

# Twin Falls' recycling program changes Oct. 1; here's what you need to know

The days of throwing all your recycling into one big bin are over. Twin Falls' recycling program changes Tuesday. Residents may now only recycle aluminum, cardboard and tin in their city provided can. Plastics and mixed paper are no longer accepted at all by the city.

But there is another option. Magic Valley Recycling will continue to accept some items.

Officials remind people that all recycling items must be clean and dry.

Here's a breakdown of what goes where. If it's not on this list, you should probably just throw it out.

## ALUMINIUM CANS

- Must be cleaned and dried.

## TIN CANS

- Must be clean, dry and rust free.

- Accepted in the city recycle bin and at Magic Valley Recycling

## NEWSPAPER

- Must be dry.

- Accepted at Magic Valley Recycling. Times-News members can also drop off old editions at the newspaper office, 132 W. Fairfield St. in Twin Falls, for recycling.



## PLASTIC BOTTLES

- Must be number one or two. Flatten and remove caps.

- Accepted at Magic Valley Recycling



## CARDBOARD

- Must be clean.
- Paperboard such as cereal boxes and shoeboxes are OK if plastic liners and labels are removed.
- The city will also take cardboard egg cartons.

☒ No pizza boxes or other food contamination and no waxed paper.

- Accepted in city recycling bins and at Magic Valley Recycling



## MAGAZINES

- Must be dry.

- Accepted at Magic Valley Recycling



## MIXED PAPER

- Computer paper, white index cards, white envelopes, manila folders.

☒ No dark colored papers, tissue or wrapping paper.

- Accepted at Magic Valley Recycling
