HORSE RACES--\$350 IN PURSES

RACE PROGRAM:

First--300 yard dash; purse, \$40; \$25 to first, \$10 to second and \$5 to third.

Second-- $\frac{1}{2}$ mile dash for saddle horses; purse, \$50; \$30 to first, \$15 to second and \$5 to third.

Third--Trotting, $\frac{1}{2}$ mile; best two in three heats; purse \$50; divided as in the second race.

Fourth--Pony race, $\frac{1}{2}$ mile dash; purse, \$20; \$12.50 to first, \$5 to second and \$2.50 to third.

Second-- $\frac{1}{2}$ mile dash for saddle horses; winner of saddle horse race on first day barred; purse, \$40; \$25 to first, \$10 to second and \$5 to third.

Third--Mile heats, best two in three, for trotting buggy horses; purse, \$50; \$30 to first, \$12.50 to second and \$7.50 to third.

Fourth-- $\frac{1}{2}$ mile dash; purse, \$55; \$30 to first, \$15 to second and \$10 to third.
