

2026 Funded Partnership Grant Awards & Summaries

In the 2025 Indiana Legislative Session, funding for Health First Indiana was reduced by nearly 75% for local health departments beginning in January 2026. Therefore, the Health First Allen County external grant program underwent several changes to accommodate the funding reductions yet still attempt to meet as many Core Public Health Services as required under Indiana statutes. The information below shows the organizations with which we will engage in funded programming partnerships in 2026.

\$50,000

Core Public Health Service Area:

Maternal & Child Health

Project Summary:

Providing maternal & child health services such as screenings and referrals (Edinburgh post-maternal mental health screening, for example), as well as continuation of client car seat installation and safety check services.

Amani Family Services

\$75,000

Core Public Health Service Area:

Trauma & Injury Prevention

Project Summary:

Continuation of staffing and programming serving the increasing immigrant and refugee populations of Allen County to allow provision of assessments, education and facilitation of support groups with a focus on substance use disorder prevention.

Community Transportation Network, Inc.

\$75,000

Core Public Health Service Area:

Access & Referrals to Clinical Care

Project Summary:

Continued support for specialized transportation for low-income seniors and people with disabilities, specifically helping those who are not aligned with another agency.

Harold W. McMillen Center for Health Education

\$105,000

Core Public Health Service Area:

Chronic Disease Prevention, School & Student Health

Project Summary:

Providing vital, effective preventive school health education programs to over 10,000 Allen County students with a focus on nutrition and vaping prevention.

Project Summary:

Continuation of programming focusing on the well-being of mothers and children in vulnerable populations, addressing and improving factors that influence infant mortality and birth outcomes (in-home care, access to maternal child health services, etc.).

Project Summary:

Continued provision of the ECHO (Education Creates Hope and Opportunity) program, which assists pregnant and parenting teens and young adults to achieve their high school education, which is a key component to addressing the social determinants of health, while also achieving health outcomes for themselves and their children.

School & Student Health

Project Summary:

Expansion of school-based health care for Allen County students, including on-site dental care and virtual medical visits.

Chronic Disease Prevention

Project Summary:

Expansion and continuation of FitKids360 programming, which is an eight-week well-being program designed to empower children and their families by instilling lifelong, healthy behaviors in a supportive and engaging environment.

Project Summary:

Project Summary:

Continuation and expansion of community immunization clinics, outreach immunization clinics, school-based immunization clinics and overall vaccination education.

Project Summary #2:

Expansion of the evidence-based "EnhanceFitness" program to its facilities and partner senior living centers, focusing on reducing fall risks among older adults.
