Enbridge Energy, Limited Partnership ("Enbridge") is reviewing and evaluating options for the potential expansion of its pipeline system in Wisconsin and Illinois. You are receiving this letter in advance of being contacted by an Enbridge representative to discuss field surveys on your property.

Generally, field surveys can be done with few disruptions to landowners and do not require excavation by heavy equipment. When the surveys are being conducted on your property, you can expect to see a few people with survey equipment and a pickup truck or ATV. Enbridge recognizes that you and other landowners have experienced a variety of construction, maintenance and upgrade work over the last several years, and the company greatly appreciates your continued cooperation and understanding.

For your review, enclosed please find a brochure that explains the types of field surveys to be conducted beginning in April 2014. If plans to proceed with a pipeline project are formalized and approved, Enbridge will provide you with additional information at that time.

WHY ARE THE SURVEYS NECESSARY?

Having accurate and current information about our pipeline corridor is essential for planning future activities, including pipeline maintenance and expansion.

While some information can be found in maps, aerial photos, and public records, certain types of data must be collected using onsite surveys. Our representative will notify you of our intent to survey and provide a general window when the surveys will occur on your property.

WHEN WILL THE SURVEYS BE CONDUCTED?

Surveys are an important part of our planning efforts. The majority of the surveys will be conducted starting in April 2014. Under normal conditions, and depending on the type of survey and the size of parcel, field surveys generally take less than one day to complete their work on any given parcel.

HOW WILL THE SURVEYS IMPACT MY PROPERTY?

Civil and environmental surveys cause little or no disruption to landowners. Field crews walking the study area across your property may need to excavate small holes in some cases. Any holes will be filled in and sod will be replaced.

WHAT IF AN ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE IS FOUND ON MY PROPERTY?

In most cases, the archaeological sites found in the study area will likely have already been disturbed by previous activity (such as farming). No additional work at these sites should be necessary. When a site is identified, Enbridge's archaeologists may need to return to your property to conduct additional work. A company representative will contact you if this is necessary, to explain the type of work that will need to be conducted.

Artifacts found on your property belong to you. Because some artifacts may have educational value, Enbridge encourages the donation of rare or significant artifacts to a state repository such as a museum. If you choose to make a donation, Enbridge will make arrangements to protect and curate your artifacts. On rare occasions, human remains and associated artifacts may be found in unmarked cemeteries. These artifacts are protected by federal and state laws and Enbridge will treat any discoveries of human remains in accordance with these laws.
