Q I moved into a newer condo and have found a couple of outlets that don't work. One is on a kitchen wall, and one is on a bedroom wall. I am not completely settled yet, but what needs to be done for these outlets that I definitely plan on using?

A I have a couple of suggestions Nicole. First you could start by purchasing a receptacle tester. They are inexpensive, can be found at any hardware store, and would be a very worthwhile purchase. Use that tester and plug it into those outlets, and all outlets while you're at it. There is a series of lights that will light up to show if things are wired correctly. Check the series of lights located right on that tester to decode any issues. Then call us to look at properly fixing this, or any other issue for you, and do NOT just use outlet extenders or power strips long term. We would be happy to come out and help you with this Nicole.
