

Giuliani resigns council

The chairman of the City Council's Finance Committee, Ward 1 Alderman Richard Giuliani, announced his resignation from the council Tuesday night, effective in one month.

Giuliani, a Democrat who was elected to a four-year term on the council in April 1979, said he must leave the council because he and his wife have bought a new home outside Ward 1 and will be moving soon.

The alderman's resignation came as a shock to the other council members.

"It's a shock and a disappointment," councilman John Toole said. "We are losing one of our best people."

Giuliani is a school psychologist for

the Missoula County High School District. He has been a resident of Missoula since 1952 and had lived in Ward 1 since 1977. He graduated from Loyola High School in 1970 and received degrees from the University of Montana in 1974 and 1975.

Giuliani is the third council member to resign since July. Richard Smith, who had represented Ward 4, resigned in August and was replaced by Francis Superneau. Fred Reed, who represented Ward 5, resigned in July and was replaced by Rosalie Buzzas.

The council soon will begin advertising for a person to serve the remainder of Giuliani's term.
