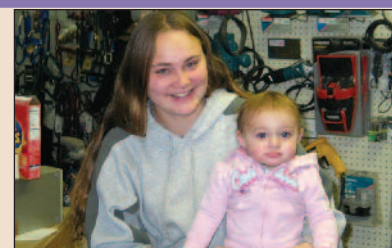

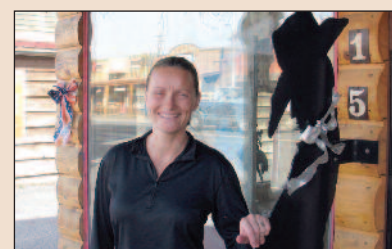

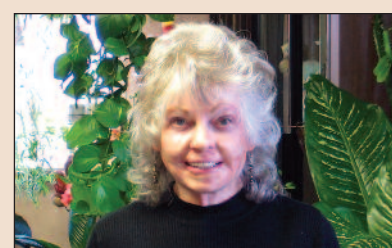

40 Reasons to Shop Local

Pictured here are 40 local businesses that have earned our support by working hard to bring to Dubois all that we need. Show your appreciation by spending your dollars locally. If these 40 local businesses, who employ our friends and neighbors, aren't enough reason, here are a few more...

Buy Local— Support Yourself.

Several studies have shown that when you buy from an independent, locally owned business significantly more of your money is used to make purchases from other local businesses and service providers— continuing to strengthen the economic base of the community. For every \$100 spent in independently owned stores, \$68 returns to the community through taxes, payroll, and other expenditures. If you spend that in a national chain, only \$43 stays here. Spend it online and nothing comes home. (Civic Economics study, 2008)

Support Community Groups.

Nonprofit organizations receive an average 250 percent more support from smaller business owners than they do from large businesses. It is our local businesses who continually donate to our groups, organizations and school for their fundraising activities.

Save Time and Money. Travel expenses and personal time add into the overall cost of items, so the money thought to have been saved by shopping out of town, really doesn't add up.

Create More Good Jobs.

Small local businesses are the largest employer nationally and in our community. The businesses on these pages employ 222 people. The jobs created allow more spending in the local economy.

Get Better Service. Local businesses hire people with a better understanding of the products they are selling and take more time to get to know customers— it's a personal touch that counts.

Keep Our Community Unique. Where we shop, where we eat and have fun— all of it makes our community home. Our one-of-a-kind businesses are an integral

part of the distinctive character of this place. Our tourism businesses also benefit. "When people go on vacation they generally seek out destinations that offer them the sense of being someplace, not just anyplace." (Richard Moe, President, National Historic Preservation Trust)

Invest in Community. Local businesses are owned by people who live in this community, are less likely to leave, and are more invested in the community's future.

Buy What You Want, Not What Someone Wants You to Buy: A marketplace of tens of

thousands of small businesses is the best way to ensure innovation and low prices over the long-term. A multitude of small businesses, each selecting products based not on a national sales plan, but on their own interests and the needs of their local customers, guarantees a much broader range of product choices.

Encourage Local Prosperity. A growing body of economic research shows that in an increasingly homogenized world, entrepreneurs and skilled workers are more likely to invest and settle in communities that preserve their one-of-a-kind businesses and distinctive character.
