WHAT IS A BOILERMAKER?

In the 1891 football season opener, the team traveled to Wabash College in nearby Crawfordsville. Besides coming away with a 44-0 victory, the Purdue "eleven," as football teams were known back then, headed back to West Lafayette with a new nickname.

In the 1890s, hometown newspapers were considerably more protective of college teams than they are today. After the 44-0 drubbing, one Crawfordsville newspaper lashed out at the "Herculean wearers of the black and old gold." Beneath the headline "Slaughter of Innocents," the paper told of the injustice visited upon the "light though plucky" Wabash squad.

"Wabash Snowed Completely Under by the Burly Boiler Makers From Purdue" proclaimed another headline on the same story in the "Daily Argus-News."

That same fall of 1891, Purdue had acquired a working railroad engine to mount in a newly established locomotive laboratory. It was one more step in the development of Purdue as one of the world's leaders in engineering teaching and research. For athletic adversaries and their boosters, this specialty in engineering education – and the other concentration at the founding of the institution, agriculture – served as fodder for name-calling.

Over the years, Purdue teams had been called grangers, pumpkin-shuckers, railsplitters, cornfield sailors, blacksmiths, foundry hands and, finally, boilermakers. That last one stuck.



OLD GOLD & BLACK

Members of Purdue's first football team in 1887 felt that the squad should be distinguished by certain colors, and since Princeton was at the time the most successful gridiron unit, its colors were considered. Though actually orange and black, the Princeton colors were known by many as yellow and black. Purdue gridders opted for old gold over yellow, kept the black, and began flying the colors that endure today.



PURDUE PETE

A boilermaker if ever there was one, Purdue Pete first took the field to cheer on the Old Gold & Black in 1956. Pete has changed with the times, boasting more than five makeovers while rooting on the Boilermakers.



BOILER UP

In an attempt to bring more enthusiasm to football games at Ross-Ade Stadium, former head coach Joe Tiller's wife, Arnette, came up with the phrase "Boiler Up" in 1997. It immediately caught on and has remained a constant, even unofficially being incorporated into the Purdue fight song, "Hail Purdue."

What Arnette didn't know at the time of Boiler Up's origin was that in the days of steam-powered locomotives, when the fireman got the fire in the coal box hot enough for the engine to run, he would exclaim "Boiler's up!"



BOILERMAKER SPECIAL

The official mascot of the Boilermakers is a replica of a Victorian-era locomotive. Conceived by a Purdue student in the 1930s to exemplify the engineering and agrarian heritage of the university, the first Special was provided by a group of alumni working in executive positions in the rail and automotive industries.



CRADLE OF QUARTERBACKS

Many schools boast of tradition. But none can match Purdue's tradition of turning out top-flight quarterbacks. The Cradle of Quarterbacks has evolved over the last half century as a defining feature of Purdue football. Sixteen former Purdue signal-callers have gone on to play in the National Football League, accumulating more starts and throwing more touchdown passes than those from any other school.



DEN OF DEFENSIVE ENDS

Quarterbacks beware. Threatening the opposition's signal-caller is the goal of every defensive end: causing disuption, havoc, and confusion to the offense. Throughout it's history, Purdue has produced many outstanding defesnive ends, creating an institution unlike any other in college football - the Den of Defensive Ends. Since 1999, ten Boilermaker defensive ends have gone on to play in the National Football League.

On game days, fans will now gain entry into each Purdue Athletics venue by utilizing digital tickets from their mobile device, eliminating the need for a printed, physical ticket. The move to digital entry provides the safest, easiest and most convenient option for access into all of Purdue's ticketed facilities. Digital ticketing also protects the integrity of tickets, improving protection against fraud, counterfeit and lost tickets while also providing more efficient means to transfer tickets to others.

YOUR ACCOUNT

Perhaps the biggest advantage of digital tickets is that you will NEVER "leave your tickets at home" or "bring the wrong tickets to the game" anymore!! As long as you remembered your phone, you can access all of your tickets, any time!

If you added them to your Wallet (Apple or Android) they will always be there until you remove them!

If you didn't add them to your wallet and you can't find your email, go to purduesports.com/myaccount to login to your account, and your tickets are listed there. You can add them to your wallet, transfer them to family/friends, or post them on StubHub instantly!


NFC TECHNOLOGY

NFC (Near Field Communication) technology, generally referred to as "Tap & Go" technology is now available for all Purdue digital tickets. DIGITAL PARKING PERMITS/DIGITAL ENTRY

- New for 2021, all parking permits will be digital.
- All parking passes are digital and should be downloaded to your mobile device after purchasing.

PERMIT REMINDERS/TAILGATING POLICIES

- Lots open eight (8) hours prior to kickoff but not earlier than 7 a.m. (Lots B, D, & T not earlier than 8 a.m.)
- Lots close two (2) hours after the game or midnight, whichever comes first
- Saving spaces is not permitted. Parking is on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Tailgating is permitted directly behind your vehicle and cannot occupy an additional parking space or impede on the traffic flow within the lot
- All buses must park in bus location. Bus parking is \$60
- Vehicles that will NOT fit inside of a 9'x20' parking space will be relocated to an alternate location
- One parking spot per vehicle.
- Lots may close due to inclement weather. Vehicles will be redirected to an appropriate lot.
- Event Management reserves the right to restrict use of any tailgate item due to weather or dangerous conditions, including tents
- Failure to obey these regulations may result in removal from the parking lot and revocation or forfeiture of the original owner's parking permit or future ability to get another parking permit

ADA PARKING

ADA parking is available in O Lot or EE Lot. HC permit or placard must be displayed in the vehicle, and the owner of the permit must be present in the vehicle when entering an ADA lot. H Lot is a John Purdue Club permit only parking lot. All vehicles are required to have an ADA license plate or placard plus an H Lot permit. Courtesy golf carts for those with limited mobility will run from H and O lots, starting 3 hours prior to each game.





Honoring the Legacy of Leroy Keyes: With the support of the Keyes family, Purdue Athletics and the John Purdue Club are championing two fundraising initiatives that will commemorate the life and legacy of Leroy Keyes, one being the Leroy Keyes Inside Athletics Graduate Leadership Fellowship which will provide an opportunity for a future leader to both launch their career and further their education. The second initiative entails naming the Purdue Athletics Intercollegiate Hall of Fame in honor of Leroy as a testament to his work on and off the football field; playing a major role in bringing to Purdue what is today the Black Cultural Center.

ROSS-ADE STADIUM FIELD TO BE DEDICATED IN HONOR OF BOB ROHRMAN FAMILY



During the 2020 football season, the field at Ross-Ade Stadium on the Purdue University campus was named Rohrman Field. The naming recognizes the generosity of the Bob Rohrman family, which made a \$15 million gift to support future improvements at Ross-Ade.

"This is a special moment for Purdue Athletics, and we are profoundly grateful to the Rohrman family for its leadership and extraordinary generosity," said Mike Bobinski, Purdue vice president and director of intercollegiate athletics. "Bob Rohrman and the entire Rohrman family have visibly and positively impacted Lafayette-West Lafayette and all the communities they serve for the last half century, and this gift will have a similar effect on Purdue football for years to come. It is a transformative gift in support of our most ambitious and significant project."

The Rohrman family owns and operates one of the largest automobile groups in the United States, with 30 franchise dealerships in Indiana, Illinois and Wisconsin. The business originated in Lafayette, Indiana, in 1963, when Bob Rohrman opened a used car lot. Soon after, he acquired a dealership that started the Bob Rohrman Auto Group. Rohrman was born and raised in Lafayette and graduated from Jefferson High School. In 2019, he received the Sagamore of the Wabash, one of Indiana's top honors for accomplishments and service.

"Purdue Athletics is more than just a ball and games. It is a part of the social fabric of who we are as a family," JR Rohrman said. "The entire family believes this gift to Purdue University is one of the best ways that we can give back to a community that has done so much for us."

In August of 2019, Purdue Trustees gave approval to plan a renovation to Ross-Ade. The potential project, aimed at enhancing the stadium appearance and the gameday experience for fans, would be highlighted by an open concourse, more diverse seating options and improved fan amenities. The initiative will have a broad university and community impact and is an important next step in strengthening Purdue's national prominence.

Ross-Ade Stadium celebrates its 98th season as the home of Purdue football in 2021. It is named for David E. Ross and George Ade, its two principal benefactors.

As Purdue Athletics aims to continue enhancing its impact, both in competition and in the community, the generosity displayed by the Rohrman family has been an integral force in helping do just that. With the return of Purdue Football in its full capacity for the 2021 season, department leadership is looking forward to the opportunity to further recognize the Rohrman family and the dedication of the Rohrman Field in Ross-Ade Stadium at the home-opener against Oregon State on September 4.

NCAA COMPLIANCE

Purdue University is committed to a comprehensive compliance program that educates the importance of adhering to NCAA, Big Ten and institutional rules. We ask for your support in maintaining our institution's integrity as we strive to create a culture of compliance within the university and throughout the community.

ATHLETICS COMPLIANCE OFFICE

The athletics compliance office (ACO) is part of the division of intercollegiate athletics and is charged with the following:

- Educating administrators, coaches, staff, recruits, student-athletes and boosters about NCAA, Big Ten and institutional rules;
- Developing monitoring systems to ensure compliance with these rules. These systems are designed to monitor rules pertaining to recruiting, academic eligibility, financial aid, awards, extra benefits, ethical conduct, amateurism, agents, employment, and the playing and practice seasons for each sport; and
- Investigating and reporting violations of NCAA, Big Ten, and institutional rules to the appropriate governing authority.

REPESENTATIVE OF ATHLETICS INTERESTS (BOOSTER)

You are a Representative of Purdue's Athletics Interest (e.g., booster, donor, fan) if you:

- Are an alumni of Purdue University;
- Have contributed to Purdue Athletics or its booster organizations (e.g. John Purdue Club);
- Join or participate in Purdue Athletics "friends of" booster groups (e.g., Grid Iron Club, Fast Breakers, Boilermaker Network, etc.);
- Hold, or have ever held season tickets;
- Provide allowable benefits to student-athletes (e.g., summer jobs); or
- Promote Purdue athletics programs in any way.

Once an individual is identified as a booster, he or she retains that status forever. Purdue University is responsible for the actions of such individuals. Please contact the Purdue University Athletics Compliance Office (ACO) if you are aware of any potential NCAA, Big Ten or Purdue University rules violations.

CONSEQUENCES FOR VIOLATING NCAA RULES

Violations of NCAA rules, even if unintentional, could jeopardize the eligibility of involved student-athletes or prospective student-athletes (recruits). Additionally, boosters who violate NCAA rules may be subject to the following consequences:

- Revocation of ticket privileges;
- Disassociation from the athletic department (e.g., loss of donor program and/or booster club privileges); or/and
- Loss of any other athletically related benefit or privilege deemed appropriate by Purdue University.

IMPERMISSIBLE INDUCEMENTS & EXTRA BENEFITS

Purdue staff members, donors, or fans may not directly or indirectly provide or arrange for any financial aid, benefits or gifts for prospects, student-athletes, or their relatives unless permitted by NCAA rules. Violations of this regulation will result in the involving prospect or student-athlete being declared ineligible.

Specifically prohibited inducements and extra benefits include, but are not limited to:

- Funding a prospect's visit to Purdue;
- Arranging for employment for a prospect's relative or student-athletes parents, guardians or friends;
- A gift of clothing, equipment or any tangible item;
- Cash or loans of any amount;
- Co-signing or arranging for a loan;
- Entertaining or providing college or professional sport tickets, including suite access;
- Free or reduced-cost services, housing, loans, rentals or purchases of any type;
- Use of personal property (e.g., automobiles, boats, summer houses/condos, etc.); or
- Promise of employment or payment after college graduation.

SOCIAL MEDIA

Social Media (e.g., Facebook, Twitter, etc.) is a great way to stay engaged with Purdue Sports. Please remember NCAA rules prohibit donors and fans from communicating with prospects via social media for purposes of recruiting them to Purdue (e.g., wall posts, "@" mentions involving recruiting-related messages or solicitations). Donors and fans may have general conversations with prospect-aged individuals, as long as the content of their discussion does not involve recruiting the prospect to attend Purdue and the conversation is not at the direction of Purdue staff.

GAMBLING

NCAA rules prohibit student-athletes or intercollegiate athletics staff members from participating in any gambling activity that involves intercollegiate or professional athletics. This includes providing information concerning intercollegiate athletics competition to individuals involved in organized gambling activities. Additionally, Indiana state law prohibits student-athletes and staff from placing a sports wager in licensed casinos or online. It is important to know these rules and to understand the pressures our coaches, staff, and student-athletes face. So please refrain from asking student-athletes or staff for non-public information about our teams or individual student-athletes (e.g., injuries, game plans, starting line-ups, etc.).
