Dr. Michael J. O'Guin Sr. is in his third year as superintendent of schools for Wharton ISD. He is an experienced, servant leader with more than two decades' worth of experience in education improving academic achievement, enriching student experiences, building bridges among teacher and staff teams, reducing disciplinary problems and absenteeism, embracing parent and community involvement, and fostering a growth mindset for all.

Dr. O'Guin began his career in education in Fort Bend ISD in 2000 as a social studies teacher and coach. He's served in a variety of roles since then. He's served as an athletic director, campus instructional specialist, middle school assistant principal, 9th-grade academy principal, and high school principal in Nacogdoches ISD from 2016-18. During this time, he was able to increase academic achievement scores, improve student attendance, and dramatically reduce student discipline referrals.

In 2018, Dr. O'Guin was hired by Hays CISD as a deputy academic officer, which is a senior leadership position equivalent to assistant superintendent. In Hays CISD, he managed two high schools, as well as multiple middle and elementary schools. He also served as the interim chief academic officer for a time, during which he was responsible for the academic leadership of the entire 21,000-student, 25-campus school district. Under his leadership at Hays CISD, all five of the elementary campuses for which he was responsible earned distinctions. And, two of the three secondary campuses under his direction improved their A-F accountability scores. Before the 2020 COVID-19 crisis that suspended the state's accountability system, every campus under Dr. O'Guin's management was demonstrating increases in student achievement based on standardized district curriculum assessments.

"All of my varied experiences in the educational field have afforded me opportunities to have a positive effect on students. Student achievement and success in the classroom continue to be a driving force for me every day," said Dr. O'Guin. "I am a self-motivated leader who is committed to ensuring that all students have opportunities to be successful and reach their full potential. My leadership skills, ability to effectively communicate, and my ability to relate to all students are assets that have helped me achieve success as an educator."

Dr. O'Guin holds his Doctorate of Educational Administration and his Master of Educational Administration, both from Texas Southern University. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in History, with a minor in English, from Sam Houston State University – Class of 1994. He holds a registered Texas school business administrator certification (RTSBA) from the Texas Association of School Business Officials and he is credentialed by the Texas State Board for Educator Certification as a superintendent, principal, and teacher.

Dr. O'Guin is a native of Livingston, Texas where he attended elementary, primary, junior high, and high school where he graduated in 1988. Dr. O'Guin is married to his beautiful wife Janice (graduate of Sam Houston State University) they have two children, Michael Jr. (a graduate of Southern Methodist University in Dallas, TX, and currently an assistant football coach at Sam Houston State University), and Jhane (a graduate of Prairie View A&M University in Prairie View, TX, B.S. Psychology, and the University of Texas Health Science Center in Houston, a Masters of Public Health Administration) a medical student at St. Georges University and is currently completing her clinical rotations in Brooklyn, New York.

WHARTON ISD DRESS CODE

DRESS AND PERSONAL APPEARANCE

Wharton ISD has a dress and grooming code that is established to: teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruptions, avoid safety hazards, and teach respect for oneself and others. Students should be dressed and groomed in a manner that is clean, neat, that will not be a safety hazard to themselves or others, and that promotes a positive self-image and impression for both the student and those around him or her. Given that school is the student's environment where he/she will learn social skills and the proper way to interact with peers and persons of authority, students are expected to dress in a way appropriate to that environment.

The staff of the school is authorized to enforce the district's dress and grooming guidelines. Final determination of acceptable dress and grooming standards rests with the principal or his/her designee and cannot be appealed.

GENERAL

Any clothing, jewelry, accessories or tattoos with decorations, patches, lettering advertisements, etc. considered obscene or offensive are not allowed. This includes clothing, jewelry or accessories having criminal street gang identifiers, accessories that may be used as weapons, and accessories having drug, sex, tobacco, or alcoholic beverage references or designs.

SHIRTS

- Shirts must be clean and neat.
- Shirts/tops must touch the waist of pants/skirts at all times. (i.e., when in movement, when arms are extended or raised, and when in seated position, etc.)
- The length of an untucked shirt must not be longer than the tip of the longest finger with the student's hand fully extended down the side of the student's leg.
- Sleeveless, see-through, strapless tops, and low-cut blouses/tops/sweaters are not allowed.

PANTS

- Pajama bottoms, sleepwear, or lounge-wear are not allowed.
- Clothing should be appropriately sized. Baggy clothing is not allowed.
- Pants should be worn at the waist at all times. NO SAGGING AT ANY TIME. Pants that do not fit (are more than one size too big for the waist) should not be worn unless the student has a belt that keeps the pants in dress code.
- No jeans with holes of any type allowed.
- Athletic wear, which may include yoga pants, stretch leggings and fitness tights, are permissible as long as they do not reveal undergarments, do not have sections of see-through material, or are worn with a shirt that covers the posterior (approximately 6 inches below buttocks), or are not disruptive to the school environment.
- Wind pants and sweatpants are allowed.

SHORTS/DRESSES/SKIRTS

- The length of the garment must be no shorter than two inches above the knee.
- Loose fitting athletic (basketball) shorts are allowed.
- Dresses may not be halter type, sleeveless or strapless. Low cut fronts/back and/or backless dresses are not allowed.

ACCESSORIES

- Visible piercings allowed ONLY in the ears. Nose rings are NOT allowed.
- For safety reasons, it is recommended that students not wear excessively large earrings or jewelry.

HAIR

- Hair should be kept neat and clean.
- Facial hair should be neat, clean, closely trimmed and not be a distraction to the learning environment.

FOOTWEAR

- Students may not wear house shoes or shoes with cleats.
- Students are allowed to wear Croc-like/style shoes and slides. However, closed-toe shoes will be required for student safety. (For example in science labs, woodshops, welding, etc.)
- For safety reasons, students in Grades PK-5 must wear shoes with a back.

RESTRICTIONS

- Caps, hats and any form of knit cap must be removed before entering the building.
- No hats, caps, doo-rags, wave caps, bandanas or hoods worn indoors, except on campus designated days or during designated times permitted by the campus.
- Jackets with hoods may be worn; however, hoods should be removed upon entering the building.
- Sunglasses are not allowed in the building except on campus-designated days or during designated times permitted by the campus.
- No clothing that has been ripped, torn, or cut above the knee.

BACKPACKS/PURSES

- Clear backpacks ONLY (wheels are NOT allowed).
- Purses may be no larger than 12 inches x 12 inches x 6 inches; no large beach or tote bags are allowed to be used as a purse.

IDENTIFICATION BADGES

- As a way to increase security and efficiency on secondary campuses, Wharton ISD requires all students, grades 6-12, to wear Wharton ISD-issued identification (ID) at all times. The student ID provides greater efficiency for students when interacting with various district services including the library, cafeteria, and transportation.
- All secondary students are provided their first ID card at no expense. But should the ID be lost, stolen, or damaged, a replacement must be promptly purchased for \$5 from their designated school office.

WISD CÓDIGO DE VESTIMENTA

VESTIMENTA Y APARIENCIA PERSONAL

Wharton ISD tiene un código de vestimenta y arreglo personal establecido para: enseñar el arreglo personal y la higiene, prevenir interrupciones, evitar riesgos de seguridad y enseñar respeto por uno mismo y por los demás. Los estudiantes deben vestirse y arreglarse de manera limpia, ordenada, que no represente un peligro para la seguridad de ellos mismos ni de los demás, y que promueva una imagen e impresión positivas de sí mismos tanto para el estudiante como para quienes lo rodean. Dado que la escuela es el entorno del estudiante donde aprenderá habilidades sociales y la forma adecuada de interactuar con sus compañeros y personas de autoridad, se espera que los estudiantes se vistan de manera apropiada para ese entorno.

El personal de la escuela está autorizado a hacer cumplir las pautas de vestimenta y arreglo personal del distrito. La determinación final de los estándares aceptables de vestimenta y arreglo personal recae en el Director o su designada y no puede ser apelada.

GENERAL

No se permiten prendas de vestir, joyas, accesorios o tatuajes con adornos, parches, letras publicitarias, etc. que se consideren obscenos y ofensivos. Esto incluye ropa, joyas o accesorios que tengan identificadores de pandillas callejeras criminales, accesorios que puedan usarse como armas y accesorios que tengan referencias o diseños de drogas, sexo, tabaco o bebidas alcohólicas.

CAMISAS

- Las camisetas deben estar limpias y ordenadas.
- Las camisetas/tops deben tocar la cintura de los pantalones/faldas en todo momento. (es decir, cuando está en movimiento, cuando los brazos están extendidos o levantados, y cuando está sentado, etc.)
- El largo de una camiseta por fuera del pantalón no debe ser más largo que la punta del dedo más largo con la mano del estudiante completamente extendida por el costado de la pierna del estudiante.
- No se permiten blusas sin mangas, transparentes, sin tirantes y blusas/tops/suéteres escotados.

PANTALONES

- No se permiten pantalones de pijama o ropa de dormir.
- La ropa debe ser de la talla adecuada. No se permite ropa holgada (floja).
- Los pantalones deben usarse en la cintura en todo momento. NO SE PERMITIRÁN PANALONES FLOJOS QUE CUELGUEN. Los pantalones que no calzan (son más de una talla demasiado grandes para la cintura) no se deben usar a menos que el estudiante tenga un cinturón que mantenga los pantalones en el código de vestimenta.
- No se permiten pantalones con agujeros de ningún tipo.
- La ropa deportiva, que puede incluir pantalones de yoga, mallas elásticas y mallas deportivas, está permitida siempre que no revele la ropa interior, no tenga secciones de material transparente o se use con una camiseta que cubra la parte posterior (aproximadamente 6 pulgadas debajo de el trasero), o no interrumpen el ambiente escolar.
- Se permiten pantalones de viento y pantalones de chándal.

LOS SHORTS/VESTIDOS/FALDAS

- La longitud de la prenda no debe ser inferior a dos pulgadas por encima de la rodilla.
- Se permiten shorts deportivos (baloncesto) flojos.
- Los vestidos no pueden ser tipo halter, sin mangas o sin tirantes. No se permiten vestidos con escote al frente/espalda y/o sin espalda.

ACCESORIOS

- Perforaciones visibles permitidas SOLAMENTE en las orejas. NO se permiten aretes en la nariz.
- Por razones de seguridad, se recomienda que los estudiantes no usen aretes o joyas excesivamente grandes.

CABELLO

- El cabello debe mantenerse limpio y ordenado.
- El vello facial debe estar prolijo, limpio, bien recortado y no ser una distracción para el entorno de aprendizaje.

CALZADO

- Los estudiantes no pueden usar pantuflas.
- Los estudiantes pueden usar zapatos estilo Croc o sandalia deslizante. Sin embargo, se requerirán zapatos cerrados para la seguridad de los estudiantes. (Por ejemplo, en laboratorios de ciencias, talleres de carpintería, soldadura, etc.)
- Por razones de seguridad, los estudiantes en los grados PK-5 deben usar zapatos con respaldo.

RESTRICCIONES

- Las gorras, sombreros y cualquier forma de gorro tejido deben quitarse antes de ingresar al edificio.
- No se permite el uso de sombreros, gorras, trapos, gorras onduladas, pañuelos o capuchas en el interior, excepto en los días designados del campus o durante los horarios designados permitidos por el campus.
- Se pueden usar chaquetas con capucha; sin embargo, las capuchas deben quitarse al ingresar al edificio.
- No se permiten anteojos de sol en el edificio, excepto en los días designados por el campus o durante los horarios designados permitidos por el campus.
- No se permite ropa que haya sido rasgada o cortada por encima de la rodilla.

MOCHILAS/CARTERAS

- SÓLO mochilas transparentes (NO se permiten ruedas).
- Las bolsas no pueden medir más de 12 pulgadas x 12 pulgadas x 6 pulgadas; No se permite el uso de bolsos grandes de playa o de mano como cartera.

PLACAS DE IDENTIFICACIÓN

- Como una forma de aumentar la seguridad y la eficiencia en los campus secundarios, Wharton ISD requiere que todos los estudiantes, de los grados 6 a 12, usen una identificación emitida por Wharton ISD en todo momento. La identificación del estudiante brinda mayor eficiencia a los estudiantes cuando interactúan con varios servicios del distrito, incluida la biblioteca, la cafetería y el transporte.
- Todos los estudiantes de secundaria reciben su primera tarjeta de identificación sin costo alguno. Pero si la identificación se pierde, se la roban o se daña, se debe comprar una de reemplazo por \$5 en la oficina escolar designada.

ABOUT EAST BERNARD ISD

Educational Philosophy / Mission Statement

All students will develop essential academic skills and acquire a knowledge base upon which to build lifelong learning. Citizenship, economic responsibilities, heritage, logic, independence, creativity, and communication shall be emphasized. To fulfill this mission, instruction must be of the highest quality, equity must be maintained for all students, and educators shall be accountable for results.

The Community

East Bernard, an early Texas settlement, is primarily a residential area located in the fertile farm area approximately 45 miles southwest of Houston. This location provides the best of two worlds; the pleasure of small community living and close proximity to the cities of Houston, Rosenberg, and Wharton. In East Bernard, most simple pleasures are a reality. The good life means a quality education, low crime rate, and great community spirit.

The Schools

East Bernard ISD has one elementary school (PK-4), one junior high school (5-8), and one high school (9-12) with an average daily attendance of 925 students. The average class size is 18 in the elementary grades and 15-20 in the secondary grades. There are 182 square miles in our district.



East Bernard Independent School District 2023-2024 Dress Code

Dress and Grooming (All Grade Levels)

The district's dress code teaches grooming and hygiene, prevents disruption, minimizes safety hazards, and maintains a positive learning climate. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:

1. Shorts, skirts, dress length may not: Exceed 3" above the knee in grades 9-12

Exceed 3" above the knee in grades 5-8 (May be 5" above the knee for shorts only)

Grades Pk-4: should wear comfortable clothing of reasonable length

2. Sweatpants and joggers may not be worn as a substitute for regular daily clothing. Tailored, fitted (non-cotton) athletic pants are permissible. Frayed or unhemmed clothing will not be permitted. No clothing with holes is permitted. Dickie pants are not allowed. Pants are not to be worn below the natural waist line. Males must have their shirts tucked in.

3. Leggings may not be worn as stand-alone pants but may be worn under dresses, skirts, shorts, etc. IF the dress, skirt, shorts, etc. meets all other dress code criteria including length.

4. Fabrics must be suitable for everyday wear-- no slinky or see-through fabrics. Proper undergarments must be worn at all times.

5. No excessively tight tops or shorts, including bicycle shorts may be worn.

6. Tank tops, low cut tops, strapless tops, lace-up bodices, spaghetti straps, or short shirts which allow the midriff to be seen are not allowed. Visible cleavage is not permissible. Shirts must be closed (buttoned) to within two buttons of the collar or to an equivalent position. Males: Additionally, sleeveless shirts are not allowed.

7. No slippers, shower shoes, or house-shoes may be worn.

8. Males: Hair may not extend below the eyebrows (this includes side swept bangs), below the tops of the ears, or below a conventional standup shirt collar. Tall hairstyles must not be higher than 2". Braided hair or twisted strands must meet length and height requirements. No mullets, mohawks, fohawks, buns, or ponytails.

9. No extremes in hairstyles. Examples: psychedelic or unnatural colors; obvious contrast of two colors, shaved-in lines, letters or designs. Males: Additionally, hair cannot be bleached or dyed.

10. Students will be clean shaven, wear no mustache/beard/or goatee, and sideburns cannot extend below the earlobe. Eyebrows may not be notched or shaved.

11. Males: Earring(s) of any type are not permitted in school or at school functions.

Females: Earrings may be worn "ONLY" on the earlobe (bottom of ear)

with no more than two piercings.

Nose, face, tongue, or any other piercing other than ears are not allowed for any student.

12. No apparel worn may have wording or logos that suggest drugs, sex, alcohol or vulgarity.

13. Gang-related apparel is prohibited, including but not limited to:

- hats or headgear
- chains
- hair nets or bandannas
- monikers or other gang markings
- spiked rings, bracelets, or long earrings
- jewelry with gang symbols
- dropped suspenders
- no flannel shirt may be worn as a jacket

*any combination of clothing that law enforcement agencies currently consider gang-related.

14. No caps, hats, headbands or bandanas will be worn unless approved by the campus principal on spirit days. On spirit days, caps will be worn with the bill facing forward and are not allowed to be worn inside the building.

15. No exposed tattoos or brands.

16. Clothing must be comparable to the size of the student. No duster type, trench coats, excessively large jackets or excessively large clothing will be permitted. Jackets with hoods may be worn but the hood must not be on inside the building.

17. Teeth grills may not be worn.

18. Only prescription contacts and sunglasses for vision improvement are permissible.

NOTE FOR ALL: The principal has the right of interpretation of these rules and to impose regulations other than those listed here. Any apparel or hairstyle that may reasonably be expected to cause disruption of or interfere with normal school operations shall be prohibited. These regulations are in effect at school and school related activities and on field trips unless otherwise approved by the campus Principal.

The dress code is in effect immediately and continuously while using school transportation, upon arrival to any EBISD campus, and is in effect at every school sponsored activity or any other site where EBISD is in attendance or participating. The principal has the right of interpretation of these rules and to impose regulations other than those listed here.

If the principal determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the school's dress code, the student will be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school. If not corrected, the student may be assigned to in-school suspension for the remainder of the day, until the problem is corrected, or until a parent or designee brings an acceptable change of clothing to the school. Repeated offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.

Message from President Betty McCrohan

Wharton County Junior College's Free College initiative offers full tuition and fees scholarships to qualified students majoring in certain healthcare professions programs at the college. Students must be registered in a minimum of six semester credit hours and enrolled in the Licensed Vocational Nursing, Health Information Technology, Emergency Medical Services or Human Services programs at WCJC. The purpose is to encourage persistence and completion of certificates and degrees leading to employment in high-need allied health occupations.

The simplicity of the Free College initiative is that it not only pays for qualified students' tuition and fees for the Fall 2023 and Spring 2024 semesters, it also offers a seamless process for being considered. Students do not have to complete a scholarship application because, one to two weeks after they register, the scholarship will be applied to their accounts.

Students must meet the following criteria in order to be considered for a scholarship:

- Reside in one of the following areas: Aransas County, Bee County, Calhoun County, Colorado County, Dewitt County, Goliad County, Gonzales County, Jackson County, Lavaca County, Matagorda County, Refugio County, Victoria County, Waller County, Wharton County and the Needville Independent School District.

- Be enrolled in a minimum of six semester credit hours in an eligible program through the term census date.

- Have a 2023-2024 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on file with WCJC.

Students majoring in the approved programs are encouraged to check their WCJC accounts within two weeks after registering for the term. Contact the WCJC Financial Aid department at finaid@wcjc.edu for more information or visit wcjc.edu.
