	AFFIDAVIT AND MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FIL	.E INFORMATION

The Motion is based upon the following facts which have been obtained from reports of the law enforcement officers which, if true, I believe, constitute sufficient probable cause to justify the filing of the charges. The facts from those reports are as follows:

On or about April 5, 2014, Mike Garrison contacted Mary Johnson of the Missoula Animal Control and said he had been caring for two dogs located at 2140 Hummingbird Lane for Andrea McClellan, the registered owner of the dogs. Garrison had informed McClellan two weeks prior that he was unable to continue looking after the dogs. Garrison advised that the house was so full of dog feces that it made him sick to go inside. McClellan had previously represented to Missoula Animal Control officers that she was moving and had to get a fence up for the dogs but was in and out of the house on Hummingbird on a daily basis.

Officer Johnson attempted called McClellan but she did not answer and her voicemail box was full. Officer Johnson then went to the house on Hummingbird but nobody was home. She left a Notice of Violation at the house instructing McClellan to call animal control.

On April 6, 2014, Amy Zanzig of Missoula County Animal Control also went to the house and nobody was home. She observed the Notice of Violation was still on the door. Officer Zanzig left a second Notice of Violation on the door and directing the owners to call animal control by 10 a.m. the following morning. Officer Zanzig observed the dogs in the window and photographed them along with the house and the notices left on the door.

When Officer Zanzig returned on April 7th there was still no one at the residence and the two dogs in the window, a blonde husky mix and a brown and blonde husky mix, were barking. The two Notices of Violation were still on the door. Officer Zanzig then spoke with Garrison's mother, Kim Walter. Walter stated nobody has lived in the house for at least 7 months and that a bank had repossessed it. Walter explained Garrison had tried to notify McClellan that he could no longer look after the dogs but she would not return his calls. Walter said McClellan never paid Garrison for taking care of the animals and Garrison had not gone into the house for 5 days.

On April 8th, animal control officers entered the house on Hummingbird Lane with Missoula Sheriff's Deputy Kenneth White and a search warrant to seize the dogs. When Officer Zanzig opened the door to the home, she was overwhelmed by a "horrible odor coming out of the house." The smell was so overpowering that all of the animal control officers had to put on respirator masks to enter the home. Animal Control Officer Cindy Syrjala stated the stench burned her nose and throat. Once inside, the officers observed dog feces everywhere. Officer Zanzig noted she could not take a step without hitting the fecal matter. The officers also observed the home was trashed with garbage and personal belongings strewn about the floors and counters of the rooms. None of the officers were able to locate available dog food and the only water accessible to them was from an open toilet.

Defendant was ordered to complete a Book and Release at Missoula County

Detention Facility.
