# **Everybody rides for free**

North Branch council drops fee from ATV registration

The North Branch City Council put the finishing touches on its new ATV/UTV ordinance by unexpectedly backtracking from previous discussions and opting to not impose any fees for ATV owners registering their vehicles with the city.

The new ordinance, which was approved at the July 12 meeting, was needed due to the discovery of a state statute that makes the riding of ATVs on most city streets illegal unless a city enacts an ordinance allowing for it. After several months of revisions, North Branch's ordinance was approved with provisions as times of the day ATVs can be ridden, speed limits, and the required registration of each vehicle with the city to prove riders have been issued a DNR permit and the vehicle has insurance. When a person registers with the city, they will be given a sticker that is valid for three years to be placed on the ATV.

Original drafts of the ordinance included a registration fee to recoup the costs associated with staff time and supplies such as the stickers. According to Police Chief Dan Meyer, the cost for 100 permit cards and registration stickers was approximately \$300. During the discussion of the permit fees at the Aug. 8 meeting, however, the council decided they would rather eat those costs rather than pass them along to the ATV owners.

"I know a lot of residents who

# K&A Mini Golf adds laser tag to its entertainment arsenal

In 2019 K&A Mini Golf opened its doors as an inclusive place for families to spend time together in Cambridge. Located at 215 Opportunity Blvd. N., K&A's one-acre mini golf course is ADA compliant so that even those with physical limitations can enjoy playing golf with their friends.

When you walk into the K&A building you are greeted by a concession counter offering ice cream from Big Dipper Creamery (guess the mystery flavor and you could win a season pass—hint it's not Fruit Loops or Dreamsicle). Arcade games line the walls and there's a large party room to the right. Since opening, they've included mini golf, volleyball, and a water balloon game called Water Wars. Now, this hub of kid-friendly activities has added a 30-foot by 120-foot laser tag

Owner Mike Hout says they chose a laser tag gaming system based on the successful video game franchise "Call of Duty"

"I wanted the laser tag to be as family-friendly as possible," Hout said. So they passed on game systems with more realistic looking guns.

The laser weapons used by players at K&A simulate game controller actions that video gamers will be familiar with such as sounds and vibrations.

There are many different game modes to choose from like "Infected"

which is a true tag-style game where the player who is "infected" tags other players adding them to their team, a Free for All mode, and the most popular Team Death Match where two teams compete against each other for the most points.

To ensure everyone gets their moneys worth out of the experience, players who are hit during the game aren't out of the game. They can "re-spawn" — essentially given another life — so they can rejoin the game as many times as they want for the full 30 minutes of play.

Currently, the course can accommodate up to 12 players. There are four buildings on the laser tag course perfect for two teams. Hout said there are plans to expand the course next year to include a two-story tower and a larger playing field. They also hope to include large viewing screens so people can watch all the laser tag action.

Originally, Hout had hoped to open the laser tag course last June, but the chip shortages delayed the shipment of the high-tech laser guns. Now that their entire arsenal has been shipped, the grand opening of the laser tag course will be this weekend, Aug. 13 and 14.

Birthday party packages are available at K&A and laser tag can be added to the package for an additional fee. Laser tag birthday parties can even be booked for the winter months.

There are no age restrictions to play laser tag, but there is a 48-inch mini-

mum height requirement because the laser equipment is so large.

A round of laser tag is \$12.50 for 30 minutes of continuous gameplay, however during the grand opening this weekend there is a buy three games, get

one game free special.



# And they called it puppy love

ast week I casually mentioned "another" article pertaining to my desire to one day have a white German shepherd dog. Rather than keeping you all in suspense (and because quite honestly my

Then came that fateful day. After taking photos of a couple animals like normal, the employee went to the back room and when she returned, there was this beautiful all-white German shepherd on the end of the leash. It was love at first site. After taking the obligatory photos, I just couldn't help myself and I stepped forward, bent down and gave this gorgeous canine a quick pat on the head while saying "thank you for posing so nicely." Sure enough, while doing that, this dog goes and gives me a slurpee right on the face. That was the clincher.

The problem was, I was at that time renting a room in a house that already featured three humans, a yellow lab and two cats. So when I broached the subject of introducing another "roommate," it was quickly shot down as the house already being pretty crowded.

I remained determined to make sure this pup found a home somehow. Back then, no-kill shelters weren't as common, and there was no way I was going to let that dog get put down. # After a busy Summer, we're ready for school to start

hat an exciting school year we have before us! Thanks to the generous support of local voters last November, we

are entering the new school year with lower class sizes and a lot of new teachers! As a result, class sizes will be smaller at every level.

We are prepared to welcome 70 new Teachers to Cambridge-Isanti Schools this year. We hope everyone in our community will help us make them feel welcome and appreciated.

Our goal during last year's referendum was to recruit and retain

talented and caring educators. As a result, we increased starting salaries for new teachers and provided our veteran teachers with a modest raise. We avoided cuts in career and technical education electives and have rehired more than half of the teaching positions that were eliminated from 2019-2021 budget cutting. We are proud to report that 100% of the additional operating funding approved by voters is being used as promised.

We are committed to transparency and fiscal responsibility, and will continue to share updates on career and technical education enhancements plans as the year progresses.

#### A BUSY SUMMER FOR STUDENTS

After the pandemic disruptions to learning, many students have been busy this summer with reading and math tutoring and high school credit completion. Cambridge-Isanti Schools received two large state grants this year to fund more student supports, beyond our annual operating budgets.

This summer we continued to offer mental health support for all students during our summer programming and provided meals and transportation for students to participate in summer programs. More than 1,200 students participated in statewide field trips, tutoring, STEAM Camp, HS credit completion courses, credit recovery classes, and extended year services at no cost to families this summer. A \$400,000 summer programming grant secured by our Teaching and Learning and Community Education departments allowed students to keep their curiosity and learning humming most of the summer. The federal summer grant funds also helped high school students get back on track after two years of disrupted learning. More than 175 students earned hundreds of high school credits this summer, bringing many back on track for graduation and success in years to come. We appreciate all of our staff who worked over these past couple of months to provide incredible opportunities for students.

Another \$250,000 Minnesota Department of Education grant will support ongoing intervention coordination and a multi-tier system of supports for students. Our goal is that no child slips through the cracks, and we will have a coordinated effort to support teachers and principals in getting the appropriate intervention services to students if they struggle or are disengaged.

#### STRATEGIC PLANNING UNDERWAY

Over the last six weeks, we have had

a team of 40 parents, staff, students and community members involved in updating our strategic plan, which will identify our most important focus areas for the next three years. Their work is expected to go to the Board in September, and we will be reaching out for additional volunteers to engage in planning for each focus area this fall. So please watch for additional information coming forth next month.

#### **LONG-TERM FACILITIES PROJECTS**

We are completing critical infrastructure projects this summer by tapping into education funding designated explicitly for long-term facilities maintenance. We have replaced the original boilers and heating/air handling systems at Cambridge Primary, Cambridge Intermediate and Cambridge High Schools to improve indoor air quality. The old boilers were beyond their useful life. The exterior envelopes of the buildings were also repaired, filling air gaps and adding spray foam insulation to the ceiling deck. Roof repairs will continue at Cambridge Primary and Cambridge Intermediate Schools through October. Next summer, windows will be replaced and have already been ordered to avoid future price increases and supply chain delays.

LED lighting was installed in all schools and is expected to save \$75,000 annually in electric bills. All buildings are also now on the same mechanical automation systems, as we replaced older pneumatic controls and switches in our older buildings.

Wastewater treatment problems were corrected at Cambridge Middle School in compliance with EPA standards. Crews have been incredibly busy this summer, ensuring our buildings are maintained to serve students for decades to come.

#### SPACE CONSIDERATIONS AT ISANTI PRIMARY SCHOOL

We are a growing community, and the business and economic development happening in the county will impact our schools. Isanti Primary is already very close to being beyond its capacity. We are installing two portable classrooms to expand capacity this year. The District will work cooperatively with the cities and county to understand their master plans and better plan for the projected growth impacts in the future

#### SCHOOL STARTS SEPT. 6

We are so excited to welcome our students back to school this fall. We are also excited to welcome volunteers into our schools this year. If you'd like to get involved in our schools, please contact our volunteer coordinators. We are a growing community, and the more caring adults we have impacting the lives of children, the better supported our children will be.

Isanti County is a special place to live, work and raise a family. Our team in Cambridge-Isanti Schools is privileged to serve this community. If you know any new families to our region, please encourage them to contact our schools and enroll now. September 6 is just around the corner!

# Requirements for farm permits

**Question**: I have a child that will be turning 15 years old pretty soon. We farm for a living, what are some of the rules and requirements for a farm



permit to drive? **Answer**: For those who qualify, there is a restricted farm license. A person who meets the requirements of this restricted license may operate a motor vehicle only during daylight hours and only within a radius of 40 miles of the parent's or guardian's farmhouse. There are no exceptions for

driving to/from school or any other non-farm use.

Traffic crashes are a leading cause of death in Minnesota teens. Due to inexperience, distractions and risk-taking, teen drivers increasingly jeopardize their lives on the road compared with other drivers. In 2020, teens (15-19) made up just six percent of all licensed drivers. Yet, they made up 16 percent of all drivers involved in traffic crashes.

Teens also have the lowest seat belt use rate of all age groups. In 2020, only 54 percent of killed motor vehicle occupant teens (13-19) were known to be buckled up.

Parents, please be sure your child is ready to drive and help them gain experience before sending them alone.

own ATVs," said Councilmember Kelly Neider. "They pay a lot of taxes. They eat at our restaurants. And I don't want to nickel and dime them. It would be something the city would be offering as a benefit of living in the city. Even though \$30 or \$10 is not a big deal, we don't need the ten bucks.'

Councilmember Patrick Meacham agreed, adding that people would be more likely to register their ATVs if there wasn't a fee attached to it. He asked Mever if the police department's budget could afford the \$300, with Meyer responding they could.

Councilmember Kathy Blomquist was the only person to say she would prefer to have a small

"Most of our fees are to cover staff time," she said. "There's a lot of paperwork that staff has to handle for just one application. I always look at it that you have to have a buy-in rather than just give it away. So maybe like \$10, just so people have ownership.

Mayor Jim Swenson asked Meyer what the fines would be for someone violating any part of the ordinance, including not being registered. Meyer said the ordinance has a \$75 fine for the first offense, \$150 for the second, and \$300 for the third.

Neider offered that the fines could help encourage people to register, especially if there's no

"Having a penalty, for an officer to say, 'dude, it doesn't cost you anything to go apply for the darn permit. I could charge you 75 bucks right now and you could have gone to City Hall yesterday and paid nothing.' It gives you guys (the police department) leverage.'

"Right now, it's new. I think let's have no fee," said Councilmember Robert Canada.

Meyer added that since this would be on the city's fee schedule, which is approved on a yearly basis, once the city finds out how many registrations they will receive, the council could take another look at assessing a

Ultimately, the council approved imposing no fees for the three-year registration permit by a vote of 4-1, with Blomquist casting the lone nay vote.

Also at the Aug. 8 meeting, the council heard an update on the nuisance property on 9th Avenue. According to Assistant City Attorney Alissa Harrington, she was successful in getting Chisago County Social Services to at least attempt to contact the homeowner about receiving mental health aid, which would make it easier to go forward with his removal from the property, as well as the cleanup. However, the county's three attempts to contact him went without a

Given this update, Harrington said the council has five options to consider, with the options varying in the level of the cleanup and expense involved. Options included the city cleaning up as much as they can on the outside, which could be done in a shorter period of time than the previous timeline of Feb. 2023. However, she cautioned that the property owner would more than likely replace what was removed with additional junk. Additionally, trying to pass along the cleanup costs would be more difficult since the property is in

# Only small surprises arise from primary election

Primary election, there were mainly predictable results, but with a few mini surprises. Below are the unofficial results of voting:

#### **MORRIS SURVIVES**

Incumbent county commissioner Susan Morris had the most contested race, with three other candidates on the ballot. And when the smoke cleared, Morris advanced to the general election, however she wasn't the biggest vote-getter. Kristi LaRowe garnered 515 votes, with Morris earning 430. Those two will now go head-to-head in the general election. Michelle Block came in third with 274 votes and Clark Johnson only had 50

#### DUFF, MORLEY ADVANCE IN DISTRICT 1

The three-person race to replace current commissioner Dave Oslund, who is not running for re-election, in Isanti County Commissioner District 1 featured Alan Duff and Joe Morley easily advancing to the general election. Morley came in first with 638 votes, with Duff receiving 463. Gary Lantz came in a distant third with 189 votes and will not be on the Nov. 8 ballot.

#### TIGHT RACE FOR CAMBRIDGE COUNCIL

If the primary election results are any indication, the race for Cambridge Council's two open seats is going to be extremely close. With four of the five candidates advancing from the primary election to the general election, the four who advanced were separated by a mere 94 votes. Current Cambridge-Isanti School Board member Aaron Berg wound up coming in first with 511 votes — just one vote ahead of current councilmember Bob Shogren's 510. Amanda Wisner finished in third place with 461 votes and former councilmember Joe Morin came in fourth

with 417. Brandon Harapat only garnered 129 votes and will not be advancing to the general election.

#### LOVERING, SEIBERLICH EASILY ADVANCE

The two Isanti County Sheriff candidates who did the most campaigning unsurprisingly cruised to the general election. Wayne Seiberlich came in first with 3,089 votes. Current chief deputy Lisa Lovering earned 2,003 votes to come in second. Michael Longbehn was a distant third with 271 votes.

#### CHISAGO COUNTY DISTRICT 1

In the new Chisago County District that includes exclusively the city of North Branch, it looks like it will be a battle between two candidates who are currently sitting in other government seats. Current North Branch Mayor Jim Swenson received 383 votes to come in first, followed by current North Branch School Board chair Tim MacMillan with 297 votes. Richard Cedergren came in third with 143 votes and will not be advanc-

#### CHISAGO COUNTY DISTRICT 5

In the district that encompasses Rush City and Harris, plus Fish Lake, Nessel, Rushseba, and Sunrise Townships, Dan Dahlberg easily came in first, earning 631 votes. The race for second place was much tighter, with Cindy Erickson edging out John Sutcliffe 265 to 198 votes. Dahlberg and Erickson will now advance to the general election to fill the remaining term of late County Commissioner Mike Robinson, who died back on Jan. 23.

#### **VOTER TURNOUT**

Overall, the voter turnout was satisfactory for a primary election. In Isanti County, approximately 20% of the registered voters filled out a ballot. Voter turnout was slightly lower in the two Chisago County Commissioner districts, with approximately 14% of registered voters casting a ballot.

# Did somebody say 'Dairy Queen' in Isanti?

It has been said that a city in Minnesota doesn't become "official" until it has a Dairy Queen open for business. Under those conditions, the city of Isanti is on its way to becoming "official."

James Fowler, owner of the Cambridge, North Branch, Pine City, and St. Croix Falls Wisconsin Dairy Queens, has put in a Conditional Use Permit request, along with site plans to construct his fifth franchise restaurant, to be located adjacent to Highway 65 between the Allina Clinic and the Caribou Cabin. The official address of the proposed restaurant is 280 5th Ave NE.

According to Fowler, this DQ will be similar to the North Branch one in being a Grill and Chill complete with a two-lane drive-thru and a 750 squarefoot outdoor eating patio. The building itself will be 3,225 square feet and include two kitchen spaces, bathrooms, an office, and a staff breakroom.

The original layout presented to the Isanti Planning Commission had the outdoor patio situated on the eastern side of the building, facing Highway 65. However, before the Aug. 3 city council meeting, those plans were revised to have the patio be on the southwest side of the building.

"That will alleviate some of the congestion of the parking and increase the flow in the parking lot," Community Development Director Stephanie

It has long been speculated that a Dairy Queen would open in Isanti, however, based on a franchise agreement with the previous owner of the

Cambridge Dairy Queen, no additional restaurants could be opened by a different franchisee within a certain diameter of the Cambridge location. When Fowler purchased the Cambridge location a couple of years ago, that opened the door for him to consider opening in Isanti as well.

The initial plans call for the ground to be broken this fall with a tentative opening by no later than November 2023, but perhaps as early as the Spring


Following the Olympics, McCallum went on to compete for the University of Utah, where as a freshman she helped the Utes place third at the NCAA National Team Championships.

## Volunteers needed to protect Minnesota waters

#### UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA EXTENSION

Lake-loving volunteers are needed across the state of Minnesota on Saturday, Aug. 20, 2022, to participate in a search for starry stonewort—an aggressive, aquatic invasive algae that can spread easily and grows into dense mats at and below the lake's surface.

Starry Trek is an annual event where members of the public first gather at training sites to learn how to identify starry stonewort and other aquatic invasive species. The newly trained participants then branch out to local water accesses to search for signs of the invasive species.

Starry stonewort was first found in Minnesota at Lake Koronis in 2015 and has since spread to nineteen Minnesota lakes. Early detection of this species is critical for control. Starry Trek volunteers have found starry stonewort in four lakes Grand Lake in Stearns County, Wolf Lake at the Hubbard/Beltrami County border, Lake Beltrami in Beltrami County, and Carnelian Lake in Stearns County – as well as other aquatic invasive species like Eurasian watermilfoil and zebra mussels during this event.

The 2017 discovery of starry stonewort in Grand Lake led to the lake association and Minnesota Department of Natural Resources rapidly mobilizing to hand-pull the infestation. This early intervention has widely been considered a success, with starry stonewort continuing to be limited to the small area near the public access where it was initially discovered.

"This event is a terrific way for people to get outdoors, get educated about aquatic invasive species, and help protect their area lakes," said Megan Weber, Extension Educator with the University of Minnesota and Minnesota Aquatic Invasive

Species Research Center. "The information we gain at this event helps researchers and managers understand its current distribution and potentially take action if new infestations are found."

No experience or equipment is necessary to participate in Starry Trek. Expert training on monitoring protocols and starry stonewort identification will be provided onsite. This event is free, but registration is required. Children under 18 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

"We're excited to continue our partnership with the Minnesota Aquatic Invasive Species Research Center for this event," said Ariana Richardson, AIS Program Coordinator, Meeker County. "Protecting our lakes for future generations is really important to us all, and we want to make sure we're doing the best we can to prevent the introduction and spread of AIS. This event is a great opportunity to learn more about AIS in the county and spend a day outdoors!"

There are currently 26 local training sites around the state, including one at West Ripley Park in Litchfield, Minn. Volunteers will meet at their local site for training, then will be sent to nearby public water accesses to check for starry stonewort. At the end of the day, they'll return to the local training site to report their findings. For a full list of the sites and other FAQs, please visit starrytrek.org.

The Minnesota Aquatic Invasive Species Research Center works across the state to develop research-based solutions that can reduce the impacts of aquatic invasive species. School is almost in session and that means busy families may be in need of a few meal solutions that fit into their schedules — particularly items to grab on the way to school or work. Granola bars often fit the bill as nutritious options in portable packages. While store-bought granola bars are convenient, they tend to be made with nuts or oats, which are not ideal for those with food allergies or

People can easily whip up homemade granola bars that are chock-full of vitamins and minerals and can be customized to food preferences and tastes. This recipe for "Nut-Free Granola Bars" from "Eat What You Want" (Ten Speed Press) by Danielle Walker can be enhanced with raisins, chocolate chips or dried fruits.

#### Nut-Free Granola Bars Makes 12

- tablespoons warm water
- tablespoon chia seeds cup light-colored raw honey
- tablespoon virgin coconut oil
- tablespoons unsweetened sunflower seed butter
- cup raw pepitas 3/4
- cup raw sunflower seeds cup unsweetened coconut flakes
- tablespoons sesame seeds teaspoons pure vanilla ex-
- tract teaspoons ground cinnamon 2 1/2teaspoon fine sea salt
- cup chocolate chips, raisins, or dried fruit pieces

Preheat the oven to 350 F. Lightly grease the short sides of a 9- by 13inch baking dish or rimmed baking sheet with ghee or coconut oil. Line the bottom and long sides of the pan with parchment paper so the ends hang over the sides.

Whisk the warm water and chia seeds in a small bowl and set aside. Melt the honey in a small saucepan



over medium-high heat. Turn the heat to medium and simmer for 5 to 7 minutes, until a candy thermometer reads 225 F. Stir in the oil and sunflower seed butter and remove the pan from the heat. Let cool for 10 minutes.

Place the pepitas and sunflower seeds in a food processor and pulse once or twice until coarsely chopped. Add the coconut flakes, sesame seeds. vanilla, cinnamon, and salt and pulse a few more times, until coarsely chopped and incorporated. Add the chia mixture and the honey mixture and stir by hand until just combined. Immediately spread the mixture into the prepared baking dish.

Place a piece of parchment paper on top and use a flat-bottomed measuring cup to press the mixture firmly and evenly into the pan. Remove the top piece of parchment and bake for 15 minutes, until golden. Sprinkle the chocolate chips over the top. Let cool in the pan for 30 minutes, then transfer the pan to the freezer for 1 hour, until set.

Remove the pan from the freezer and lift the parchment flaps to remove the slab from the pan. Using a sharp knife, cut into 12 rectangular bars. Serve the bars chilled.

Store in an airtight container in the refrigerator for 2 weeks, or in the freezer for 6 months. Defrost in the fridge overnight.

# **Westrom murder** case goes to trial

After years of legal wrangling, the murder trial of former Cambridge businessman Jerry Westrom began on Tuesday, Aug. 9 with the selection of the jury.

Westrom was originally arrested and charged in Feb., 2019 for the 1993 stabbing murder of Jeanne Ann Childs. Westrom was arrested in part due to a DNA sample found at the crime scene being matched through a genealogy website in 2018. Needing a further DNA match, investigators trailed Westrom in January, 2019 to a hockey game, where they observed Westrom wipe his mouth with a napkin after eating a hot dog. Law enforcement recovered the napkin from a trash can to obtain the needed DNA sample.

The actual trial has been delayed numerous times due to COVID. plus a large number of submissions from Westrom's lawyer, Steven Meshbesher.

According to reports, the trial is expected to last "a couple weeks."


