A default judgment would result in the loss of important legal rights you currently possess, including without limitation your right to have a jury determine whether there is a basis for grounds, to call witnesses, to compel the appearance of witnesses, and to cross-examine the witnesses presented by any other party. The Court may also acquire jurisdiction to issue orders regarding the placement, care and custody of said child as well as orders regulating the conduct of the parents of said child as such conduct relates to the best interest of the child, including, but not limited to, the frequency and nature of the parents' contact with the child. Orders of the Court may be enforced as provided by law.
