

I. Purpose

The establishment and maintenance of correct in-custody property handling procedures are very important to the successful prosecution of cases in the judicial system and for safeguarding the property of innocent victims. The collection, preservation, laboratory analysis, chain of evidence and method of storage are equally important. This policy is intended to give specific guidelines for the correct disposition of evidence and in-custody property being held and stored by the Nebraska State Patrol. It is also the intent to establish procedures to allow for temporary storage at each duty station, a permanent storage location at each remote area office, and to establish inspection procedures.

II. Policy

It is the policy of the Nebraska State Patrol that all in-custody property will be safeguarded and accounted for according to the following procedures.
