












PPA On Track Rates















Westside Race and Ethnicity












Westside Low-Income Participation











PPA Program Participation








PPA Program Race and Ethnicity













Westside Adult Programs







Participation by School










Adult Participation by Race and Ethnicity

 - Total Participation: 23 Participants












Expenses








Expenses by Program Type

Program Highlight - Kids Achieve Together

- Year One 2013 was a pilot program
- One-on-one tutoring, mentoring program
- Mentors/Tutors are high school students and college students that went through the Schools of Hope tutor training
- Targeted students who were low in reading and/or math who would not have adult supervision after school, with a snack and recreational time offered as well.
- Always had a waiting list







Program Highlight - Kids Achieve Together

- 20 students enrolled in grades 3 5
- 9 of those students improved their reading scores at a higher rate than Westside students not enrolled in the program based on STAR assessment
- Offered on Mondays and Wednesdays after school until 4:30 pm from November - May











Success Story - Kids Achieve Together

- Our Kids Achieve Together program is now in year five and part of a 21st Century Learning Center and supports between 41 - 50 students each day
- Offered four days a week
- Average attendance rate of KAT Participants is 95% (94% for Westside)
- Total # of Office Discipline Referrals for KAT participants – 3 (119 for Westside)
- Reading scores for 4th and 5th graders enrolled in the KAT program increased from 49% to 54% (4th), 49% to 50% (5th)

Family Engagement

Rationale:

Family engagement in school promotes students achievement, reduces absenteeism, and restores parent confidence in student educational process. Students with involved parents or other caregivers earn higher grades and test scores, have better social skills, and show improved behaviors.

Strategies:

Inform, Collaborate, and Empower parents by making engagement a priority, continuous communication, allowing for collaboration and decision-makina.

Programming:

- My Y week
- Family fun night
- YMCÁ
- After-school Youth Center.

Outcomes:

- Family connections to peers and community.
 Building a strong and positive social system makes a difference in the lives of families and children.











Restorative Justice





Rationale:

 The fundamental principles of Restorative Justice has been summarized to follows: delinquency causes harm and justice should focus on repairing that harm. The people most affected by the delinquency should be able to participate in its resolution.

Strategies:

 Inform, consult, involve and empower students through guided discussions, workshops, experiential learning and self assessment and decision making.

Programming:

- G-Safe summit
- Restorative justice week
- Circle keepers.

Outcomes:

 Reduce harm through inclusive processes that engage all stakeholders.







Project-Based Learning

Rationale:

 Is an instructional methodology that encourages students to learn and apply knowledge and skills through an engaging experience. Community Schools present opportunities for deeper learning in-context and for the development of important skills tied to college and career readiness.

Strategies:

 Engage, Collaborate and empower students in active learning through projects, new experiences and innovation.

Programming:

- Innovation technology Studio
- UW Medical School
- Teenworks
- G-SAFE Summit.

Outcomes:

- They learn project management.
- They become systems thinkers.
- They become explorers.
- They become problem solvers.
- They engage in the learning process.

 - Basketball Clinic












MLK Youth Call to Service Day: January 19th
