EXTENSION OF COVID-19 EMERGENCY DECLARATION

Whereas, the United States of America and the State of Wisconsin have been affected by the worldwide pandemic of the novel coronavirus disease (COVID-19), which is a dangerous respiratory illness that can spread from person to person; and

Whereas, on March 18, 2020, and April 9, 2020, the Mayor of the City of Racine issued proclamations declaring a state of emergency to exist in the City of Racine, which proclamations were ratified by the Common Council on April 20, 2020, and which proclaimed state of emergency expires at 11:59 PM, May 25, 2020, unless extended or otherwise modified by the Common Council of the City of Racine; and

Whereas, the COVID-19 pandemic and its prevalence in the southeastern Wisconsin region and throughout the United States continues to constitute a public health emergency; and

Whereas, as of May 15, 2020, at 10:00 AM, the City of Racine had 629 positive COVID-19 cases; and

Whereas, as of May 15, 2020, Racine County had the third-highest number of positive COVID-19 cases, and the third-highest per capita rate of positive COVID-19 cases in the State of Wisconsin; and

Now therefore, it is hereby Resolved that the Common Council of the City of Racine does declare and proclaim as follows:

There exists a continuing public health emergency as contemplated by in Wisconsin Statutes sections 323.11 and 323.14(4) and Racine Ordinance section 34-1.

The now-existing declaration of a state of emergency is extended and shall expire at 11:59 PM, July 31, 2020, unless extended or otherwise modified by the Common Council of the City of Racine.

In all other respects, March 18, 2020, and April 9, 2020, declarations of emergency, as ratified by the Common Council, continue in full force and effect without modification or abridgment.

Nothing in this Resolution shall be deemed or interpreted to impair or abridge the duties, power, and authority of the Public Health Administrator to perform her duties as set forth in Wisconsin law or Racine ordinance.
