What to do if ICE activity occurs in our community!

- Call Bridges Hotline at 208-221-2343 and/or email refugeebridges@gmail.com
- Spread the information to anyone you know
- **Document the activity** take pictures or film the activity; get the names and birth dates of those that are detained; get the names and badge numbers of the ICE agents (if possible); ask where detainees are being taken
- Hand out or shout out information "Know Your Rights"
- Call local police or EMS in case of violence or injuries; call local media outlets

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS - You have Constitutional Rights

- DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR if an immigration agent is knocking on the door.
- **DO NOT ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS** from an immigration agent if they try to talk to you. You have the right to remain silent.
- **DO NOT SIGN ANYTHING** without first speaking to a lawyer. You have the right to speak with a lawyer.
- If you are outside of your home, ask the agent if you are free to leave and if they say yes, leave calmly.
 - GIVE THIS CARD TO THE AGENT. If you are inside of your home, show the card through the window or slide it under the door.
