Starkweather And Caril Fugate Caught After 10th Killing

The Lincoln area's three-day reign of terror that saw nine persons wantonly slain in an almost unbelievable chain of events ended at 3:30 Wednesday afternoon when 19-year-old Charles Starkweather was captured by two Wyoming lawmen.

'Family Dead Nearly Week'

Girl Friend Implicates Starkweather In Colvert Murder Case

DOUGLAS, Wyo.—The Bartlett family lay dead for almost a week as a group of teenage boys, led by Charles Starkweather, plotted to rob a Lincoln bank.

That's what the semi-hysterical Caril Fugate told Deputy Sheriff Carl Pagano of Natrona County, Wyo., just after she and Starkweather were captured here. She said her family was killed a week ago Tuesday.
