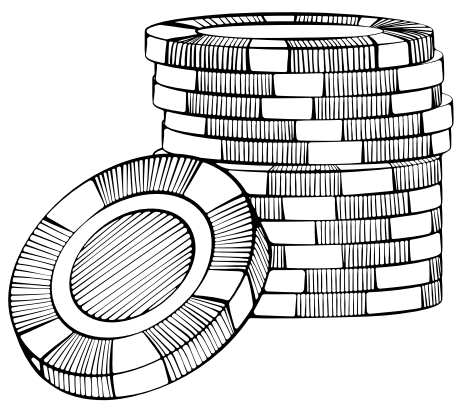

1984

Horserace Betting & Lottery

Voters legalized these two ballot questions, which passed by wide margins: 60% (horserace) and 70% (lottery)

Voters approved casino gambling, but the State Supreme Court struck it down. A change to the *constitution* was needed, not just the state statute (law).

Riverboat Casinos Legalized

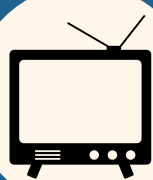
Based in Oklahoma but with roots in Missouri, the Osage tribe expressed interest in building a casino at the Lake. Nothing came of it..

The popular show "Ozark" released with characters trying to get a riverboat casino business going on the Lake. The process isn't exactly accurate, but close.



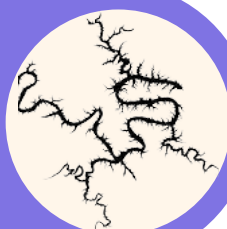
2017

A local group of investors announced they had plans to change the constitution so they could build a casino in the Lake area.

2020

Osage River Gaming Plans To Build



COVID killed the bill to allow a casino on the Osage River. Outgoing State Rep. Rocky Miller had initially filed it.

2021

Osage Nation Plans To Build



Osage Nation acquired land at Lake of the Ozarks and began planning a casino. The Tribe will need to go through federal processes and get the governor's clearance.

"Excursion gambling boat" was redefined by the Mo. legislature as a building, 1,500ft or less from the edge of a river that has some tanks of water inside.



2021

"Riverboat" Thing Finally Gets Sunk

Second attempt at a constitution amendment failed in 2022, and again a year later. The ORGC then decided to take it to the people for a citizen's initiative petition.
