

# Supper Club to Open at 1201 Douglas Ave.

Camelot Supper Club will be opened at 1201 Douglas Ave., announced Leo C. Perfetto, who owns the building.

Perfetto said the restaurant would be operated by his son, Lawrence, 24.

The building, erected in 1901 by Louis Musil, most recently housed a night club called the Lighthouse, which closed in January.

Extensive redecorating is in progress. Perfetto said plans call for the restaurant to open about mid-May.

Interior walls have been covered with flocked wallpaper, new ceilings have been installed, the main bar area is being redone, stucco covering the columns and arches that separate the interior sections

have been repainted, and a stone fireplace built in what will be the main dining area.

Perfetto said the three dining areas will have seating for a total of about 135, with the main bar area seating about 70 and the back bar 6.

Perfetto has owned the building since 1959.

He operated a restaurant in it for about eight years, eventually leasing it out to others, who opened the Lighthouse early in 1968.

In its early years, the structure housed a well-known night spot called Little Bohemia, and later Club Douglas.

Lawrence Perfetto said hopes are that as Camelot, the restaurant will have some of the flavor the place did when it was Little Bohemia.
