# Author Philip Lee Williams to speak at Georgia Writers Hall of Fame

Philip Lee Williams, noted author and a member of the Georgia Writers Hall of Fame, will speak live at the Georgia Writers Museum Tuesday, Aug. 3, at 7 p.m. as part of the Meet the Author series.

Admission is free.

Williams will talk about his writing career and his 2020 novel, "Far Beyond the Gates," as well as his upcoming collection of eco-poetry, "Eden's Last Horizon." He is the author of 20 published books, including 13 novels, three volumes of poetry and four works of creative nonfiction.

He retired in 2010 as a science writer and teacher of creative writing at the University of Georgia. In addition to his work in literature, Williams is a musician and composer of 20 symphonies and many concerti, an award-winning



documentary filmmaker, a painter, and an occasional sculptor.

In 2007 he received the Georgia Governor's Award in the Humanities and has been named Georgia Author of the Year four times in three different categories. He is also a winner of the Townsend Prize for Fiction and the Michael

Shaara Prize for the best Civil War novel published in the U.S. in 2004, an award he received in Boston. His book "The Flower Seeker: An Epic Poem of William Bartram" was named National Book of the Year by Books & Culture magazine in 2010.

A number of his books have been optioned for film by such people as producer Richard Zanuck, director Ron Howard, and actress Meg Ryan. Williams was hired by MGM to write the screenplay for a movie adaptation of one of his novels, "All the Western Stars." A film has not yet been made of the book.

In "Far Beyond the Gates," Lucy McKay, a high school English teacher from Mississippi, is estranged from her divorced parents. Her father, who is ill with multiple sclerosis, invites Lucy to spend her summer vacation with him at his second home in

an expensive gated community. Shortly after she arrives, he reveals he fathered a child born out of wedlock in college. Her life changes when she begins to date a landscape contractor working in the neighborhood. As the days pass, Lucy realizes how desperately she needs the anchor of lasting love to understand what has happened to her. Told in a double journal form by Lucy and her father, "Far Beyond the Gates" is a story of love's cost and necessity.

Former Poet Laureate of Georgia, Judson Mitcham said of the novel, "Williams is a master storyteller. Here, writing with characteristic style and humor, he summons the presiding genius of Faulkner and delivers a moving story of the human heart in conflict with itself. This is a welcome addition to this writer's remarkable body of work."

# Our ever-changing world

I think we will all agree that we are living in a world that is changing faster than most people want. Whether we agree with the changes or not we will always have changes in our lives.

This also applies in the world of real estate. We have seen many changes in the Lake Oconee area for the past 26 years. We have not only seen the area change and grow but how selling Real Estate has changed. Here is one Change in Real Estate that is a significant change: In most U.S. states and Canadian provinces, until the 1990s, buyers who worked with an agent of a real estate broker in finding a house were customers of the brokerage, since, by most common law of most states at the time, the broker represented only sellers. It is only since the early 1990s that states passed statute law to create buyers' agency.

Buyer agency can exist exclusively (where a brokerage firm chooses to only represent buyers and never sellers, as an exclusive buyer agent) or, in a full-service company, by offering buyer agency to buyers who become



clients. Buyers would have to agree to some form of dual agency in the event that they wished to buy a home which that company has listed for sale and for which it represents the seller.

Today, if the buyer is working with a broker other than the brokerage listing the property, he or she may choose to enter into a buyer-brokerage agreement to be represented. In some cases where dual agency is permitted by law, even the listing broker may represent the buyer. If the buyer does not enter into agreement, he/she remains a customer of the broker who is then the sub-agent of seller's broker. Today, many brokerage firms do not allow

their agents to be a dual agent or a sub-agent.

This is one change in real estate law that we favor. It protects the buyer in knowing that they are a client of the broker and can have the agent relay to them any pertinent information that would be of importance to them throughout the buying process. Signing an Exclusive Buyers Agency Agreement will give you, as a buyer, confidence that you will have representation as a client not a customer.

This is only one of the many changes that we have seen in real estate. There will always be more laws written to protect buyers and sellers — a good

thing!

Another big change that has completely brought about simplicity in writing contracts and getting signatures is through Doc u Sign or Authentisign. The signatures are obtained through email. This procedure may be the norm to the computer generation, but to many this is not the way they would sign a contract. Yes, this is a real change brought to the real estate industry and other businesses. It has made it a lot easier for us as Realtors, but we should realize that to generations of the past this is all new to them. Our world needs patience and understanding not only to the changes in real estate but accepting the vast changes in our ever-changing world.

## Lake Oconee Parkway maintenance affecting travel July 20

— Planned bridge repairs at Lake Oconee will delay

State Route 44 traffic Tuesday, July 20 during daytime hours.

Georgia DOT concrete maintenance crews, weather permitting, will work from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., repairing bridge spalling at the Putnam and Greene County line area north of Clack Circle. Plans are a one-day operation, but personnel may return the following day.

This routine but necessary activity is required to keep 16,000 average daily

vehicles safe when passing through the lake area. GDOT crews work during the day and will mitigate delays as much as possible. But citizens should expect a slow-go with crews present.

Motorists traveling through a work zone should expect the unexpected. It can make the difference between life and death. Pay attention, slow down and watch for workers. GDOT is committed to keeping workers and travelers safe.

## St. Mary's resumes Life After Loss support group

The loss of a loved one can be an emotional roller coaster, filled with an intense and sometimes debilitating mix of emotions — especially in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic. For adults grieving the loss of a loved one through death, St. Mary's Hospital is resuming Life After Loss, a free bereavement and grief support group.

The group's first meeting will be Thursday, Aug. 5, from 5:45 to 6:45 p.m. at St. Mary's Hospital on Baxter Street. The group will then continue to meet at the same time on the first and third Thursdays of each month.

Life After Loss is designed to help those who are experiencing the loss of a loved one work through their experience, express their feelings, and find support among others facing a similar loss. People can attend as many sessions as they wish and no registration is required. At each meeting, facilitator Rev. Jessica Chicken will help pose thoughtful questions and guide discussion of healthy and meaningful ways to cope with grief.

Rev. Chicken, the manager of spiritual care at St. Mary's, holds master's degrees in divinity and thanatology, a field focused specifically on grief and loss. She has more than eight years of experience as a hospital chaplain, including extensive work with grieving families. Rev. Chicken is also a certified therapy dog handler who often works with her trained Schnauzer, Ollie.

"Before the pandemic struck, we were able to help many people cope with their grief through this group," Rev. Chicken said. "Now that COVID transmission numbers have declined and many people are vaccinated, we are able to resume Life After Loss. It's particularly needed now because so many people lost loved ones over the past year without the aid of normal means of coping. We are here to help any adult learn healthy and effective ways to cope with the loss of someone they love."

Life After Loss is free and open to any adult who would like to attend. Meetings are held in the Lobby Conference Room of St. Mary's Hospital, 1230 Baxter St., Athens. The meeting room is easily accessible from the hospital's parking deck and Registration Entrance directly across from the parking deck's lower access point. Participants will need to complete St. Mary's COVID-19 screening process when they enter the building and wear a mask while in the facility.




