- Alterations in federal or state laws regarding taxes and investments.

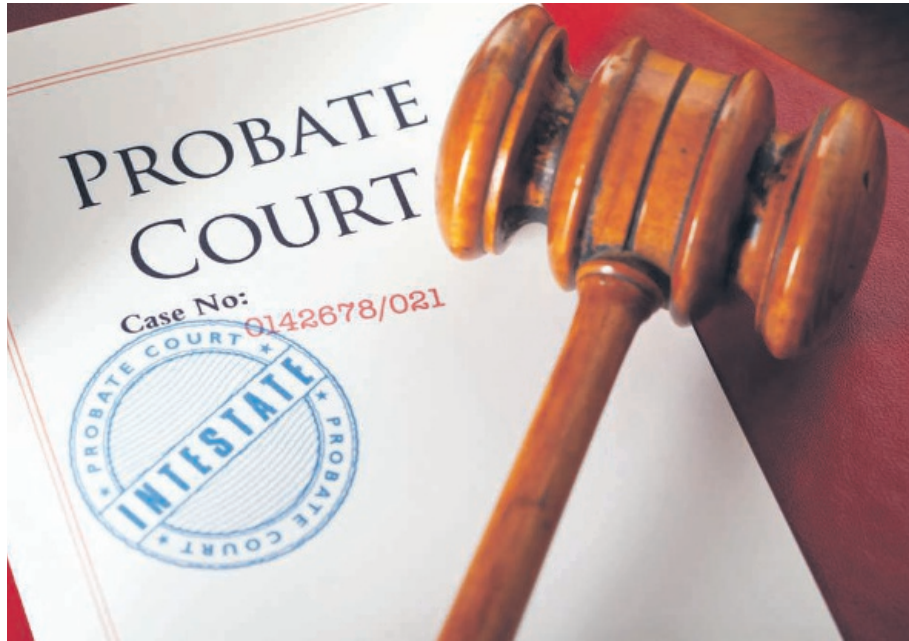

Advanced Funeral Planning is a great way to relieve heartache and headache upon your passing. Keep in mind that it takes time for your loved ones to be able to access your financial accounts. 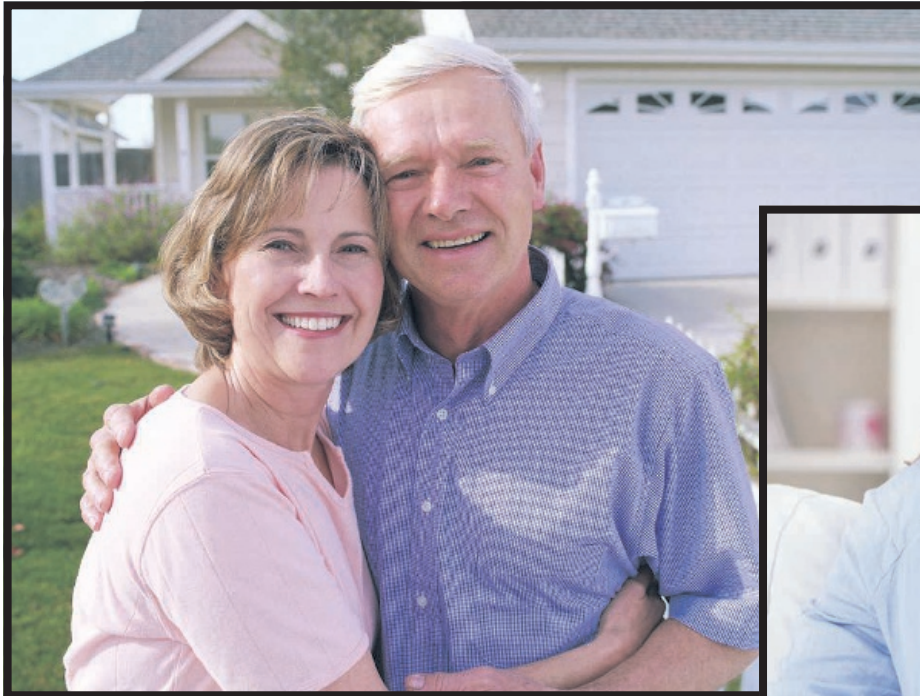
