate-income persons. The proposed activities must benefit at least 51% low-moderate income persons in the service area to qualify as a low-moderate income project.

If the applicant would undertake activities that could result in the displacement of families or individuals, then the applicant is responsible for replacing all low- and moderate-income housing units that may be demolished or converted. No displacement is anticipated and every effort will be made to avoid or minimize displacement and relocation.

The public is encouraged to attend and participate in the hearing and will be offered the opportunity to express oral testimony.
