GEORGE C. JOY IS KILLED IN HOIST

Contractor Caught In Lift Wednesday Has Head Severed. WAS PROMINENT IN CITY Had Been a Builder Here for Many Years.

MISHAP OCCURRED AT 9:30 Was Working on Elevator at 1137 P and Thought to Have Fallen as It Started.

George C. Joy, well known contractor whose home was at 2900 Stratford boulevard, was killed at 9:30 Wednesday morning at the Standard Heat-&Power, 1137 P street, where he had been working on an elevator lift.

Mr. Joy, a prominent contractor and builder, was killed by a falling elevator. He had been working on the lift and was caught between the lift and the second floor of the building.

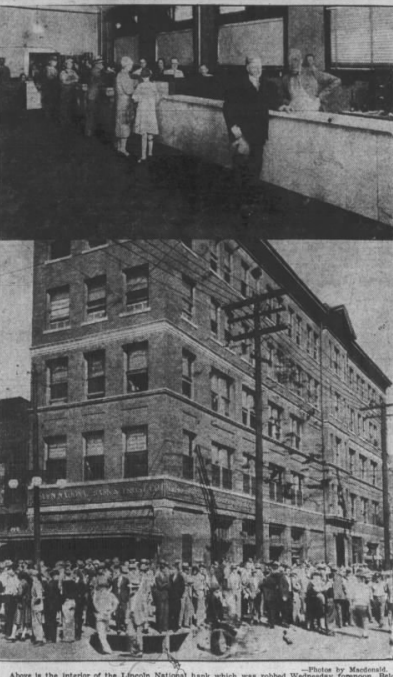
Progressive Movement in Wisconsin Strengthened in Primary.

DARING DAYLIGHT HOLDUP NETS HAUL

Five Men Loot Bank of \$40,000 to \$50,000 Wednesday Forenoon

Five heavily armed bandits held up the Lincoln National Bank & Trust company, Twelfth and O streets, shortly after 10 a. m. Wednesday, and after taking between \$40,000 and \$50,000 in currency, negotiable and non-negotiable bonds and securities, fled out of the city to the south in a dark Buick sedan with yellow wheels and bearing an Iowa license.

After entering the bank, the three bandits, gun drawn, approached Paul Hall, Greenwood, cashier, commanded that everyone be down and abashed. 'Where's LaFollette?' (J. E. Leinberger, assistant cashier, Mr. Hall told the bandits that Leinberger was out of the bank, and without warning the three men struck Mr. Hall on the back of the head with the butt of a gun.

With an elastic tuck on the handle, after the robbery, officers soon after word of the robbery of the Lincoln National bank had spread.
