



EPA Begins Review of Hunt's Disposal Landfill Superfund Site

Caledonia, Wisconsin

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is conducting a five-year review of the Hunt's Disposal Landfill Superfund site at County Line and Foley Roads, Caledonia. The Superfund law requires regular checkups of sites that have been cleaned up—with waste managed on-site—to make sure the cleanup continues to protect people and the environment. This is the sixth five-year review of this site.

To clean contaminated soil and groundwater at the former landfill, EPA installed a groundwater pump-and-treat system and monitoring wells and an active landfill gas management system to remove contamination. EPA also installed multi-layered cap and slurry wall as underground protective barriers to prevent contamination from leaching offsite in untreated groundwater. EPA also installed fencing and implemented institutional controls to restrict use of the land.
