Five applicants to be interviewed for council vacancy

The North Branch City Council will be choosing from five people who have thrown their hats in the ring to fill the council seat vacated by Travis Miles. Miles was recently hired as a Human Resources Generalist by the city and therefore had to resign from his seat on the council.

Patrick Meacham, Paul Schneidewind, Jim Ibinger, Phil Carlson and Brandon Torelle all submitted applications to serve out Miles' council term through the end of

Patrick Meacham, who works as an aging and disability services supervisor for nearby Pine County, has previously served on the council and both the Planning Commission and the North Branch Water & Commission. His first term on the council was also by appointment in 2020.

Meacham chose not to run for election in 2022. Shortly after his council term ended, he applied to be on the North Branch Water & Light Commission, which he was appointed to by a split vote by the council. After that commission was dissolved, he

A new chapter for Isanti

Dana's Bookstore opens its doors

The City of Isanti now joins the ranks of Minnesota towns with an independent bookstore as it welcomes Dana's Bookstore. Tucked between Johnson's Decorating and Subway, owner Dana Volkers Phillips has filled her shop with an array of books spanning multiple genres, along with puzzles, gourmet snacks, and book-themed gifts. For Volkers Phillips, choosing Isanti was a natural fit. "I feel like every town, no matter how small, needs a Dairy Queen and a bookstore," she said.

Previously, Volkers Phillips owned The Bookstore in Pine City but sold it last year to be closer to family. "I didn't want to move the bookstore. It's the only bookstore in Pine County and I felt really bad opening up a store and saying isn't this amazing? Isn't this wonderful? And then three years later taking that away. So I put it up for sale and immediately had a buyer. It was nice to be able to leave it there and then just start

She moved from approximately 700 square feet in Pine City to over 1,200 in her new space. "It was a little entry and then two rooms. It wasn't one big open area, so this is much different."

Volkers Phillips loves the extra space, "I do because I get to have more books. That's a lot of shelf space, so it'll be really fun filling that."

The shop even with the large shelves feels

open and spacious despite the size. "I think we use the area well. There's a lot of shelf space, but it doesn't feel overwhelming. It doesn't feel claustrophobic."



Voter ID isn't entirely bad, not perfect either

have been doing some checking on President Trump's executive order regarding requiring proof of citizenship for voters. When I first heard about it, my knee-jerk reaction was the same as many –

it was yet another example of government overreach and would make it unfairly difficult for many eligible voters to cast their ballots. However, after taking a closer look, that's not necessarily the

> It is true that the EO, along with the proposed SAVE Act, mandates those who are registering to vote for the first time to produce a document proving citizenship, such as a birth certificate. It also mandates that states at some point in time go over already registered voters to make sure they too are citizens. Just that part does invoke thoughts of many people, especially married women, having to jump through an insane number of hoops in order to vote.

As proof of that, I refer to the problems many had in obtaining Real IDs. My mom, for example, had to find a way to obtain from St. Louis, Missouri an official copy of her marriage license in order to verify her name change for her Real ID driver's license.

That very example, however, is why this mandate for voting won't be as difficult. When taking a look at the summary of the SAVE Act, it specifically says "... such as identification that complies with the REAL ID Act of 2005." Based on that statement, it should be logical to assume that would mean the Real IDs would in fact be an acceptable proof of U.S. citizen-

Further, a vast majority of people should already have gone through the process of obtaining a Real ID. Heck, I'm already on my second Real ID drivers license, as is my mom (she applied for her first one before I did and warned me about needing a birth certificate). Even those who have been putting off getting one are running out of time. Anyone looking at flying on a domestic flight or entering federal facilities will need to have one after May 7, 2025.

I do, however, have some real objections, at least with Trump's executive order. Most troublesome is how states are mandated to provide a voter roster to the federal government upon request. To me, that is completely unacceptable as it absolutely violates a person's right to voter privacy. It wouldn't tell the federal government who you voted for, but part of that privacy is that nobody should be compelled to reveal if they voted at all.

Additionally, it creates a breach in personal data, making it easier for people to find out where you live.

The bottom line is that there are ways to both increase election integrity, while at the same time not making it next-to-impossible for a large number of eligible voters to do so. We have the technology. Unfortunately, the current proposals fall short in terms of this, while at the same time taking regulations too

I've spent months researching and learning how I can adapt my veggie and flower gardens to "weather whiplash". These are some of the things I will try in addition to yoga, deep breathing and most likely muttering words I shouldn't

1. I will try planting 2 variet-

ies of every vegetable. (chose1 variety more adaptable to heat)

2. I will stagger my planting dates several weeks apart. (less likely to have everything washed away)

3. I will use a hill system to mound up my soil and plant at the top of the mound so excess water can funnel into the valley between the mounds with the hope that plants don't sit in standing water for days.

4. I will mulch around my plants to retain moisture and keep the plant roots cooler.

5. I will utilize drip or weeping hoses to water only the plant roots.

6. I will water more deeply and less often so my plants develop deeper root systems.

7. I will prune leaves from plants like my tomatoes, phlox and bee balm to provide better air circulation and reduce the risk of fungal disease.

8. I will give my tall flowers like asters, joe pye, and helenium a "Chelsie Chop," meaning I will prune back the tops at the end of May, so the plants remain shorter and bloom a bit later, thus reducing their need for water.

9. I will create an integrated pest management plan to help fight off disease and insects. This will utilize companion planting, trap crops, hand

picking damaging insects off the plants, possibly netting plants to keep insects away and reducing any organic or chemical pesticide use.

10. Before I bring in new plants, shrubs or trees, I will utilize the Blue Thumb plant finder web site to search for adaptable plants. No more "impulse buys" because it's on sale or pretty!

Will any or all these things help the plants in my gardens adapt to "weather whiplash"? I hope so. They all appear to be logical and reasonable modifications that can help my plants withstand the wild weather we've been seeing more frequently.

Honestly, number 10 will be the most difficult for me to accomplish. Who doesn't love a sale or buy on impulse? If I can follow this one, I'll kill less plants, feel less guilty when it happens and likely save money.

Can licensed amateur radio operators use their devices while driving



Question: I know there is a lot of discussion on distracted driving. I have a question how does the law apply to amateur radio devices? For example, trained storm spotters sometimes use handheld and vehicle mobile radios during a weather emergency.

Answer: Devices such as amateur radio, twoway radio and citizens band (CB) radio are exempt under the handsfree law. The law does not define their transmissions as electronic messages, but users are still required to operate them with due care in a safe manner.

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Talking care for older Minnesotans with University of Minnesota

As Americans live longer and healthier lives, the demand for nursing care is increasing as the capacity to provide that care is shrinking — especially in rural areas. Experts across the University of Minnesota System are working to find creative solutions to ensure Minnesotans can all thrive as we age.

Rajean Moone, faculty director of Long Term Care Administration in the College of Continuing and Professional Studies on the Twin Cities campus and Lacey Loomer, associate professor of Health Care Management in the Labovitz School of Business and Economics on the Duluth campus, answer questions about the future of long-term care

Q: Why is the demand for nursing care increasing in Minnesota?

Moone: We are in the midst of a demographic shift in our state as we all age and live longer lives. Today a 10-yearold has a 50% chance of living to at least 104 years old! This is an exciting phenomenon that poses both opportunities and challenges. Not only are we living longer, but our families are changing too, with more Minnesotans aging alone. This demographic trend is the primary driver in more people seeking skilled nursing care when they need it, now and over the next several

Loomer: The longer we live the more likely we are to be diagnosed with chronic diseases such as Alzheimer's disease and related dementias. In Minnesota, 101,000 people are currently diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease. This population is more likely to need long-term services and support. Many of us do not like to think about the fact that we are getting older and may need services in the future, but 70% of people 65 years and older will require skilled nursing at some point.

Q: Is our workforce ready to meet this

Moone: Unfortunately our senior care sector is experiencing significant challenges in both recruiting and retaining a skilled workforce. The same demographic shift showing an increase in older adults, shows a decrease in working-age Minnesotans. Economic factors such as low wages and poor benefits for nursing home employees contribute to this shortage. The workforce shortage was only exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic, which increased stress and burnout in nursing homes across

innovative solutions and programs to support the long-term care workforce.

Loomer: In addition to the patient-facing workforce, we also need to consider all facets of the business community that interact with older adults. Ensuring local businesses and communities are age-friendly is important for ensuring equitable access for our aging population. Although many students do not receive formal education on the impacts of aging, the University of Minnesota Twin Cities and Duluth campuses are age-friendly University campuses that offer new opportunities for our students to learn about ageism and the impact of aging.

Q: How does an aging demographic impact local communities?

Moone: Minnesota is and has always been a great place to live and age well. We offer robust long-term services and support designed to help people age in place and, when needed, receive high-quality long-term care in assisted living communities and nursing homes. At the same time, communities across the state experience different access to services when and where they need them. This could include waiting lists or the need to travel long distances to find a nursing home.

Loomer: Rural counties have 41% fewer nursing home beds than twenty years ago. Due to rapidly aging rural populations, the demand for nursing home beds is predicted to peak sooner in rural communities than urban communities. We need to think broadly about increasing equitable access to long-term services and support. These areas may need more resources than they currently have access to in order to support preferences for aging in place.

Q: What can Minnesotans do to prepare to age well?

Moone: We can plan. Whether it is financial, legal or personal planning, we can work to ensure we have the resources and support needed as we age. If available to us, we can purchase long-term care insurance or explore other financial programs that can help increase choice later in life. We can also explore healthcare-related preferences - wants and needs — and share these with those around us and our healthcare provider. Tools such as a healthcare directive can help a person think about and document future care needs.

Loomer: There are tools to help you with that planning including the Senior



LinkAge Line, a free statewide service that is a collaboration between the Minnesota Board on Aging and Minnesota's area agencies on aging. There are several publicly available consumer report cards such as the Minnesota Nursing Home Report Card and the Minnesota Assisted Living Report Card that aggregate information from health inspections, quality of life surveys and patient assessments to provide easy to understand information on the quality of care facilities across the state.

Q: How is the University of Minnesota working to address the needs of older adults in all parts of the state?

Moone: The University of Minnesota established one of the first long-term care administration programs in the nation back in 1972. Since then, the Twin Cities campus program expanded to include: a series for working professionals who want to advance their careers, a minor for undergraduate students, a certificate, graduate courses, the only university-affiliated assisted living course in the state, and our partnership across campuses. Our goal has not wavered in over 50 years: to educate students to lead complex healthcare organizations and improve the quality of care and life for all of us as we age.

Loomer: At the Labovitz School of Business and Economics on the Duluth campus, we have a robust healthcare management program that is certified by the Association of University Programs in Health Administration.

Our healthcare management program attracts students who go on to work in all areas of healthcare, including hospitals, clinics, insurance and government. We partner with the University's long-term care administration program so students interested in obtaining licensure to become a nursing home or assisted living administrator can complete fewer courses and graduate with both a general healthcare management bachelor's degree and a specialized focus in long-term care administration.

Rajean Moone is the faculty director for long-term care administration in the College of Continuing and Professional Studies at the University of Minnesota. He serves as the associate director of policy for the Center for Healthy Aging and Innovation in the School of Public Health. Moone's experience includes working at the Minnesota state unit on aging and area agencies on aging, and is a member of the Governor's Council on an Age-Friendly Minnesota.

Lacey Loomer is an associate professor of Health Care Management in the Department of Economics and Health Care Management, Labovitz School of Business and Economics at the University of Minnesota Duluth. Her research focuses on long-term services and supports, rural health care and Medicare payment policy. She enjoys teaching passionate undergraduates in the healthcare management program and is looking forward to watching them excel in healthcare leadership positions after

applied to be appointed to the Planning Commission, which was again approved by a split council vote.

Paul Schneidewind ran for North Branch Council in 2024, losing out to incumbent Robert Canada and newcomer Jeff Goulet. Schneidewind was endorsed by the International Brotherhood of Teamsters. He expressed support for police funding on his campaign website during budget talks last year, when council member Peter Schaps suggested outsourcing some of the department's work to the Chisago County Sher-

Jim Ibinger also ran in 2024, one of three Republi-

can-endorsed North Branch municipal candidates with near-identical websites and campaign materials. Goulet was the only winner. Ibinger resigned from the Planning Commission less than two weeks after losing the city council election. Ibinger works in "wholesale distribution, sales and operations management," per his candidacy announcement in 2024.

Phil Carlson previously served on the now-defunct North Branch Water & Light Commission.

Per a LinkedIn profile for a user based in North Branch, Brandon Torelle is a notary public, author, "student of criminology" and experienced customer service representative.

The council will conduct interviews of all five candidates on Thursday, April 3, starting at 6 p.m. Each interview is scheduled to last approximately 45 minutes long. The meeting is open to the public, however it will not be live streamed.

The council is scheduled to deliberate and vote on their preferred appointee at the April 8 council meeting. Since there are currently an even number of council members, if there is a 2-2 split in the vote, Mayor Kevin Schieber will cast a tie-breaking vote.

Isanti County takes closer look at THC sales

As the popularity of THC and other CBD and hemp-based products continues to increase, plus the introduction of legalized marijuana sales in the near future, Isanti County Public Health is starting to keep a closer eye on the businesses that sell such products. Recently, this included performing an "unscientific" audit to determine what products are being sold, how they are displayed, and whether the businesses are in compliance with state regulations, among

"It was kind of eye-opening to see what's out there and see how its marketed," said Isanti County Health Educator Greg Bockrath, who performed the audits along with other Public Health

other observations.

According to Bockrath, there are 30 businesses who have received a license to sell hemp derived products in Isanti County. Of those 30, 14 sell THC products, while the other 16 sell CBD or other hemp related products, or weren't selling anything at the moment.

Bockrath said he and his staff were very open with the businesses about what they were doing, and everyone was extremely cooperative.

"We would walk in and say, 'hey, we're with the county and we're here to do an audit,"' Bockrath said. "Every store was very helpful, more helpful than I thought they would be. I thought they would tell us to 'get out of here.' But they were very educational. We had a lot of

questions."

The audit revealed that beverages were the most popular item to sell. "We found them mainly in liquor stores and convenience stores," Bockrath said.

He added they found "easily over 50 brands," and "easily over 150 flavors."

"They were brightly colored and appealing," he said.

And these items are flying off the shelves. Bockrath reported that one store indicated they had over 160,000 sales of THC beverages in 2024 alone, and they were projecting over 200,000 sales in 2025.

He said they discovered the cost of the beverages ranged between \$15 to \$22 for a four-pack, and between \$5 to \$7 for a single can.

They found many of the edible products took the form of chocolate, candy, suckers, fruity gummies, pretzels, shots, caramels, baked goods, mints, and even mushrooms. They found over 100 different brands of edibles, featuring

"hundreds" of flavors. The cost of edibles ranged from \$12 to \$22 per package.

Bockrath said they also found vapes and vape pens, although there is only one brand of those on the market in Minnesota. Those cost around \$40. He said eight of the 14 stores that sold low dose THC products also sold the vapes and/or pens.

Finally, they found four stores selling hemp buds or flower, and three stores selling cannabis seeds.

One of the caveats they found is that the market is evolving very quickly. "What is available one month may not be the next month," he concluded.

COMPLIANCE CHECKS

One of the key points they took notice of was if the products were within the allowable limits of THC, which is no more than 0.3%. Additionally, edibles can contain up to 5 milligrams of hemp-derived THC per serving, with a maximum of 50 milligrams per package. Beverages can contain two servings up to 5 mg per serving for a total of 10 mg in each container.

Edible products, other than those intended to be consumed as a beverage, must be displayed in a locked case or behind a checkout counter. All of these products can only be sold to people 21 years-old or older.

Bockrath was proud to report that their audit didn't find any compliance violations at any of the businesses. He added if they had found a violation, they would have reported it to the state.

A place to gather The goal of Dana's Bookstore is to become what sociologist Ray Oldenburg in his 1989

book The Great Good Place dubbed a "third space" in Isanti. According to Oldenburg, these gathering spaces outside of work or home are vital for community building.

"I think a bookstore is a gathering place for the community. A place to meet your friends to talk about books to shop for books to talk to me about books. That's my goal. That this is where you just can gather. You can just gather and be with your friends and hang out."

To that end, Volkers Phillips plans to host events throughout the year including bookclubs like those she hosted in Pine City. "A lot of those members are going to come down here and do ours too. We'll do two book clubs for adults. One is just a general book club and one will focus on fantasy and then in the summertime, we'll do a book club for elementary students.'

The store will also hold book signings and carry books from local authors. "We did a lot of local author events in Pine City, and we'll do that here too. We already have an Isanti author on the shelves in our mystery

When asked if she had any concerns about moving to Isanti Volkers Phillips shakes her head. "I don't think that I had one, because as soon as we. as soon as we put something up on Facebook about that it was going to be in Isanti, it was a huge response.

The community was so eager for the store to open that while she was still stocking the shelves customers were coming in ready to buy.

"I was here working; getting things ready so, let's open the doors and see if anyone shows up, and they all showed up." Volkers Phillips laughs at the memory.

The resurgence of independent bookstores in small communities is wonderful but Volkers Phillips knows that She still has to compete with the Amazon. The Danna's Bookstore website allows its customers to purchase

any book and have it delivered to the store at no extra cost. "I made sure that we had a really great website to shop from because there are millions of books out there and we cannot stock all of them but I want to be able to be the resource that helps people to get them if they want them."

There is also the STACY VERDICK CASEJICOUNTYSTAR.COM option to start an audiobook membership from the website through Li-

bro.FM which sends a small portion to Dana's Bookstore. All of these website extras are a way to bring bookselling back to small businesses. "I think when Amazon started, they focused on selling books at a loss to knock out competition, and half the bookstores in the country closed. I think people realized if we don't support our local indie bookstores, we don't have a bookstore, and it's a nice thing."

Volker Phillips hopes that people from Isanti and the surrounding areas will drop in and see what Dana's Bookstore has to offer. She encourages people to browse the stacks and maybe learn something new. "Learning should be lifelong, that should be the goal. You should never not be curi-

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Minnesota DNR FalconCam pair preparing for eggs

A pair of peregrine falcons have returned to the nest box featured on the popular Minnesota Department of Natural Resources FalconCam (mndnr.gov/ falconcam). The webcam has captured this pair of falcons demonstrating courtship displays and preparing for eggs by creating a nest in the gravel, called a

The two adult falcons using this nest box have been identified by the Midwest Peregrine Society as the same pair who used it last year, a 12-year-old female and a 16-year-old male. This female falcon fledged from St. Cloud, Minnesota and has nested in this box since 2016. The male fledged from Gary, Indiana and this represents his second year paired with this

The FalconCam, located inside a nest box in downtown St. Paul, became the DNR's first live webcam 14 years ago. Building tenants at Sentinel Properties provide funding for the live camera stream and the building managers oversee the nest box and camera. The webcam provides an intimate view into the lives of nesting peregrine falcons each year.

"We hope the FalconCam generates appreciation of this fascinating species of special concern and helps connect Minnesotans to the incredible wildlife around them," DNR Wildlife Engagement Supervisor Jessica Ruthenberg said. "Last year, this pair successfully fledged two chicks from their nest. We hope for a chance to see them rear a family again this year.'

Peregrine falcons are a Minnesota success story. In the 1970s, they were on the brink of extinction in North America. Populations were restored with the help of Minnesota falconers, the Midwest Peregrine Society and the DNR Nongame Wildlife Program. Donations from generous Minnesotans on income tax forms helped to fund the peregrine falcon restoration project and the DNR FalconCam.

Since 1987, Minnesotans have been able to donate to the Nongame Wildlife Fund on state tax forms to fund projects that support the future of our state's rare and vulnerable wildlife.

Watch the DNR FalconCam to see the falcons engaged in courtship and maintaining their scrape, as they prepare for their nesting season. Last year, this pair laid their first egg on April 11, so an egg could potentially appear around that same time this year.

Prevent conflicts with bears this spring by being BearWise

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is encouraging homeowners to remove birdfeeders now and check their property for food sources that could attract bears. Most of the female bears with cubs and yearlings are still near their denning areas, but some full-grown bears are starting to emerge from dens to find a quick, high-calorie

"Bird feeders can become bear feeders," said Andrew Tri, DNR bear project leader. "Birdseed and suet are very attractive to bears looking for a quick, high-calorie meal. Prevention is key. Once a bear finds a food source, it will likely return."

As bears emerge from hibernation, their metabolism gradually ramps up as they transition from nibbling on plants to more substantial meals. Food and food odors attract bears, and they can

pick up a scent from more than a mile away. Home and cabin owners can prevent bears from searching for food in their yard or buildings now by using this helpful BearWise checklist (files.dnr.state.mn.us/wildlife/bear/bearwise/mn-bearwise-at-home-checklist.pdf) and following these BearWise basics (bearwise.org/six-bear-

- · Remove bird feeders when bears are active
- Secure food, garbage and

- · Never feed or approach
- · Never leave pet food outdoors
- · Clean and store grills and smokers
- Alert neighbors to bear activity

College of Veterinary Medicine researchers work with USDA to address bird flu in dairy cattle

Researchers from the University of Minnesota's College of Veterinary Medicine received a \$1.5 million cooperative agreement grant from the Department of Agriculture to work on collaborative projects aimed at understanding disease transmission and mitigating the impacts of highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) on dairy herds and the broader agricultural industry.

In February 2022, a new variant of the highly contagious virus was detected in U.S. commercial and backyard poultry, and it has since been identified in wild birds and an increasing number of mammals. There have also been 68 confirmed human cases, including one death.

The presence of bird flu in U.S. dairy cattle was first confirmed in early 2024, renewing urgent concerns for animal and farm worker health and the dairy supply chain. The virus has been far less lethal to cows than it is to poultry dairy health and production, and growing recognition of interspecies transmission, underscores the necessity for immediate scientific investigation.

to date. However, its potential to disrupt Scott Wells, a professor in the College of Veterinary Medicine, is leading the collaboration among research teams, which includes experts in virology, epidemiology, microbiology, veterinary

medicine and agricultural biosecurity.

Nine projects funded under the grant will contribute critical understanding

health and food security, and to maintain food security of the U.S. dairy

The teams' research begins as the new national milk surveillance program comes into effect and as the USDA aims to control the disease by first identifying all infected herds, enabling states to take appropriate mitigation measures. In Minnesota, the surveillance testing will be conducted at the College of Veterinary Medicine's Minnesota Veterinary Diagnostic

'Minnesota is unique in having multiple really strong livestock and poultry industries, including turkey, swine, - and HPAI affects all of and dairy them," said Wells. "The University of Minnesota is well-positioned to help address this challenge, with cutting-edge diagnostic capacities and experts working across industries to look at influenza from many different angles"

As this disease continues to pose global challenges, the findings from these projects will play a crucial role in shaping future surveillance, response and prevention strategies. The research conducted under this grant will provide key insights to inform best practices for dairy producers, veterinary professionals and policymakers alike.

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

Minnesota Starwatch for April 2025

In April the iconic stars of Orion and other famous winter constellations drop westward as they begin their annual exit from the evening sky.

In the early part of the month, look to the west at nightfall for the constellation that topped the wintry array of bright stars. This is Auriga, the charioteer, a polygon of stars set off by brilliant Capella. Capella now shines above Jupiter, the brightest object in the evening sky after the moon.

Capella consists of four stars, but only two are big and bright. They orbit each other at a distance of just 67 million milesnearly the same as Venus's distance from the sun. Capella is known for exhibiting different colors and rapid twinkling when it's near the horizon, a phenomenon caused by light from a bright object passing through Earth's atmosphere.

In the east and south, the spring stars are now moving into prominence. Foremost among them is Leo, the lion. Look

high in the south at nightfall for a backward question mark of stars called the Sickle; these stars outline the lion's head and neck. The point in the question mark is Regulus, Leo's brightest star. East of the Sickle, a triangle of stars mark the lion's hindquarters and tail.

April's full moon arrives at 7:22 p.m. Saturday, the 12th. It rises a little later, close below Spica, the only bright star in the constellation Virgo, the maiden. This is the year's most distant full moon, so if you're a habitual full moon watcher, you'll likely notice that it looks slightly smaller than usual.

The evening of Wednesday, the 30th, April closes with a young moon hanging above Jupiter. This moon will be just three days past perigee, its closest approach to Earth in a cycle, so the crescent will be on the large side.

Highway 65 construction in Ham Lake resumes April 7

Construction, orange cones and barrels...and lane restrictions will resume Monday, April 7 on Hwy 65 between 147th Ave./Andover Blvd. and Bunker Lake Blvd. in Ham Lake.

As work begins, motorists will find single lane head-to-head traffic on the northbound side of the highway early Monday morning through mid-May. Traffic will then switch to a single lane in each direction on northbound and southbound Highway 65 until the end of May. During the same time, 143rd Ave. will close and be detoured at Highway 65 until the end of May. During the closure, motorists can follow the signed detour:

·Eastbound 143rd Ave. detour: North on Highway 65 to 147th Ave., east on 147th Ave. and south on Aber-

·Westbound 143rd Ave. detour: South on Highway 65 to Bunker Lake Blvd, west on Bunker Lake Blvd and north on Lincoln Street Traffic restrictions will allow crews to complete

work on the new southbound Highway 65 bridge crossing Coon Creek just south of 147th Ave./Andover Blvd. Additional work includes guardrail installation, resurfacing, new striping and final landscaping. This year's work completes a project that began in 2023 to repair, resurface and replace bridges on more than 19 miles of Highway 65 between County Road 10 in Spring Lake Park and 237th Ave. in East Bethel.

All work will be completed, and the road fully reopened before the July 4th holiday weekend.

Drivers who regularly use Highway 65, are encouraged to use an alternate route if possible, such as I-35W or Highway 47 to avoid congestion and delays. Plan ahead by checking 511, and give yourself additional time to reach your destination.

All construction activities and traffic impacts are weather and schedule permitting and subject to change.




