## Beaver Dam Unified School District Board of Education Proceedings January 13, 2020

The regular meeting of the Beaver Dam Unified School District Board of Education was held on the above date at the Educational Service Center. President, Bev Beal-Loeck, called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Board members present: Bev Beal-Loeck, Marge Jorgensen, John Kraus, Jr., Laura Lerwick, Lisa Panzer, Chad Prieve, Gary Spielman, and Joanne Tyjeski. Board members absent: Tony Klatt.

A group of Lincoln Elementary School students led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Spielman moved, Jorgensen seconded, to approve the minutes from the regular meeting on December 9, 2019, as presented.

The motion was adopted by unanimous vote.

Ms. Beal-Loeck welcomed visitors.

Jorgensen moved, Kraus seconded, to adopt the agenda as presented.

The motion was adopted by unanimous vote.

Ms. Bates, Lincoln Elementary School Principal, presented the School of the Month presentation for Lincoln Elementary School. She shared the school theme for the year, reviewed the school goals and activities relating to the School Success Plan, and highlighted school and PTO activities. Student Council representatives reported on their activities and Random Acts of Kindness efforts.

Ms. Pivonka, Director of Student Services, presented a recommendation for space availability for new open enrollment students for the 2020-21 school year. She reviewed the space availability for regular education and explained there are no spaces available for grades 10-12 due to large class sizes and enrollment projections. She reported there is no space available for new open enrollment special education students due to caseload and enrollment projections.

Kraus moved, Prieve seconded, to adopt the space availability for new open enrollment applicants for the 2020-2021 school year as presented.

The motion was adopted by unanimous vote.

Mr. DiStefano, Superintendent, reported on the status of the district strategic actions (DSAs) relating to the Strategic Plan. He reviewed the strategic plan structure and explained the DSAs support the School Success Plans and extends district-wide. He reviewed each DSA and the progress on each action.

Board members thanked Lincoln for their presentation and hosting the board coffee chat along with their PTO's Donuts with Dudes event. They recognized Mrs. Sether, Lincoln Elementary Grade 3 Teacher, for being honored as the Teacher of the Month by the Beaver Dam Area Community Foundation, and all of the crossing guards for their service. They recognized students for their increased level of activity in the community during the holidays and thanked the teachers and parents for their involvement.

Mr. DiStefano recognized teachers and students as they go through testing and end the first semester. He commended the Middle School and High School staffs for their work on the 8th grade transition process. He acknowledged the Teacher of the Month Program and thanked Ms. Bates, Lincoln Elementary Principal, and Ms. Klavitter, Jefferson Elementary Principal, for coordinating the award events at their schools. He recognized the staffs at South Beaver Dam and Jefferson Elementary schools for their conversations as they plan for the transition to become one school.

Ms. Jorgensen, Operations Committee Chairperson, reported that the committee did not meet in December. The next committee meeting is scheduled for January 27.

Ms. Lerwick, Teaching and Learning Committee Chairperson, reported the committee did not meet in December. The next committee meeting is scheduled for January 20.

Mr. Prieve requested feedback or comments on the WASB 2020 resolutions. The board authorized him to vote his conscience as he represents the board at the Delegate Assembly.

Mr. Nault, Director of Human Resources, recognized the retiring staff and thanked them for their service.

Panzer moved, Spielman seconded, to approve the following retirements: Jane Loiz-zo-Library/Media Specialist-High School (Retirement effective end of the 2019-20 school year); Darci Mosher-Speech/Language Pathologist-Washington Elementary School (Retirement effective end of the 2019-20 school year); and Virginia Hanks-Special Education Teacher-Middle School (Retirement effective end of the 2019-20 school year).

The motion was adopted by unanimous vote.

Panzer moved, Kraus seconded, to approve the following leave of absence: Anna Brady-Phy. Ed. Teacher-Middle School (Medical Leave 4/30/20-end of the 2019-20 school year).

The motion was adopted by unanimous vote.

Panzer moved, Jorgensen seconded, to approve the following appointments: Emily Loberger-Grade 6 ELA Teacher-Middle School (LTE 1/13/20-6/2/20) and Mihal McClelland-Grade 2 Teacher-Wilson Elementary School (LTE 1/15/20-6/2/20).
