OUR VIEW: Madison stands with all the other communities that have suffered school attacks

adison Police Chief Shon Barnes is right: "Enough is enough," he said Monday, following the shootings that left a teacher and two students dead and seven others injured at Abundant Life Christian School on Madison's East Side.

We share the chief's disgust. When will the madness of school shootings end? When will our nation finally do more to stop it - something big?

Madison joined a sad and outrageously long list of more than 400 communities across the United States that have suffered school shootings during the quarter

century since the Columbine High School massacre. Two students in that attack killed a dozen of their fellow students and a teacher and injured more in Littleton, Colorado.

We'll have more to say about Abundant Life's nightmare in the coming days, and we'll mourn for the dead, injured

and their families. For now, though, look at this depressing, torturous list. It should make you mad. It

The list is based on The Washington Post's exhaustive tracking of targeted shootings at America's schools. In some lucky cases, nobody was injured. But in most cases, students or staff were hurt if not killed. In some communities, dozens of students and teachers were murdered. Some cities appear more than once because they've endured multiple attacks.

We stand with all of the communities, including on this list, who have suffered school shootings. We call on our leaders, society and ourselves to make this end.
