POSITION RB-S **HEIGHT** 5-10 **WEIGHT** 195 **CLASS** SR.

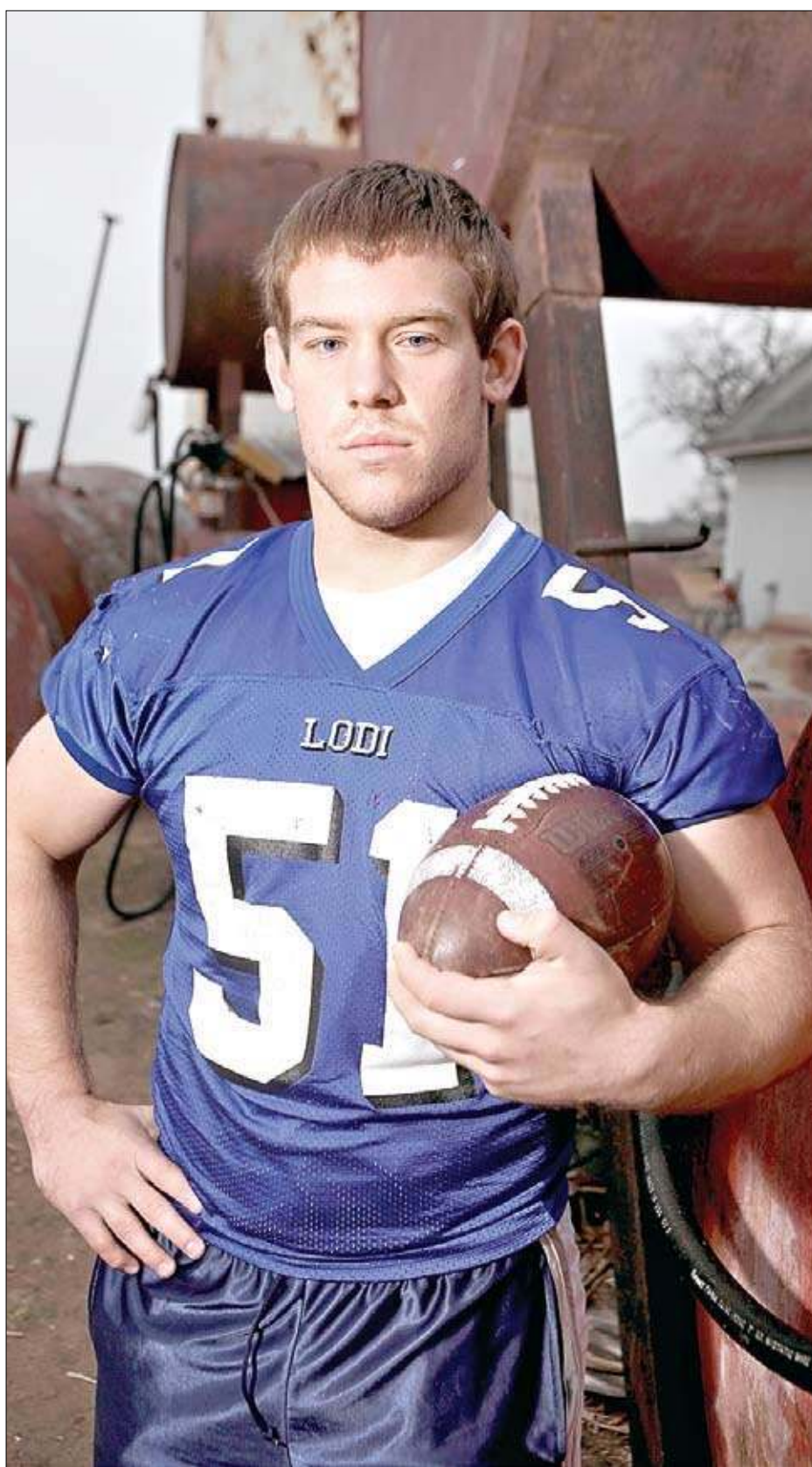

with 11 victories and won back-to-back conference titles for the first time in school history.

That helped Endres earn the Wisconsin State Journal's All-Area Football Player of the Year award for small schools.

"Cody's a winner on and off the field," Lodi coach Dave Puls said of Endres, who was a unanimous Northern Capitol Conference first team selection at offensive tackle and the league's Offensive Lineman of the Year.

Endres was an Associated Press All-State second team selection and an honorable mention selection on the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association all-state team as an offensive lineman.

"He did everything we asked of him," Puls added. "He anchored both of our lines and was a great leader for us."

Endres helped clear the way for running back Tyler Caldwell, who rushed for 1,689 yards and 11 touchdowns, and quarterback Lucas Stronach, who passed for 1,295 yards and 15 touchdowns.

One of those players who rarely left the field, Endres also earned all-conference first-team honors as a defensive lineman and second-team specialist honors as a long snapper. He was a finalist for the *wissports.net* "Joe Thomas" Offensive Lineman of the Year award.

"He's a beast," Marshall coach Matt

Kleinheinz said of Endres.

Added New Glarus-Monticello coach Jeff Eichelkraut: "He's a guy who can dominate a ball game."

But while Endres garnered a slew of individual honors his senior year, it was always about the team and his teammates, many of whom also compete with Endres in wrestling — where he was a Division 2 individual state tournament runner-up at 215 pounds last year — especially Cable and Zeman.

Long after the wins and losses fade away, Endres said their friendships will remain.

"We definitely plan to be friends for life. We hunt and fish together. We hang out and chill so I hope we can continue our strong friendship," Endres said of the trio.

Although his football career fell one game short of the state championship game, Endres said the Blue Devils walked away with their heads held high.

"We have a lot of guys who since we were young loved to compete against each other," he said. "We never wanted to lose in anything. We were always competing, day in and day out."

That will now continue on the wrestling mat, where Endres returned to practice this week — along with Cable and Zeman — after getting a week off to recover from the long football season.

"Whether it's football or wrestling," he said, "any time I'm together with those guys competing, I'm having the time of my life."
