Prayer Walk set for Sunday

Community leaders have planned a prayer walk for Sunday evening in Scottsboro. People will gather at 5 p.m. at the Scottsboro Boys Museum and Cultural Center, and the walk to the Jackson County Courthouse will begin at 6 p.m.

About 30 local leaders and pastors gathered at the Scottsboro Boys Museum last week to plan the prayer walk, according to Museum Director Shelia Washington. She said the Mountain Lakes Chamber of Commerce reached out to her to see what they could do to bring calmness and

peace to the community. "We all agreed prayer is what we need, not protesting," said Washington. "To me, this is going to be a historical event because it's happening on the grounds of the museum and the courthouse where the Scottsboro Boy trial took place."

Jim McCamy has announced his candidacy for mayor of Scottsboro in the upcoming municipal election.

Born and raised in Scottsboro, McCamy said his roots run deep, adding that he raised all three of children in Scottsboro, where they graduated from the public school system.

McCamy said he is no stranger to public service.

"I spent my career serving this community and congressional district," said McCamy.

He worked nine years with the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) and retired as the manager of TVA Crisis and Emergency Management. McCamy said he was responsible for the implementation of crisis and emergency preparedness plans and training for TVA non-nuclear programs.

Turning Point Pregnancy Center raises over \$28,000 in first ever 5K

Donates \$14,000 to Nourish One Child

Turning Point Pregnancy Center hosted its inaugural Loving Life Virtual 5K Walk/Run from May 9 to May 23. The event was a benefit for Turning Point

and Nourish One Child. Turning Point Executive Director Dieter Paulson said the goal of the 5K was to raise \$25,000. Paulson said it had raised \$28,681 as of June 9. Turning Point donated \$14,000 to Nourish One Child. The Nourish One Child program helps about 250 food-insecure students within the Scottsboro

City School System. At the beginning of the COVID-19 (Coronavirus) pandemic, Nourish One Child had dozens of suitcases packed full of bags stuffed with food items for the kids in need. Each bag meets all of the nutritional guidelines, including fruits and vegetables, grains, protein, and dairy.
