After being at a call following a house fire last week, our technicians suggested that it would be a great idea to share some electrical safety reminders to follow during these cold winter months in this column.

- - Use portable heaters safely - no extension cords, keep away from flammable items and do NOT leave them unattended - - Monitor Usage - Don't overload circuits - use newer power strips sparingly and distribute devices across different

circuits. - - Increase Humidity - Use a humidifier to reduce static electricity

- - Test Alarms - Replace batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors

- - Call a PRO - Call and have us come out and address buzzing, sparking, or consistently tripping breakers immediately to prevent fires

- - Check Exterior Outlets - Ensure covers are intact and watertight; use GFCI outlets where needed

- - Inspect and Upgrade - Have your electrical panel and wiring inspected, especially in older homes, and consider an upgrade if overloaded or concerns are found.

-- Inspect Extension Cords and Power Strips for any visible damage and never connect multiple extension cords or power strips.

- - Make sure power strips or extension cords are not covered by, close to, or rubbing against items. If you are not using
