INITIAL INFORMATION:

On 10/28/2021, I was operating in full MPD military style uniform as 2E10. At approximately 12:30 pm, I was dispatched to 2202 E Johnson St reference a person with a gun. Call notes stated that in the parking lot of the Milio's sandwich restaurant at 2202 E Johnson St, a subject observed two vehicles sitting in the parking lot who seemed to be exchanging handguns. One vehicle was described as a black Honda Pilot bearing WI plate 782-ZNH and the other was a black Jeep SUV style vehicle. Call notes stated that both vehicles had driven into the parking lot erratically and that handguns were seen in the possession of the occupants of both the Jeep and Honda.

As I traveled to the scene, I was able to check the stolen vehicle hot sheet through Madison, WI and observed that there was a black Honda Pilot bearing WI plate 782-ZNH which was listed as stolen. An alert was also listed on this vehicle stating that it had been used in an armed robbery in Madison in the past.

As I arrived on scene, I had been notified by Central units that they were observing the suspect Honda Pilot on street cameras heading inbound on E Washington Ave. Central officers nearby began conducting a search for the Honda Pilot as I went to the Milio's restaurant to see if I could make contact with the original caller.

CONTACT WITH GARRETT M. HRUBESCH:

While I was on scene at 2202 E Johnson St, I made contact with the staff at Milio's to see if the original caller was inside the restaurant. I was not able to make contact with the original caller inside the restaurant, but did make contact with the staff inside and informed them of the caller I was currently on as well as the time of the incident and asked them to look through their security camera footage to see if they had anything captured by their cameras reference the incident. Staff on scene informed me that they would contact the police department if anything was found.

I was able to make contact with the original caller via telephone and ID'd the witness as **Garrett M. Hrubesch**, who was ID'd verbally over the phone. Hrubesch stated to me that he was sitting in the restaurant that was attached to the Milio's sandwiches, which is a family run Mexican restaurant. Hrubesch stated that he was fine speaking over the phone reference what happened. Hrubesch stated that while sitting in the restaurant, he observed a black Honda Pilot driving into the parking lot at a high rate of speed. Hrubesch stated that the black Honda Pilot pulled all the way to the back of the parking lot where it stopped right at the entrance to the bike path of Demetral Park. Hrubesch stated that directly behind that vehicle was a black Jeep SUV. Hrubesch was unable to determine whether it was a Jeep Patriot or a Jeep Compass. Hrubesch stated that both vehicles were able to pull side by side. Hrubesch stated that the rear passenger in the Honda Pilot rolled his window down and pointed out what looked to Hrubesch to be a revolver style handgun. Hrubesch also believed that he observed in the Jeep passenger seat to be a subject with what looked like

two handguns; although he could not describe them to me.

Hrubesch stated that it did not seem that the subjects were threatening each other, but that they seemed to be showing off the guns and cars that they had in their possession at the time. Hrubesch stated that the subjects inside the vehicle all seemed too young to be able to drive and obviously too young to have firearms. Hrubesch stated that the vehicles were able to turn around in the parking lot and drive out just as quickly as they had driven in. Hrubesch stated that he could not give descriptions of all of the occupants of the vehicles, but one of the subjects that pointed the revolver style handgun out of the window was a very young looking black male.

This information was passed on to downtown officers who were currently searching for the suspect vehicle.

Hrubesch stated that he did not have further information regarding the two vehicles, but that he would be willing to answer any questions in the future if need be.

I asked that Aguglia assist with any possible identification information and attached a signed and scanned MMSD Release of Records to Law Enforcement or District Attorney.

Phone Follow-Up

On 10/29/21 at approximately 12:52 PM, I called Aguglia at [REDACTED] in order to follow-up on the email I had sent as I had not received a reply. I left Aguglia a voicemail and asked for Aguglia to call me. At approximately 12:53 PM, I also attempted to contact Aguglia at [REDACTED] and I spoke with someone who identified themselves as "Roxanne." Roxanne told me to hold for Aguglia and after a short while, the phone disconnected. At the time of this report, I have not received an email or phone call from Aguglia.

Information

On 10/28/21 at approximately 2:30 PM, I went with Det M Davenport and Det C Vang to Milios, located at 2202 E Johnson St. I had earlier been asked by Det Lt J Messer to attempt to obtain video of the parking lot when firearms were observed in the possession of individuals earlier in the day. Det Lt Messer also advised a stolen black Honda Pilot was associated with the incident.

Video Collection

Upon arrival, I met with employee Joshua M Pyke, identified to me verbally. Pyke granted me access to the room with the surveillance equipment. I was then able to review video footage in relation to the investigation. I exported the video to a black NXT 8GB USB flash drive that I considered to be temporary storage media. I verified the timestamp against my watch, which synchronizes with my cell phone. See the attached Video Retrieval Report for more information.

Property Information

On 10/28/21, I transferred the video files to a folder on my workstation from the temporary storage media. The temporary storage media was later formatted. I used the utility packaged with Microsoft Windows 10 to burn the video files to media. On 10/28/21 at approximately 6:48 PM, I properly tagged the media containing the video files under property tag number 487190 and secured the package in locker NPD 15.

Attempt to ID

I reviewed the video to isolate persons of interest in the investigation and sent still images to officers via email in hopes they could be identified. I also distributed still images to an MMSD employee, which is documented in a separate report. At the time of this report, no investigative leads have been identified.

Initial Information

On 10/28/21 I was operating as 2D10 in full military-style uniform driving marked squad C1906. At approximately 12:30 PM I heard K9 Officer Boespflug call out over the radio that a stolen Honda Pilot with WI PC 782ZNH was inbound on E Washington Ave in the city of Madison, Dane County. At the time I was driving outbound on E Washington Ave from the capitol.

Attempted Traffic Stop

I stopped at the red light on E Washington Ave at S Blair St. The stolen Honda was directly across from me in the left-most lane of inbound E Washington Ave to make the turn south on Blair St towards John Nolen Dr. I waited through a cycle of the light until the stolen Honda made the left turn. At that time I activated my squad car's lights and sirens. The Honda accelerated away from me towards John Nolen Dr. I then deactivated my lights and sirens and pulled off the road and into the parking lot for the Essen Haus and Come Back Inn. I aired to last known direction of travel to other units.

Officer Actions

Other officers aired that they had located the stolen Honda again after I had disengaged. I began to proceed in that direction in emergency mode to assist officers that were approaching the vehicle. Officer Lindsey then aired that the vehicle had jumped a curb and was driving on the bike path. I again deactivated my lights and siren. Patrol units were then advised to stand down as undercover cars would be trying to find the vehicle.

NARRATIVE

On 11/09/2021, I was asked to make phone contact with [REDACTED] reference a threats complaint she experienced at East High School on 11/08/2021. [REDACTED] told me that on 11/08/2021, there was a large fight at EHS where a large police presence was required to gain control of the crowd. While this was going on, she was near the tennis courts on EHS property when she was approached by a girl name [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated she does not have any more information about [REDACTED] however, she does have video. [REDACTED] said that unprovoked, [REDACTED] began to make threats to harm her [REDACTED] and while making threats [REDACTED] was holding a "switchblade" knife in her hand. [REDACTED] said she was not scared of [REDACTED] and simply told her to knock it off. She then took her phone out and tried to capture [REDACTED] holding the knife, but [REDACTED] walked away when the camera was taken out of her pocket. The video does show [REDACTED] putting something into her pocket and walking away.

[REDACTED] told me that she did not want [REDACTED] to be charged with anything and wants [REDACTED] to have no legal consequences as a result of the incident; however, [REDACTED] said that she has been told that [REDACTED] has also made threats to other students in the school. She told me that she wants [REDACTED] to be suspended from school or have an internal ramifications. I explained to [REDACTED] that we (MPD) have no input with suspensions and such. I asked if she has notified school of this incident, and she stated, "I talked to my counselor, and she told me to call the police to report this."

After completing this report, I was making an attempt to notify MMSD reference this incident and Was told it has been reported and [REDACTED] has been cited for DC while armed. This report was taken under case number 21-448900 by PO Ryan Orvis.
