Cambridge Chipotle back on the menu

This time, it appears to be real. After a seemingly premature announcement of a Chipotle Restaurant being constructed at the former Perkins property in September, 2023 that never came to fruition, plans are again in place for the popular restaurant to open.

According to the Dec. 2 Planning Commission agenda packet, Trautz Properties, Inc. is the new developer presenting plans to redevelop the former Perkins site, which is now known as "Cambridge Junction." Just as two years ago, the entire property is to be divided into three parcels. Chipotle will be constructed roughly on the same space as the Perkins building currently sits, but with a north/south orientation.

Also, like before, a tire store is planned to

be constructed on the eastern portion of the property. Unlike before, the business has already been revealed to be a Les Schwab Tire store.

The third parcel, located on the north side of the property, is preliminarily slated to have one or two additional, yet-to-be-named businesses.

Each of the businesses is proposed to have its own entrance/exit to its parking lot.

Recently, all the removable objects from the Perkins building — including the tall flagpole — were sold in an online auction. One of the conditions of purchase was the items needed to be picked up no later than Dec. 4.

The Planned Unit Development revisions, preliminary and final plat designs, will need to be presented and approved by the Cambridge City Council at the Dec. 15 council meeting.

Isanti receives third cannabis store registration

The Isanti City Council has approved a third cannabis microbusiness registration for a store to be located within city limits. However, the council will have to re-approve that registration at its Dec. 16 meeting after the discovery of a significant typo on the application.

Lime Line, LLC's application originally indicated the store would be located at 687 East Dual Blvd NE, making this store just feet away from the proposed location of AEY, LLC's cannabis store. According to City Administrator Josi Wood, however, AEY, LLC has decided not to open a store at 703 East Dual Blvd NE. Wood said AEY's registration was set to expire on Dec. 31, 2025, and the owner has informed the city he will not be re-registering for 2026. Wood added all

cannabis businesses must re-register on a yearly basis, with registrations expiring on Dec. 31.

Additionally, Wood said it was Lime Line's intention to open at the same location as AEY had planned; however, Lime Line submitted the wrong address on their application. They have since resubmitted the application with the correct address, which will have to be re-approved by the council.

If Lime Line follows through with opening, that will give the city of Isanti two cannabis stores. The first applicant, Northern Crown, LLC, is still in the process of remodeling its store located at 108 Main Street, Suite 400, ahead of its official opening. However, Wood said the owner had already re-registered for 2026, which the council approved during its Dec. 2 meeting.

How to defeat Walz next November

ack during the 2018 Minnesota Newspaper Association Convention, the organizers set up an informal Q&A session with the Democratic candidates for Minnesota Governor. If you

recall, there were something like 10 candidates seeking the Democratic endorsement, and a majority of them showed up for this session.

After the Q&A on stage, the candidates were able to mingle with the journalists in attendance. Naturally, pretty much all of them made a beeline for the journalists from the "bigger" newspapers.

I was sitting in the back of the room, along with Tom, the publisher of our Wisconsin sister newspapers. He was there because a couple of our Wisconsin papers do cover small sections in Minnesota. What impressed me at the time was only one candidate approached us to introduce himself and at least find out who we were: Tim Walz.

Now, nearly seven years later, I'm over that first impression.

Just looking at Walz's second term in office, the state has become an unmitigated disaster. I'm sure you have all heard the myriad of criticisms associated with Walz, so I'm not going to repeat them here. Suffice it to say, even the most ardent Walz supporter is having a hard time justifying his re-election.


In fact, even though it is early in the election process, and there are somewhere around 10 Republican candidates, I see only one thing that would give a fighting chance for a third term as governor: the Republicans going with whoever President Trump endorses out of those 10 (or whatever the total number winds up being prior to the endorsing convention

In Trump's obsession to not only defeat people who openly defy him, but to try and bury them, Trump has already alienated a portion of Minnesota voters. If he follows through with financially "punishing" the state for Walz's shortcomings in certain areas, everyone who winds up being collateral damage will unify behind Walz as well. No matter how qualified the Republican candidate may be, they will be found guilty by association with Trump.

There is also the distinct possibility Trump would endorse one of the candidates that is so unqualified for the position, voters like myself would have to grudgingly vote again for Walz. 



Do pregnancy belt clips work?

uestion: I'm pregnant and I've seen seat belt attachments that clip under the seat and say they make belts safer for pregnant people. Are these safe to use?



Answer: I contacted the expert who is the Community Programs and Occupant Protection Manager for the Minnesota Safety Council and here is what I was advised.

Seat belt adjusters, also called seat belt positioners.

are devices that try to move the lap belt so it doesn't rest across a pregnant person's belly. Manufacturers claim this reduces pressure and keeps the baby safe in a crash. These devices are not safe and should not be used.

What Crash Tests Showed:

• Experts tested these devices using crash test dummies designed to represent pregnant

drivers.

- Plastic hooks broke completely in crashes
- Metal hooks or extra straps pressed on the dummy's belly or groin.
- All adjusters allowed the dummy to move too far forward, increasing the risk of injury.
- Hard plastic or metal parts in the adjusters can cause extra harm in a crash.

Why They Don't Work:

- The main danger to a baby in a crash is from internal forces on the uterus, called placental abruption. Seat belt adjusters do not prevent these forces.
- Using an adjuster can actually make these forces worse by letting the pregnant driver move too far forward.

How to Wear a Seat Belt Safely During Pregnancy:

- Use the normal three-point seat belt (lap + shoulder belt).
- Lap belt: Low on the hips, under the belly.Shoulder belt: Across the chest
- and off the neck.Worn this way, the seat belt protects both mother and baby.Other Safety Notes:

- Manufacturers of seat belt adjusters do not have to meet safety standards.
- Materials and designs vary, and many are not crash-tested.
- Claims of "certified" or "crash tested" are not verified by independent sources.

Bottom line: Do not use seat belt adjusters. Wearing the seat belt correctly is the safest way for pregnant drivers and their babies

'Big Beautiful Bill' puts graduate students in the red

To the editor,

Do you know any students preparing for professional graduate programs? Read on.

Trump may call it his "big, beautiful bill," but for graduate and professional students, it's anything but. Beginning July 2026, the bill eliminates Graduate PLUS loans and imposes strict borrowing caps: \$20,500 per year for master's students (lifetime cap \$100,000) and \$50,000 per year for professional programs (lifetime cap \$200,000).

Worse, the law illogically classifies many programs — like Physician Assistant (PA) — as "graduate," forcing them into the lower \$20,500 cap. Yet PA programs often cost double or triple that: the average PA program tuition is around \$98,000 for 27 months. Such a mismatch pushes PA students off the federal safety net and into higher-risk private loans.

This shift is not minor — it's a barrier. Students without wealthy families will feel the squeeze first, deepening inequity and reducing the number of future essential professionals. In many ways, these students stand in line like farmers and cattle ranchers — still waiting for promised relief.

Meanwhile, our government continues sending billions overseas — including to countries like Argentina — for projects unrelated to expanding opportunity at home. Somehow we can fund foreign initiatives, but we "can't afford" to invest in our own citizens' paths to stable, vital careers.

This is not America First. The "big, beautiful bill" doesn't just fail students — it fails the country, blocking hard-

working Americans from the education and opportunities that strengthen us all. Write lawmakers and demand true America First policies.



Minnesota DNR shares reminders about the snowmobile riding season

As snowmobile riders prepare for the upcoming riding season, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds riders of important information about safety, registration and trail conditions.

The snowmobile riding season can start as early as Dec. 1, but several conditions must be met before trails are opened, groomed and ready for travel: The ground must be frozen. Where trails cross

wetlands, 15 inches of ice are needed to support the weight of trail groomers.

Snow cover of about 12 inches must be on the

ground to allow for trail packing and grooming. Trails must be cleared of fallen trees, signs put in place and gates opened. To see if trail conditions are ready for riding, check

DNR's snow depth page (mndnr.gov/snow_depth), which also includes conditions of state parks and state trails that allow snowmobiling.

Nearly all of Minnesota's groomed snowmobile trails — 21,000 of 22,000+ miles of trails — are Grantin-Aid trails maintained by local snowmobile club volunteers, rather than the DNR. Many clubs post conditions of local trails online. To find the nearest club, visit the Minnesota United Snowmobilers Association website (mnusa.org).

SNOWMOBILE REGISTRATION AND SAFETY

While snowmobilers wait for snow and groomed trails, now is a good time to make sure registrations are current and snowmobiles are in good operating order. It's also an opportune time to review safety training and check local trail maps for route changes or new trails. Don't forget to review the 2025 snowmobile regulations (mndnr.gov/regulations/snowmobile) to refresh on state laws.

New snowmobile registrations, registration renewals and out-of-state trail stickers can be purchased in person at a deputy registrar of motor vehicles or at the DNR License Bureau in St. Paul. Renewals and out-of-state stickers can also be obtained on the DNR's licenses and vehicle registrations website (mndnr. gov/licenses).

Minnesota law requires a snowmobile safety certification for residents born after Dec. 31, 1976, but DNR recommends all riders complete a safety course. Information about safety training courses can be found on the DNR website (mndnr.gov/safety/vehicle/

Important snowmobile riding safety tips include: Be weather aware and don't ride in adverse weather conditions.

Check the DNR snow depth webpage (mndnr.gov/ snow_depth) and trail conditions before leaving home. Measure ice depth before riding on lakes and rivers.

The DNR recommends a minimum of 5 to 7 inches of new, clear ice for snowmobiles. Full ice safety guidelines are available on the DNR website (mndnr.gov/ safety/ice/thickness.html). Always stay on designated snowmobile trails. Ven-

turing off trails can result in accidents, and landowners can revoke right-of-way permission for trail riding on their property.

Don't drink alcohol and ride. Alcohol is a factor in more than 60% of fatal snowmobile accidents in Minnesota.

Always wear a quality DOT-approved helmet and




