COMPLAINT FOR ANNULMENT  
Plaintiff, Iryna Panamarova, ("Iryna") by and through her attorney, Miriam Shumway, Esq., of Nevada Family Law Group, LLC, and as for her causes of action against Defendant, Luis Torres ("Luis"), complains and alleges as follows:

1. Jurisdiction. The Plaintiff and Defendant were duly and legally married on April 27, 2021 in Las Vegas, Nevada, and ever since said date have been and now are husband and wife.  
2. Children. There are no minor children the result of this relationship, and Iryna is not pregnant at this time.  
3. Grounds. There are grounds for this Court to grant an annulment pursuant to NRS 125.290 because Iryna was already married at the time she and Luis were married. See Exhibit 1.  
4. Iryna and her husband, Andrei Kazak, immigrated to the United States from Belarus in June 2020. Soon after, the parties separated.  
5. Iryna later met Luis Torres at work as tattoo artists while living in San Diego, California. The two began dating in November 2020 and would travel around the country to attend tattoo conventions. The parties were in Las Vegas for a convention and knew that Las Vegas was known for drive-thru wedding chapels. The parties were married on that trip. Subsequent to marriage, Iryna understood the ramifications of the drive-thru wedding.

6. The parties separated in February 2022. The parties are not presently cohabitating.  
7. There is no community property to be divided by the Court. Each party should keep the property in his or her own respective name and in his or her possession and control.  
8. There are no community debts to be divided by the Court. Each party should keep the debt in his or her own respective name and in his or her possession and control.  
9. Neither party should be awarded spousal support.  
10. Iryna never changed her maiden name and therefore should retain her current name.  
11. Iryna has been required to retain the services of Miriam Shumway, Esq. in this matter, and is therefore entitled to an award of reasonable attorney's fees and costs incurred pursuant to NRS 125.040, and NRS 125.150(4).

WHEREFORE, Iryna prays for judgment against Luis as follows:  
1. That the marriage existing between Plaintiff and Defendant be declared null and void; that Plaintiff be granted an absolute Decree of Annulment; and that each of the parties be restored to their single, unmarried status;  
2. That the Court grant the relief requested in this Complaint for Annulment;  
3. For an award of reasonable attorney's fees and costs, and  
4. For such other and further relief as this Court may deem just and proper.
