Wisconsin Baseball Nation: Tuesday, October 10th is the 60th anniversary of the Milwaukee Braves' 1957 World Series victory over the New York Yankees.

Braves' broadcaster Earl Gillespie called him "Lanky Lew Burdette from Nitro, West Virginia". Opposing batters accused him of throwing a spitball. Roy Campanella once charged the mound with bat in hand after Lew struck him out. Harvey Haddix pitched 12 perfect innings against him, only to lose to Lew 1 to 0 in the 13th inning.

In game #2 of the 1957 World Series at Yankee Stadium, Lew beat the Yankees 4 to 2 by pitching shutout ball for the final 6 1/3 innings. In game #5, Lew beat the Yankees' ace pitcher Whitey Ford 1 to 0, and on October 10th, 1957, Lew won game #7 at Yankee Stadium by a score of 5 to 0, to clinch the World Series for the Braves.

That's 3 complete game victories and 24 1/3 consecutive scoreless innings folks, against a power- hitting Yankee team that featured Mantle, Berra, Bauer, Skowron, Howard, McDougald, Richardson and Kubek.

Ken Burns, in his PBS series "Baseball", failed to mention anything about Lew Burdette's 3 victories over the Yankees, but Wisconsin Baseball Nation will always remember Lew's 1957 World Series masterpiece

And, we say "hats off" to Lew's teammates: Hank Aaron who hit 393 with 11 hits and 3 home runs; and Eddie Mathews whose home run won game #4 for Braves' pitcher Warren Spahn, and who backhanded Skowron's hard hit ball and stepped on 3rd base for the final out of game #7.
