activity is encouraged. The Youth will agree to be tested periodically for drug and alcohol use as directed by the Youth Court Services Staff. Refusal to submit will result in a violation of probation.

- 3. The Youth shall attend school on a regular basis and perform to the best of his ability and that verification of attendance is provided to this youth court office.
- 4. The Youth shall comply with any counseling recommendations set forth by the supervising Probation Officer that are deemed necessary to address "at risk behavior." This will include any or all of the Juvenile Accountability Programs offered through the Youth Court Office.
- 5. The Youth may be subject to placement in a secure detention facility as provided under Mont. Code Ann. § 41-5-1501(b), should he be found in violation of the terms of his probation. Placement in detention would be on a space available basis and at the county's expense.
- 6. The Youth will reside either at a placement with his Probation Officer or with his custodial parent(s) or guardian(s). If available, the initial placement will be with the Flathead Youth Home. The Youth will follow all rules of his group home or parent(s) or guardian(s) and keep them informed of his whereabouts and activities at all times, unless a specific exception is approved by his Probation Officer in advance. The youth shall not leave the County nor shall he change his place of residence without the prior approval of the supervising Probation Officer.
- 7. The Youth will comply with any curfew established by the supervising Probation Officer, his residential placement, and/or his parent(s) or guardian(s). For the first six months of probation, the curfew shall be set no later than 9:00 p.m. Exceptions will be granted for school, employment, school sanctioned extracurricular activities, community based extracurricular activities with adult supervision, and when in the immediate presence of a custodial parent or guardian.
- 8. Upon reasonable cause, the Youth will agree to random searches of his personal property including but not limited to his person, room, vehicle, cell phone, and any other devices capable of accessing the internet and/or storing digital media by the Youth Court Services staff to determine if there is evidence of a probation violation. The Youth will provide Youth Court Services staff with any passwords or other information necessary to access such devices if requested for search purposes based upon reasonable suspicion, and will not use any software which has the purpose or effect of masking or deleting data which may be relevant to a violation of conditions.
- 9. The Youth may be subject to Electronic Monitoring and House Arrest during
