Q Woke up this morning to find that my refrigerator isn't working. I already checked the circuit breaker but it wasn't tripped. What is going on? Moved everything I could to a frig in the basement, but need some help asap.

A Hello. This is the worst appliance to have go out for sure. If you have an older home (built before 1981), chances are you might have TWO circuits for your kitchen which give power to your appliances. If one hasn't tripped, the other one most likely has. Once you have checked both of them, this could be a wiring issue and an electrician will be needed. If your home was built after 1981, it is more likely that one of the GFCI outlets has tripped. Check your outlets for any "reset" button that is no longer depressed. If you press it back into place and don't hear a click and there is still no power, there is likely an issue with the circuit which also means you will need an electrician.
